I. CALL TO ORDER AND ESTABLISHMENT OF QUORUM

8:30 a.m.

Ms. Hall, Vice-President of the Indiana State Board of Nursing, called the meeting to order at 8:30 a.m. and established a quorum in accordance with IC § 25-23-1-5(b).

Ms. Hall recognized Mr. Burghduff for the exemplary work he has completed on behalf of the Indiana State Board of Nursing as this is his last meeting as a Board member.

II. ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA

III. ADOPTION OF THE MINUTES FROM THE MAY 15, 2014 MEETING OF THE BOARD

A motion was made and seconded to adopt the minutes from the May 15, 2014 board meeting. Cooper/Presley, 5-0-0, motion carries

IV. INDIANA STATE NURSES ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Mr. Lindquist addressed the Board. He provided a copy of the ISNAP quarterly newsletter and the quarterly compliance report with 81% of participants in full compliance. About 5% of all participants are significantly non-compliant and coming before the Board for that reason. Approximately 52% of all current participants are in ISNAP as ordered by the Board through the regulatory channels.

V. EDUCATION

A. ITT Tech Indianapolis Site Visit Report (Marie Holder)

Staff appeared from ITT Tech Indianapolis. Toni Herron, Education Compliance Officer, provided the report of the site visit. It had been requested that Mr. Ronald Hamm (Regional Nursing Support personnel) be present and he is not. Staff indicated that he was stranded in Las Vegas. The program director position for this campus has changed three times in the last year and their NCLEX scores have been between 65-77% in the last three years. Nursing leadership is poor, and Mr. Hamm had not visited the campus despite this fact. Site visitors were concerned about Mr. Hamm's qualifications as he holds an ASN degree. Linda Caputi had been engaged to consult after they had been placed on conditional accreditation but the report could not be located. At the time of the site visit, the Academic Dean and interim Nursing Program Chair were unaware of the conditional accreditation status of the Nursing program. The campus president was aware of the status but failed to share this with Nursing program personnel. Exams need more rigor and there is concern about insufficient

number of faculty for 140 current students. There continues to be little evidence that local faculty input into curriculum, admission decisions or exam content. None of current faculty was part of interview process for new Director. There are insufficient resources in learning labs, number of hardback volumes in library are small and not recent additions.

Site Visitor Recommendations: No admissions for 2014, then cap of admissions afterwards, faculty needs training on NCLEX type questions, provide education about admission policies to Nursing faculty, faculty committee for admissions process, develop and publish policies for criminal background checks, implement plan for binders for each course including syllabi, copies of exams, keys, and graded student work. Need analysis reporting to review curricular gaps as shown by NCLEX performance, need updated nursing resources in lab and library, develop and implement student survey to assess student concerns.

