Five vital things to consider

Yet startups are raising more capital than ever before. When the dust settles, it's expected that venture capitalists will have pumped over \$100 billion into the U.S. market last year. With so much money available, why aren't startup success rates going up? Maybe because money isn't the problem.

Do you have an idea for a new Main Street revitalization project idea you would like to start? Are you positive it's something that will be a slam-dunk success? Then you won't want to miss Indiana Main Street's first annual *Main Street INspire Idea!* competition.

The goal of the *Main Street INspire Idea!* competition is to stimulate the Indiana Main Street network of communities and professionals to craft imaginative Main Street projects. The submitted projects should:

- 1. Connect to the community's vision to create vibrant, people-centered places to live, work and invest;
- 2. Support the four key areas Main Street programs have been using as a guiding framework for nearly 40 years: economic vitality, effective promotion, quality design and sustainable organization; and
- 3. Focus on highly visible changes, measuring progress and results that demonstrate the revitalization effort is implemented and succeeding.

Two \$5,000 minimum prizes to be distributed at judges' discretion and all finalist presenters will receive *free* registration to Great Lakes Main Street Conference.

More information is still to come on how to enter competition. Let the creativity flow and start forming an idea to enter.
