Respondent's attorney gave an opening statement. Respondent had no intention to willfully or knowingly violate any statute and asked that the board not issue any sanction on the license. Respondent's attorney asked Respondent questions. Respondent explained what happened. EPIC is the electronic medical record used and sorry for making an honest mistake. Has practiced for 22 years and never had a complaint like this. No longer dispenses this particular medication. The Board asked what medications were being stored and used in his practice. Respondent discussed phentermine (sp). The Board asked why the Respondent chose to dispense this medication and not just issue a prescription. The Respondent answered that it had to do with the patients' ability to pay. Respondent did check INSPECT. Respondent has a

MOA with DEA regarding management of controlled substances. Medications were in a locked room. Never completed a DEA final inventory. Respondent is an independent practitioner and stopped dispensing the phentermine but still has it in stock. The Board asked the Respondent to explain his patient population and the nature of his practice related to obesity. GLP1s replaced a lot of the phentermine. 40 percent of the patient is medicaid. About 10 percent of the patient population is cash based. The Board asked about the Respondent storing and administering testosterone in the office. The Respondent explained that he attended a special course about administering testosterone. The Board explained why the DEA required that an inventory be conducted. Respondent explained that he does not have an inventory but does have all of the receipts. Each patient who's administered testosterone is listed on a sheet (of paper. There's also a note and charting to match whatever is administered. The Board asked if the Respondent uses a dispensing system in the office. The Board asked if the Respondent ever counted out medication dispensed to a patient. Prescribed GLP1s to patients. Some pharmacists will send the patients back to the Respondent to administer to the patient. Respondent's main practice is related to weight management. Phentermine and testosterone were the only medications dispensed and administered. The Board asked the Respondent to describe the reconciliation process. The Respondent gave closing statement, described how immediate action was taken after meeting with the DEA and requested that no sanction be imposed. The Respondent plans to comply with the DEA MOA. Respondent has conducted a bi-annual inventory. The Board explained what negative impacts to patients could occur for failing to report to INSPECT. The BOARD asked about the Board's options. Only suspension or revocation is possible. The Board asked why the OTSC ties the Board's hands so much. The Board can ask a licensee to personally appear during a renewal cycle or file a complaint. The Board discussed requesting the Board Inspector conduct an inspection. The Board discussed having the license record flagged.

After having considered the evidence presented and taking official, judicial notice of the pleadings, evidence and orders in this matter the Board moved to have an inspection, review the DEA Practitioner's Manual and DECLINE to either SUSPEND or REVOKE.

Needs this license to be free and clear so she can pursue licensure in Texas. The Board asked what lead to the Respondent taking the medications. Respondent states she has been clean and sober for eight years. 11/8/2018 sobriety date and no other run ins with the law. Expunged in 2020. The State called Tracy Traut to testify. Tracy testified about Respondent's three-year RMA and terms of that agreement. Discussed a 2020 OTSC filed by IPRP and explained that the Respondent was unsuccessfully discharged from the IPRP RMA. IPRP will work with other states if a IPRP participant moves. IPRP becomes a secondary participant in that matter. The Board Director testified about when the Respondent's license expired. The Respondent gave a closing statement and hoped to resolve this matter and understands that she did not act responsibly. The State has not met the burden of proof showing that she will not be a danger to the public. The State requests that the Board deny the Respondent's petition. Board Counsel advised that the Board could reinstate the license on probation with terms and conditions including not practicing in Indiana at this time. The Board asked if a new intake could be requested. The Board asked whether the Respondent could relinquish her license. The Board reopened the hearing. The Board asked why she didn't complete her IPRP reinstatement. The Respondent was going through a divorce, did not intend to practice as a pharmacy technician at the time and planned to move to Texas. The Respondent admitted to acting irresponsibly. The Respondent is currently in counseling and completed an evaluation in Texas as requested from the Texas BOP. The Texas BOP still denied her application because of the status of her Indiana license. Respondent had to pay \$500 for her intake in Texas.