Ms. Cooper added that while administrative team was welcoming, they have significant issues. Ms. Cooper indicated in the response they indicate a cap on admissions is not necessary. Ms. Holder indicated they have hired more faculty and she is working with faculty on development. Ms. Cooper asked how many full time faculty are currently employed and Ms. Holder indicated there are 6 full time faculty with five there longer than six months and four there longer than one year. Current pass rates for 2014- 71%; for second quarter Ms. Holder reported she believes they are at 80% with 10 testing. Ms. Cooper indicated that the success of the program is based on the leadership and Ms. Holder is not aware of this basic information. Ms. Hall indicated hiring new faculty will not fix the problems they have, all recommendations need faculty development, changing of policies and procedures, etc. Ms. Narwold asked about concerns about faculty at initial site meeting and faculty resources. Ms. Narwold understands NLN accreditation was denied. Linda Caputi's report was included in response materials and she had indicated they were not ready but they chose to go through NLN accreditation and were denied. One simple identified area was faculty offices and not treating faculty well. When state site visitors recently visited, all faculty were again stuffed into one room in cubes. There seems to be no administrative support for faculty. If faculty cannot get administrative support they will not be successful. Ms. Cooper asked about Mr. Hamm's ASN qualifications. Ms. Cooper asked how many times since 5/1/14 has Mr. Hamm been on campus and he has not. ITT has 47 nursing programs throughout the United States and Mr. Hamm has charge of all Nursing programs. Mr. Georgeson was asked about administrative support. He indicated they have help with syllabi, training, help with NCLEX issues, etc. Ms. Narwold asked what ideas have been implemented and Mr. Georgeson indicated the HESI exam is incorporated. Ms. Cooper indicated the syllabi had books that have old editions, education and training has not worked. Tuition for the program for two years is \$50,000.00. Dr. Samson Yigezu has been there 6 months with a masters degree in Nursing and PhD in education but he was not present or mentioned on the day of the site visit. Ms. Hall indicated some of the same recommendations occurred for conditional accreditation and faculty are still not involved in processes. Ms. Cooper brought up the inadequacy of lab equipment. Since the site visit, staff indicates that they are working on adding a sim pad to one mannequin. Ms. Cooper asked how faculty is trained on the sim pad. Staff indicated that they have not been trained yet. They admitted thirty (30) new students in June and they have 155 current students enrolled. **Board Action: A motion was made and seconded to suspend admissions for remainder of 2014. The program will need to come to the Board for monthly site visits with Mr. Hamm in attendance, development of an electronic anonymous student survey which should be delivered to the Board prior to the monthly site visit on the 5th of every month, updated organization chart with changes, teaching breakdown of who is teaching what and what hours, anecdotal report of their breakdown of rates for current percentage and outliers, report on the lab and what equipment is there, and adoption of the remainder of recommendations of survey team. They have until December 2014 to rectify the problems on the corporate side and one year to improve the NCLEX portion. Hall/Cooper, 5-0-0, motion accepted**

D. Medtech College Monthly Report (All Campuses)

Medtech's request for curriculum revision is tabled until next month due to quorum issues. Ms. Selby presented their action plan which was submitted this month. Ms. Selby indicates the corporate commitment is deepened and Nursing now runs the Nursing programs. Medtech has reorganized to include a Regional Vice President for Nursing and the CEO and Chief Regulatory Officer have been involved since January including in-person on-site visits since January 2014. Ms. Hall meets weekly with Program Directors for each campus to promote cross-

campus communication and making all three campuses mirror the same standards and policies. MedTech recognizes a huge turnover issues. The PDON for Greenwood (Monica Baugh) has been promoted to regional faculty development to promote training of faculty, onboarding of faculty and active teaching, and classroom observation of faculty members. Ms. Updike is interim PDON at Greenwood now. Academic rigor strategies including increasing grading scale to 78%, changing method of evaluation so that students can no longer fail exams and pass the class, faculty educated and continued education on test writing and test analysis. Communication is a continued challenge, student surveys recognize that student to faculty communication is an ongoing challenge. School to student communication continues to be a challenge and is not as good as it should be includes campus newsletter, homework announcements in classroom, bulletin boards, emails to students and monthly PDON forums. Contact hours have been decreased for all faculty. Faculty involvement has been strengthened across all aspects.

