PURPOSE OF NOTICE

The Natural Resources Commission (commission), in coordination with the Department of Natural Resources (department), is soliciting public comment on amending rules at 312 IAC 1.5-2-5 and 312 IAC 1.5-2-7 regarding certain entrance fees for properties owned or managed by the department. The commission, in coordination with the department, seeks comments on the affected citations listed and any other provisions of Title 312 that may be affected by this rulemaking.

OVERVIEW

Basic Purpose and Background

The commission, in coordination with the department, is looking to increase the fee for: (1) an annual pass for nonresidents from the current seventy dollars (\$70) to one hundred twenty dollars (\$120) a year; (2) entering Prophetstown State Park from the current ten dollars (\$10) to fifteen dollars (\$15) a day for each vehicle entering the property; (3) entering Indiana Dunes State Park from the current twelve dollars (\$12) to twenty dollars (\$20) a day for each vehicle entering the property; and (4) entering any other property owned or managed by the department from the current nine dollars (\$9) to fifteen dollars (\$15) a day for each vehicle entering the property. Due to budgetary constraints and inflating costs to maintain properties owned or managed by the department, an increase to certain fees is necessary. The proposed permanent rule affects nonresidents who enter certain properties owned or managed by the department and nonresidents who purchase annual passes from the department. There will be an increase to the entrance fee for each nonresident vehicle entering the property as well as to each nonresident who purchases an annual pass.

SECTION 1. 312 IAC 1.5-2-5 IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS:

312 IAC 1.5-2-5 Fee for annual pass issued to nonresident

SECTION 2. 312 IAC 1.5-2-7 IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS:

312 IAC 1.5-2-7 Nonresident fee to enter department owned or managed property

- Sec. 7. (a) Except as provided in subsections (c) and (d), the fee for a nonresident to enter a property owned or managed by the department for one (1) calendar day is nine dollars (\$9) fifteen dollars (\$15) a day for each vehicle entering the property.
- (b) The purchase receipt from paying the fee under subsection (a) acts as a pass to enter a property owned or managed by the department.
- (c) The fee for a nonresident to enter Prophetstown State Park for one (1) calendar day is ten dollars (\$10) fifteen dollars (\$15) a day for each vehicle entering the property.
