#### LEAKS ADD UP. QUICKLY.

Did you know that a leaky toilet can waste 200 gallons of water each day? That's not a typo: Each day. You can easily March 19-25, 2018 check for leaks by putting a few drops of food coloring in the Fix a Leak Week tank, waiting for 10 or 15 minutes, and seeing if the coloring goes into the bowl. Be sure to flush when you're done. It's one of  $\underline{\text{several things we'll encourage}}$  all consumers to do during Fix a Leak Week, set this year for the third week in

#### I&M RATE AGREEMENT

The OUCC, Indiana Michigan Power (I&M), and numerous additional parties have reached a settlement agreement that substantially reduces the utility's request. Among the terms, the flat monthly residential customer charge would rise from \$7.30 to \$10.50, instead of the \$18 charge the utility initially requested. The agreement is now pending before the IURC which can accept, deny, or modify any settlement it considers.

#### NIPSCO RATE CASE

Our analysis in the NIPSCO natural gas rate case recommends limiting the utility's proposed increase to \$69 million. NIPSCO reduced its \$143.5 million request to \$117.9 million in January, following passage of the Tax Cuts & Jobs Act. An evidentiary hearing is scheduled to start in mid-May.

#### MORE CASES