Ms. Cooper asked about the grading scale and whether it was done at the close of a quarter and it was. Changes in personnel were submitted and include CEO Bobby Reese who was formerly COO. Ms. Selby also submitted updated organizational chart with two amendments provided today in Nursing. Ms. Cooper asked questions about the Fort Wayne campus and 60% of students reporting communication is poor and more than half say policies are applied inconsistently. Ms. Kennedy indicated that some of the confusion was not starting program director forums and student advising is increasing. Ms. Cooper indicated concerns were about supplies and Ms. Kennedy indicates supplies were ordered and came in first of June. Sim labs coordinator for the Fort Wayne campus started June 9th and has organized the lab. Consistent concerns about favoritism and not being treated equally as students. Fort Wayne OB/PEDS in July 2014 they will be going to a hospital for six weeks, some in-services for PEDS and OB. For 9/12 weeks students will be in a clinical facility with a PEDS and OB unit. Ms. Cooper asked if all students will have equal time and Ms. Kennedy indicated "YES". Ms. Kennedy indicated students will also be going to childbirth classes and breastfeeding support groups. Fort Wayne faculty monthly report was very poor. Ms. Kennedy indicates now all faculty have reported Ms. Narwold indicated there are many blanks on the organization charts and she asked if those are actually spots that are open. Ms. Selby indicates that when they resubmit they will complete in a different format to make this clearer as spots are not open. Ms. Cooper asked if there are directions for faculty to feel valued. Ms. Kennedy indicates she has met with faculty individually and an employee appreciation is planned for July. Ms. Kennedy has openings at this time with 7 full time staff and 6 adjuncts with 177 students. Students for RN were last admitted two quarters ago and PN students were admitted in April. According to staff calculations: Fort Wayne 1st quarter pass rates were 62% RN and 88% PN; 2nd quarter RN-52% and 88% PN. Greenwood-2nd quarter 38% RN and 64% PN; Indy 100% PN and 52.1% RN. No action could be taken today due to quorum. Official pass rates may be out from NCSBN in time for the July meeting. They will return in July for their curriculum request and corporate information.

- Ms. Crawford appeared for her personal appearance regarding her application for licensure. She graduated in 2010 and had a battery charge in 2011. An elderly woman was battered. The person who did this drove the

same kind of car that she did. Police checked around and her name was mentioned as to driving that type of car. She went to court. One of the ladies friends was there and recognized her and signed papers stating it wasn't her. The officer picked her out after doing a Google search but did not do any type of facial recognition with the victim.

Ms. Presley recommends take a review course and provide the board with documentation showing she has 95% or greater chance at passing. Once this predictability documentation is received she will be allowed to test. Her license is to be issued free and clear.

2. Diana Orrell RN Exam 3 Fails/ Grad Date of December 2010

Ms. Orrell appeared for her personal appearance regarding her application for licensure. She has failed the NCLEX 3 times and graduated in 2010. She was taken a Kaplan course. She thinks she has test anxiety. She knows the information but just has trouble with the test.

Ms. Presley recommends take a review course and provide the board with documentation showing she has 95% or greater chance at passing. Once this predictability documentation is received she will be allowed to test. Her license is to be issued free and clear.

3. Lloyd Jones LPN Exam CBC Hit/ Positive Response

Mr. Jones appeared for his personal appearance regarding his application for licensure. There was a girl, at the facility where he previously worked, who bothered him. She told people at the facility that he hit her. He was suspended while the facility did their investigation. They did not find any truth to her complaint and he went back to work. The same person then went to the police and filed a report with them. They put a warrant out for his arrest. The facility told him that he could return to work once the issue was all resolved. He got an attorney and the attorney suggested he take a diversion plea. After he took the plea deal he decided to find a new place of employment. He is currently working at Plainfield Health Care. He is not on any type of criminal probation. In 1991 he had a theft charge that was dismissed. He was with some friends who stole some items from a store. In 2002, he had a battery charge. He was dating a girl who got mad at him. She called the cops on him. He was not home when she called the cops. When he arrived at the house his girlfriend wasn't there but the cops were. This charge was dismissed.

Ms. Presley recommends he be allowed to test and his license is to be issued free and clear.

4. Kayla Townsend LPN Exam Grad Date of December 2010

Ms. Townsend appeared for her personal appearance regarding her application for licensure. She graduated in 2010 and has previously take the NCLEX and failed. She answered yes to a question on the application but it was in error.

Ms. Presley recommends take a review course and provide the board with documentation showing she has 95% or greater chance at passing. Once this predictability documentation is received she will be allowed to test. Her license is to be issued free and clear.

