Dear Mr. Hart,

Pursuant to Indiana Code 4-22-2.1-5(c)(2), as the Small Business Ombudsman for the state of Indiana, I have reviewed the proposed rule and economic impact analysis associated with the rule changes contained in LSA Document #24-587 (proposed rule) submitted to the Indiana Small Business Ombudsman by the Indiana Professional Licensing Agency (PLA). I have found the following to be true.

Proposed rule LSA #24-587 codifies a new section of Indiana Administrative Code (IAC). Specifically, the proposed rule establishes 812 IAC 1-1-44 as a codification for existing fines and penalties to be set by the Indiana Auctioneer Commission (Commission). This section of IAC gives flexibility to the Commission in assessing fines or civil penalties, establishes mitigating factors for consideration, and establishes aggravating factors for consideration.

The PLA's economic impact statement states that there will be no new requirements or costs to small businesses, rather the proposed rule aligns the Commission's practice of assessing fees, fines, and penalties with House Enrolled Act 1623 and Indiana Code 4-22-2-19.6. Based upon this statement and review, the Indiana Small Business Ombudsman supports the proposed rule related to the economic impact on small business if the PLA's conclusion reflects the actual result after promulgation.
