3.) Describe any challenges/parameters on the capacity of your program below:

A. Faculty recruitment/retention: Faculty salaries are lower than nursing salaries outside of education. Applicants have expressed disappointment in faculty salaries. MSN prepared nurse practitioners chose to work in the clinic setting due to higher salaries. Those with an MSN in nursing education do pursue employment at the university, however they are not



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abundant in number. In this smaller community it is also very difficult to find MSN prepared nurses interested in adjunct opportunities due to the salary and their other job commitments.

B. Availability of clinical placements: Clinical placement sites are adequate, but not abundant in the Knox County area. Finding clinical experiences for nursing students during pediatric rotations is difficult due to low volume acute care inpatient volume in community hospitals. Faculty are using more community resources and simulation for pediatric clinical experiences. Competing with other nursing programs and health care programs for space in the hospitals has been a concern. Consolidation of hospital resources (closing units) has limited clinical space.

C. Other programmatic concerns (library resources, skills lab, sim lab, etc.): Space concerns in the simulation lab have been addressed and renovation options are being discussed with university architect.

The Board may take whatever action it deems appropriate regarding verbal complaints, complaints that are submitted anonymously, or complaints in which the complainant has not given consent to being identified.



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
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