5. Evan Fisher RN Exam CBC Hit/ Positive Response

Mr. Fisher appeared for his personal appearance regarding his application for licensure. He has had 3 prior misdemeanors. In 2009, he had an OWI charge. He went through St. Joseph County court and completed everything that was asked of him. He had a public intoxication charge. He was at home and decided to walk to a friend's house. At that time his blood alcohol level was .3. In September of 2013, he received an OWI. His blood alcohol level was .23. He is currently on criminal probation. The criminal probation is scheduled to be completed on December 13, 2014. He has been in compliance with his criminal probation. He no longer drinks.

Ms. Presley recommends that he be allowed to test. He needs to have an ISNAP evaluation and enter into the RMA if he is eligible. His license is to be issued on probation for the length of his criminal probation or RMA, if eligible, whichever is longer.

8. Julie Holz LPN Endo CBC Hit/ Positive Response

Ms. Holz appeared for her personal appearance regarding her application for licensure. She is currently licensed in Washington State. In September 2012, she was arrested after an accident. She was driving while on Soma. The charges were dropped. She no longer takes Soma. In 1999, she had an assault charge but does not remember the details because it was so long ago. In 2004, she had a domestic abuse charge. She got into a fight

with her boyfriend and he pressed charges. They are no longer together. Her Washington license is active and has no discipline against it. She has not worked as a nurse since 2004. She has been reading books to keep up to date with the profession

Ms. Presley recommends she take a refresher course with a clinical component. Once she provides the board with documentation showing this has been completed she can be licensed free and clear.

9. Andrea Massow RN Exam CBC Hit/ Positive Response

Ms. Massow appeared for her personal appearance regarding her application for licensure. She is currently an LPN. In 2007, she had an OWI that was reduced to reckless driving charge. In 2014, she received another OWI that was reduced to a reckless driving charge. She was out with friends and thought she was ok to drive. Her blood alcohol level was .23. She is scheduled to be on criminal probation until September 2014. She no longer drinks. She has been in contact with ISNAP and just returned her RMA.

Ms. Presley recommends she be allowed to test. Her license is to be issued on probation for the length of her RMA.

10. Brett Bush RN Exam CBC Hit/ Positive Response

Mr. Bush appeared for his personal appearance regarding his application for licensure. In 2013, he had a charge of possession of legend drug. The charges were dismissed. He was also charged with diversion. He had some tramadol in his possession that was not his. He went through an intensive outpatient program. He is not on any type of criminal probation.

Ms. Presley recommends be allowed to test. He needs to have an INSNAP evaluation. If he meets criteria for an RMA then his license will be issued on probation for the length of his RMA. If he does not meet criteria his license is to be issued free and clear.

11. Nicole Coley RN Exam Positive Response

Ms. Coley appeared for her personal appearance regarding her application for licensure. She is currently working as LPN and her license is currently on probation.

Ms. Presley recommends she be allowed to test. Her RN license is to be issued on probation per her LPN probation order.

12. Parhom Shoar-Ghaffari RN Exam CBC Hit/ Positive Response

Mr. Shoar-Ghaffari appeared for his personal appearance regarding his application for licensure. He appeared with his counsel, Lorie Brown. The years 2002- 2009, was a bad period of his life. He was trying to fit in and unfortunately it became a way of life for him. In 2002, he received a forgery charge and a drug paraphernalia charge in Wayne County, Ohio. The forgery charged was never filed. In 2004, he received a DUI charge. He had not been drinking but had marijuana in his system. In 2008, he had a DUI that involved ambien. The ambien he had taken was not his. In 2009, he was charged with driving without a license and drug paraphernalia. He has contacted ISNAP and they have recommended a 6 month RMA.

Ms. Presley recommends he be allowed to test. His license is to be issued on probation for the length of his RMA.

13. Kevia Farley RN Exam CBC Hit/ Positive Response

Mr. Farley appeared for his personal appearance regarding his application for licensure. In 2003, he was charged with public intoxication. He came out of a bar with some friends and got smart with a police officer. The charges were dismissed. In 2004, he was in a single car accident. He hit a telephone pole and was taken to the hospital. He was charged with a DUI. He went to court and the case was dismissed. In 2007, he was charged with possession of marijuana. He was camping with some friends and did not know they had marijuana on them. Everyone was charged. He completed a criminal deferment program and the charges were dismissed. He does not drink anymore and has never smoked marijuana. He has not been in trouble since this time

Ms. Presley recommends he be allowed to test. His license is to be issued free and clear.

