- I. **CALL TO ORDER AND ESTABLISHMENT OF QUORUM** 8:30 a.m.
Ms. Hall, President of the Indiana State Board of Nursing, called the meeting to order at 8:30 a.m. and established a quorum in accordance with IC § 25-23-1-5(b).

- II. **ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA**
A motion was made and seconded to adopt the amended agenda. McIntosh/Smith 8-0-0, motion carries
- III. **ADOPTION OF THE MINUTES FROM THE MARCH 19, 2015 AND APRIL 09, 2015 MEETINGS OF THE BOARD**
A motion was made and seconded to adopt the minutes of the March 19, 2015. Cooper/Ogle, 7-0-1, Narwold abstains, motion carries
A motion was made and seconded to adopt the minutes of the April 9, 2015. Narwold/Laux, 5-0-3, Cooper, Presley, and Ogle abstains, motion carries
- IV. **INDIANA STATE NURSES ASSISTANCE PROGRAM**
Mr. Lindquist addressed the board regarding ISNAP. He discussed the provider luncheon that took place on May 13, 2015. He discussed Parkedale and its purpose with the board. He explained that there would not be an exclusive relationship between Parkedale and ISNAP. He then addressed the students and gave them an overview of the ISNAP program. There is not a contract between ISNAP and Parkdale but a Memorandum of Understanding. Parkdale will not be taking away any responsibilities of ISNAP. They will be additional recourses for ISNAP and the nurses to use. Mr. Garcia from Parkdale was present to answer any questions the board had.
Mr. Lindquist addressed the students in the audience and gave them an overview of what ISNAP was.
- V. **EDUCATION**
- A. **IU Kokomo Request for Curriculum Change (Dr. Linda Wallace and Bridget Whitmore)**
Dr. Linda Wallace and Bridget Whitmore appeared on behalf of IU Kokomo. The decision was made to bring the Kokomo curriculum into alignment with the Mission/Vision/Statements of Beliefs of other IU nursing programs. These had been previously submitted and adopted by Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education and ISBN as a substantive change in August 2014. The Board accepted the request as submitted and complimented the program on a job well done. McIntosh/Ogle 7-0-1 Norwold abstains, motion carries
- B. **ITT South Bend Monthly Report (Lynda Newton)**
Lynda Newton appeared on behalf of the program. Ms. Cooper asked how many faculty positions were vacant. Ms. Newton stated that 1 faculty member had left, leaving 4 FT and 1 PT current faculty members. Interviews are in process to fill the open position. Ms. Cooper asked about the Student Advisory group and Ms. Newton stated that each class picks their own representative. Ms. Newton was asked about the complaint filed by a student regarding the change in the grade book and subsequent failure of a course. Ms. Newton stated that she was aware and 2 students had filed

appeals of the grade. She met with the students involved several times. When asked about the outcome of the appeals, Ms. Newton stated that she didn't know the outcome that was "above her". Ms. Cooper stated that this decision should be between the instructor, program chair and the student, not a corporate entity. Ms. Newton stated the weight assigned by the instructor was incorrect and when the mistake was discovered several days later, it affected the final grades of 8 out of 11 students. The students required to repeat the class were able to repeat at no cost to them. Ms. Cooper pointed out that 75% of the students failed this class. Ms. Cooper noted that included in the complaint sent by the student to the Board, were copies of the text messages that were exchanged between the instructor and the student. Ms. Cooper stated that texting was unprofessional and inappropriate on the part of faculty, and all communication between student and instructor should occur face to face and not through text. Ms. Newton states that faculty had been instructed to follow policy and only use ITT email. Ms. Laux stated that the program was not moving in a positive direction. Ms. McIntosh asked Ms. Herron if Mr. Hamm had contacted the Board, since in previous appearances before the Board, he had stated that he was aware at the national level of all complaints. Ms. Herron stated that there had been no contact from Mr. Hamm to the Board. Ms. Cooper encouraged ZMs. Newton to do all that was possible to provide support to the 8 students in jeopardy. Report accepted. They will appear again before the Board after their unannounced site visit this summer.

