Pursuant to Indiana Code 4-22-2.1-5(c)(2), as the Small Business Ombudsman for the state of Indiana, I have reviewed the proposed rule and economic impact analysis associated with the rule changes contained in LSA Document #24-601 (proposed rule) submitted to the Indiana Small Business Ombudsman by the Indiana Professional Licensing Agency. I have found the following to be true.

Proposed rule LSA #24-601 amends 845 Indiana Administrative Code (IAC) 1-6-10 in order to codify the existing fine structures which the Board of Podiatric Medicine practices when issuing fines and civil penalties.

The Indiana Professional Licensing Agency's provided analysis displays a proper due diligence and understanding of how implementation must be carried out to ensure compliance while minimizing the potential impact to small businesses and individuals.