14. Jessica Kirby RN Exam CBC Hit/ Positive Response

Ms. Kirby appeared for her personal appearance regarding her application for licensure. She had a warrant out for failure to appear. The court had her address wrong. The warrant was based on a traffic stop. At the time of the stop she was told she was receiving a warning. Later she found out there was an actual ticket. She is not on any type of criminal probation. She has not had any other issues.

Ms. Presley recommends she be allowed to test. Her license is to be issued free and clear.

15. Jennifer Wiist

RN Exam

Grad Date of May 2004

Ms. Wiist appeared for her personal appearance regarding her application for licensure. She graduated in 2004. She took the NCLEX once and did not pass. Since then she stayed home with her kids. She has reviewed NCLEX books and completed the cds on those.

Ms. Presley recommends her application to be denied. She needs to return to school.

16. Chike Nwokedi

RN Exam

CBC Hit/ Positive Response

Mr. Nwokedi appeared for his personal appearance regarding his application for licensure. In 2012, he was charged with patronizing a prostitute. He was on his way to pick up his daughter from school and stopped at a gas station for gas. A lady waved at him and he waved back. She came over and started talking to him. He entertained the conversation. She asked if he had any money and he said he didn't. He didn't know she was a prostitute. She turned out to be an undercover police officer. An attorney told him to take a plea deal so that is what he did. He had to do community service and the case was dismissed. Since this time he has learned to be more careful with his judgment and who he interacts with. He has never had any other issues.

Ms. Presley recommends he be allowed to test. His license is to be issued free and clear.

17. Ashley DePillars

LPN Exam

CBC Hit/ Positive Response

Ms. DePillars appeared for her personal appearance regarding her application for licensure. In 2001, she was arrested for retail theft. In 2008, she was charged with disorderly conduct. Both cases were dismissed. She has learned to be careful of the company she keeps and who to associate with. She has a valid CNA certificate and is a medical assistant. She has never received any type of discipline.

Ms. Presley recommends she be allowed to test. Her license is to be issued free and clear.

18. Damon Merechant

RN Exam

Grad Date of May 2011

Mr. Merechant appeared for his personal appearance regarding his application for licensure. He was working at a technician in the ER. There was a mix up on the schedule. He informed his preceptor of this and asked to have the training rescheduled. They told him no. The training he was to do that day was on the computer. After working a 12 hours overnight shift at another job, he fell asleep while doing the computer training. This happened while he was on his probation period. He was terminated.

He graduated nursing school in 2011. He is currently taking a review course.

Ms. Presley recommends he finish the review course and provide the board with documentation showing he has 95% or greater chance at passing. Once this predictability documentation is received, he will be allowed to test. His license is to be issued free and clear.

19. David Rupel

RN Exam

CBC Hit/ Positive Response

Mr. Rupel appeared for his personal appearance regarding his application for licensure. In 2008, he received a DUI. His blood alcohol level was .12. In 2010, he received another DUI. His blood alcohol level was .12. Both times he was dealing with a break up and drank a lot. He now handles issues by working out, going for a walk, etc. He went through treatment in 2010.

Ms. Presley recommends he be allowed to test and his license to be issued free and clear.

20. Eric Marcyjanik

RN Exam

CBC Hit/ Positive Response

Mr. Marcyjanik appeared for his personal appearance regarding his application for licensure. In 2013, he received an OWI. His blood alcohol level was .1. He was hanging out with some friends after a softball game. They had some drinks then he drove home. He was at a stoplight and noticed his hatchback was not shut all the way. He was going to pull over and shut it. When he took off his cooler fell out of the back of his car. There was a police officer right behind him when this happened. All charges were dropped due to prosecutorial discretion. In 1991, he had a minor consumption charge. He is not on any type of criminal probation.

