

OCRA's COVID-19 Response Grant Program – Phase 3 Supplemental Funding Awards

Grants for job retention

The **Town of Bainbridge** is awarded \$250,000 to provide grants to small businesses located within town limits that the COVID-19 pandemic has negatively impacted.

The **City of Bedford** is awarded \$250,000 to provide grants to small businesses, including retail and commercial businesses affected by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Blackford County is awarded \$250,000 to assist its hardest-hit manufacturers and retail businesses.

The **City of Boonville** is awarded \$250,000 to award grants to assist businesses in retaining positions held by at least 51% LMI persons.

Fayette County is awarded \$250,000 to create a grant program that will aid the county's hardest-hit manufacturing, retail and service sector businesses.

The **City of Gas City** is awarded \$250,000 to provide grants to the hardest retailers, service sector businesses, and small manufacturers with working capital to reopen businesses, continue operations, expand their payroll, restock inventory or pay for remote working technology.

The **City of Greencastle** is awarded \$250,000 to provide grants to small businesses located within city limits that have been negatively impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Harrison County is awarded \$250,000 for grants to small businesses that have been most severely impacted due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Henry County is awarded \$240,000 for grants to small businesses with revenue equal to or less than \$1 million and employers with 100 employees or less who have been affected by the COVID-19 pandemic.



The **Town of Jamestown** is awarded \$250,000 to provide grants to small businesses located within town limits that have been negatively impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

The **Town of Nashville** is awarded \$250,000 for grants to small businesses that have been most severely impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

The **Town of New Harmony** is awarded \$250,000 to award grants to small businesses to assist businesses in retaining positions held by at least 51% LMI persons.

The **Town of Newburgh** is awarded \$250,000 to award grants to small businesses of the town to assist the businesses in retaining positions held by at least 51% LMI persons.

The **City of Rushville** is awarded \$250,000 to provide grants to any eligible business located within the city with less than 100 employees that have been negatively impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

The **Town of Seelyville** is awarded \$250,000 to provide grants to small businesses located within town limits that have been negatively impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Union County is awarded \$250,000 to will provide grants for working capital for businesses to reopen or continue operations, restock inventory, expand payrolls, or pay for remote work technology.

Vermillion County is awarded \$250,000 to provide grants to small businesses located within county limits that have been negatively impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Warrick County is awarded \$250,000 to award grants to small businesses located in Warrick County to assist businesses in retaining positions held by at least 51% LMI persons.
