

**Transportation Resource Oversight Committee Meeting
(La Porte County)
Tuesday, May 26, 2026
Minutes**

Charles Bradsky called the meeting to order at 1:04 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance. The meeting was streamed live on YouTube. In attendance were Craig Phillips (City of La Porte), Jamie Novak (City of La Porte), Mitch Bishop (La Porte County), Shannon Eason (Michigan City), Tim Werner (Michigan City), Nick Minich, and Tucker King.

NIRPC staff included Charles Bradsky, Ann Weitgenant, and Candice Eklund.

Approval of Minutes

The November 18, 2025, TROC La Porte minutes were approved on motion by Shannon Eason and seconded by Tim Werner.

The minutes from the January 21, 2026, combined meeting of TROC, Lake, Porter, and La Porte Counties were approved on motion by Tim Werner and seconded by Craig Phillips.

Public Comments

There were no public comments.

Program of Projects

Charles Bradsky reported that there is a surplus of \$411,000 in 2026 and \$32,000 in 2027, with funding available for change orders of \$26,000 in 2026 and \$58,000 in 2027.

New Business

New Programming Timelines: Charles Bradsky presented the new funding and programming timelines. He reported that INDOT closed its fiscal year on May 1, 2026, at 10:00 a.m., and that all FY 2026 funds had to be obligated by then. As a result, NIRPC was unable to obligate approximately \$400,000 in funding this fiscal year. After May 1st, remaining funds may only be used to flex to transit, but only if transit has an active project to flex to.

NIRPC met with INDOT to discuss the new funding and programming timelines as part of a 'lessons learned' discussion. Key points from the presentation included:

- INDOT/LPA Contracts must be approved by both the LPA and INDOT, which is not new. Approval by INDOT typically takes 3 to 15 days, and up to 30 days in March.
- LPA/Consultant contracts need to be submitted to INDOT by March 15, followed by submission of an FMIS request.
- Requests for additional funding for PE require an amended LPA/Consultant contract to be submitted to INDOT (this is not new); Charles strongly encouraged that this process begin as early as possible and he be notified in December.
- Some timelines to keep in mind:

- For amendments, The public comment and ICG review process takes approximately 40 days, while INDOT and FHWA approvals take 90-105 days (after the NIRPC Commission approves the amendment). NEPA approvals can take up to 18 months.
- Formal TIP amendments can now take a total of approximately five (5) months for approval.
- For funding in any fiscal year, formal TIP amendments will close in the third week of November, and emergency TIP amendments close January 15.

Project Management Discussion:

- Project phases must be in the current TIP to receive additional funding for that phase
- Projects should be scheduled for letting in Q1 and Q2; Q3 and Q4 lettings can hinder timely obligation of funds.
- Additional funding requests by the LPAs and consultants are generally not feasible at the last minute.
- NIRPC, LPAs, and consultants, collectively, cannot get behind; the LPAs and consultants must remain on top of their projects because delays can impact funding eligibility.
- While the success of projects is a shared responsibility, projects ultimately belong to the local community.

Other New Business

Discussion was held regarding the allocation of \$58,000 in change order request funding in 2027. Following the discussion, Craig Phillips made a motion to allocate \$43,291 to Michigan City for RW for des # 2101148 (Singing Sands ph 3), and \$15,000 to La Porte County for RW for des # 2101711 Bridge #166. The motion was seconded by Shannon Eason.

Additional Announcements

- NIRPC staff met internally to discuss the Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) for the Fall of 2026 for funding years 2031 and 2032. A new NOFA scoring component will include participation in NIRPC committee meetings, with up to eight (8) points available. This will be discussed further at the TROC meeting in August and at the August NOFA workshop meeting.
- The Indiana Local Technical Assistance Program (LTAP) will host several one-day seminars called '[Operation Road Wise](#)'. Seminars will focus on improving road safety.
- INDOT will transition to the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO) software this fall, replacing the Road Hazard Analysis Tool (RoadHAT).
- The Rail Programs Office established a Railroad Grade Crossing Fund; Applications are due by July 10, 2026.

Adjournment

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 1:56 p.m. The next meeting will be held on August 25, 2026.
