Dear Mr. Hart,

Pursuant to Indiana Code 4-22-2.1-5(c)(2), as the Small Business Ombudsman for the state of Indiana, I have reviewed the proposed rule and economic impact analysis associated with the rule changes contained in LSA Document #24-585 (proposed rule) submitted to the Indiana Small Business Ombudsman by the Indiana Professional Licensing Agency. I have found the following to be true.

Proposed rule LSA #24-585 amends 856 Indiana Administrative Code (IAC) 1-20-2 in order to codify a schedule for fines that may be assessed by the Indiana Board of Pharmacy. In addition, it introduces a minimal fee requirement for the facility renewals and well as for pharmacy technicians in training, both of which pose minimum barriers to entrepreneurs and small business owners of the state.

The Indiana Professional Licensing Agency's provided analysis displays a proper due diligence and understanding of how implementation must be carried out to ensure compliance while minimizing the potential impact to small businesses and individuals. Based upon this statement and review, the Indiana Small Business Ombudsman supports the proposed rule related to the economic impact on small business if the Office of the Indiana Professional Licensing Agency's conclusion reflects the actual result after promulgation.