C. ITT Merrillville Monthly Report (Kimberly McIntyre Borum)

Ms. Kimberly McIntyre Borum appeared on behalf of the program. Ms. McIntosh stated that the NCLEX scores continue to miss the Board benchmark of 80%. Ms. McIntyre Borum stated that, due to the graduation dates of ITT graduates, they would never reach 80%. Graduation occurs in December and March. Ms. McIntyre Borum states there is up to a 3 month period before some graduates test. Ms. McIntosh stated that, regardless, the program is regulated by the Board according to pass rates of graduates, as with any other program in the state. Ms. McIntosh stated that the program needs to work on the reasons why students do not test in a timely manner. Ms. McIntyre Borum stated the delays with applications and eligibility to test played a part in the delay. Not counting the December 2014 graduates, there are 47 graduates outstanding that have not tested. There are 10 students in the cohort set to graduate on June 11. Ms. McIntyre Borum stated that the students, who contacted Elsevier independently about issues with testing, jumped 3 levels of authority by pursuing this course of action. Ms. Laux stated that perhaps there was a reason that they did not feel comfortable doing otherwise. Ms. Cooper stated that Elsevier is a vendor of a product and should not have contacted the students directly but should have responded to the program. Ms. McIntosh stated that the Board still has concerns over this program and other ITT programs that outside entities, rather than local faculty, have control over the nursing program. Ms. Cooper stated that, based on the letters the Board has received from ITT Merrillville students, it appears that the students don't feel that they have a voice. Report accepted. They will appear again before the Board after their unannounced site visit this summer or in July whichever occurs first.

D. ITT Indianapolis Monthly Report (Alice Marie Holder)

Ms. Alice Marie Holder and Mr. Jeff Georgeson appeared on behalf of the program. Ms. Holder was congratulated on the progress being made. Of the March graduates, 5 of 5 have passed NCLEX. She was asked when the next class graduated and she stated 8 students are due to graduate on June 23. Ms. McIntosh stated that whatever the Indianapolis campus is doing, it is working. She encouraged Ms. Holder to share these strategies with the other ITT campuses. Report accepted. They will appear again before the Board on June 18 for their repeat site visit report.

E. MJS Monthly Report (Annette Murray)

Ms. Annette Murray appeared on behalf of the program. Ms. Murray stated that based on student feedback, she would like to spread the pharmacology content from one 3 hour course to 4 hours divided among Health Alterations I (Med- Surg) Health Alterations II, Mental Health/OB, and Pediatrics. She stated that she had already started this practice and that students seemed to better connect the pharmacology information to pathophysiology being introduced. Ms. McIntosh stated that this increased the overall credit hours and was a curriculum change that requires Board approval and should have been sought prior to initiating the practice. Ms. Murray was asked to submit a formal request including an explanation, rationale and supporting evidence for the curriculum revision and to bring that before the Board for review. The next cohort to graduate will be in July. Ms. Murray was cautioned to review the Board rules regarding education. Report accepted. They will appear again before the Board after their unannounced site visit this summer or again in July whichever comes first.

F. St. Elizabeth Monthly Report (Deacon John Jezierski)

Deacon John Jezierski and Michelle Gerrety appeared on behalf of the program. The Board congratulated the program on the first quarter NCLEX results of 100% pass rate 17/17. Ms. Narwold stated that the program is doing well and is on the right track. The Board thanked them for submitting a very good report. Report accepted. They will appear again before the Board July 16 for their repeat site visit report.