Ms. Presley recommends he be allowed to test. His license is to be issued free and clear.

21. Heidi Darrah

RN Exam

CBC Hit/ Positive Response

Ms. Darrah appeared for her personal appearance regarding her application for licensure. In 2011, she had an OWI. She was out celebrating with friends. She was given a year of criminal probation, which she successfully

completed. She has spoken with ISNAP. She has had a current evaluation done. She has completed alcohol education classes.

Ms. Presley recommends she be allowed to test. Her license is to be issued free and clear.

22. Amanda Christenson RN Exam CBC Hit/ Positive Response- FULL BOARD

The applicant appeared in person for a personal appearance regarding her application for examination by licensure. She has two felony criminal convictions. In 2005 she was involved in a car accident where she was drinking and driving which resulted in the deaths of two people. Her BAC was .14. She served four years in prison and has completed her parole. Upon release, she went in to a 12 week treatment program and completed aftercare. Since 2010, she started school and has been sober since November 2005. She currently is prescribed Adderall, Wellbutrin, and Celexa. Board Action: A motion was made and seconded to table the action and she needs to submit an MMPI-II and then be rescheduled for a personal appearance before the full Board.

23. Mx Herrell II RN Exam Grad Date of December 2004

Mr. Herrell appeared for his personal appearance regarding his application for licensure. He was arrested in 1994 or 1995. He answered no on his application because he thought it had been thrown out. His grandpa had died and some family started fighting with each other. His aunt put a restraining order on him and claimed he violated it when they were at the same store. The matter was dismissed. He has not taken the boards since he graduated. He is currently working as an LPN.

Ms. Presley recommends he take a refresher course with a clinical competent. Once this is done he will be allowed to test. His license is to be issued free and clear.

24. LaToya Neely RN Exam 4 Fails/ Grad Date of December 2010

Ms. Neely appeared for her personal appearance regarding her application for licensure. She has taken the NCLEX previously and failed. She has taken Kaplan. She has not tested since the last time she took Kaplan. Ms. Presley recommends she be allowed to test. Her license is to be issued free and clear.

25. Jessica Davis RN Exam CBC Hit/ Positive Response

Ms. Davis appeared for her personal appearance regarding her application for licensure. Her daughter's father was selling drugs. She was charged with maintaining a common nuisance. She did not know he was doing this but she has suspected it. She knows she should have acted on that suspicion. She is currently on criminal probation until April 2015.

Ms. Presley recommends she be allowed to test. Her license is to be issued on probation for the length of her criminal probation.

26. Bianca Brown RN Exam 6 Fails/CBC Hit/ Positive Response

Ms. Brown appeared for her personal appearance regarding her application for licensure. In 2013, she had a public intoxication charge outside her home. She was at home with some friends and they jumped her. Her son called the cops. She is scheduled to be on criminal probation until December 2014. She no longer associates with these people. She graduated in 2010 and has taken the NCLEX several times and failed. She feels like she has test anxiety. She recently completed the Kaplan review but has tested since then and failed.

Ms. Presley recommends take a review course and provide the board with documentation showing she has 95% or greater chance at passing. Once this predictability documentation is received she will be allowed to test. Upon successful completions of the NCLEX, her license is to be issued on probation for the length of her criminal probation.

27. Miranda Piper RN Exam CBC Hit/ Positive Response

Ms. Piper appeared for her personal appearance regarding her application for licensure. In 2014, she received an OWI. Her blood alcohol level was .14. It was her 21st birthday and she had been out with friends and family. Her mother had driven her home. Once she was home she got into a fight with her boyfriend. He then left her house. Her car got stuck and the police were called. Her court date is scheduled for June 24, 2014.

Ms. Presley recommends she be allowed to test. She needs to have an ISNAP evaluation. Her license is to be placed on probation for the length of her criminal probation or her RMA, if eligible, whichever is longer.