G. Medtech Greenwood ASN (Alexandra Torres MSN, RN, MBA)

Ms. Alexandra Torres and Ms. Erin Webley of the law firm of Ice Miller appeared on behalf of the program. Ms. Torres had compiled a response to the student complaints that had previously been shared with her. Ms. Webley distributed copies of the response to the Board. Ms. Torres was asked the length of a quarter and she replied that it varies. It may be 10 to 12 weeks depending on the course, holidays and scheduled school breaks. The quarter in question began on February 2, 2015 and finished on April 21, 2015. The schedule was posted on the Medtech student portal and internal bulletin boards. Ms. Torres stated that the syllabus was incorrect but that the mistake was not discovered until later in the quarter. Ms. Torres stated that the students were notified on April 2, 2015 of the change in test dates due to the error. Ms. Cooper stated the syllabus is a contract between the student and the course/school. Prior to the start of a course, faculty should review the syllabus for errors and then go through the syllabus line by line with students on the first day of class. Ms. Narwold asked about difficulties with ATI testing. Students reported in their communication to the Board that the computerized ATI test would kick them out repeatedly and require the student to restart the test. Ms. Narwold stated the studies have shown in high stakes testing situations, like ATI, computer glitches often result in the student doing poorly on the exam. If the student does poorly in this type of situation, Ms. Torres states that the student is not able to retake the exam. Ms. McIntosh stated that every effort should be made to promote student success. If computer problems were occurring, the exam should have been stopped and rescheduled. Faculty should ask themselves "What can I do to help students be successful? Students should be held harmless for the things outside of their control." Ms. Torres was recommended to review the process for review of the syllabi. No action is required by the Board.

VI. DISCUSSION

1. Request to Allow Indiana Dabney RN Students to Take PN NCLEX

Mr. Russell Sipes appeared on behalf of 9 Indiana Dabney students who are requesting to take the PN NCLEX exam. These students were at a point in the ASN program where they were not eligible for graduation. Mr. Sipes stated that this is the only group of students attending Dabney that have not obtained relief. They are in this position through no fault of their own. This is a unique circumstance since this is the first nursing program that has been closed in the state. Ms. Cooper stated that others in RN programs have requested to take the PN NCLEX in the past and the Board has denied those requests thus setting precedent. She also noted that LPNs have a leadership role in long term or extended care facilities and these students have not received that role specific and leadership education. Ms. Cooper fears that allowing these students to take the PN NCLEX could reduce the integrity of the LPN role. Ms. Narwold stated that she would be open to some type of creative solution to assist the students if one could be found. Ms. McIntosh stated that this would require a review of transcripts and that there are others who could do that work for the Board. It was also noted that our rules state the graduation from an accredited LPN program is required to be authorized to take the PN NCLEX. Narwold/Cooper 7-0-0 Motion denied.

17. **Sydney Powell** **LPN Exam** **Positive Response**
 Sydney Powell appeared for a personal appearance on May 21st, 2015. Ms. Powell applied for an LPN license by examination. She answered “yes to question 3 and 4 on the application. In 2010, she was arrested for possession of alcohol by a minor. The charges were dropped. In May 2014 she was terminated from Beecher Manor Nursing and Rehab for not reporting abuse immediately. She was working as a CNA at the time. A resident was being difficult. The curtain was closed and she overheard another CNA hear “Don’t hit me,” and heard a slapping noise. She waited until the next day to report it to the director. They terminated her because she was required to report the incident right away. Ms. Powell was not aware of this policy. She is currently working as a CNA in another facility. Ms. Presley recommends that Ms. Powell is issued free and clear upon passing the NCLEX examination.
18. **Kelly Burns** **RN Endo** **Positive Response**
 Kelly Burns appeared for a personal appearance on May 21st, 2015. She applied for an RN license by endorsement. She answered “yes” to question 1 on the application. Her Texas license has been disciplined. She is being treated for alcoholism and is being monitored by Texas. Her monitoring will end January 2016. She’s been sober since August 2010. She went through a divorce and is suffering from depression. She used alcohol to cope. She is currently working as a nurse in Texas. She contacted ISNAP and is still in the evaluation process. Ms. Presley recommends that Ms. Burns is issued on probation for 6 months or if she is a candidate for ISNAP, the length of the RMA.

Ms. Presley recommends that Ms. Schell completes a refresher course with a clinical component. She may be renewed free and clear upon submitting a certificate of completion.
