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The Public Defender Commission thanks all public defenders, public defender boards, judges, and Indiana citizens who submitted public comment related to Standard J: Caseloads and to the Guideline for Standard G when there is not a comparable prosecutorial salary on which to base compensation. The Commission reviewed each comment that was submitted.

At the December 15, 2021, meeting the Commission heard both pros and cons to the proposed changes and the proposed timelines for those changes. The Commission approved all proposed changes, with the exceptions of the following two items:

- Life Without Parole (LWOP) appeal four-quarter maximums were originally proposed to be, for a 1.0 FTE attorney, 20 for inadequately staffed and 25 for adequately staffed. These were changed to the ABA recommendation of 15 on a four-quarter basis regardless of staffing level.
- The date by which each county is expected to comply with the new standard and guideline changes was originally proposed for January 1, 2023. <u>The Commission is providing additional time, if a county wishes to have it, and will be requiring compliance by January 1, 2024.</u>

The final change to the Guideline that accompanies Standard G is as follows:

For counties where there is no position in the prosecutor's office corresponding with a position in the public defenders' office a full-time (1.0 FTE) salaried or contract public defender must be paid not less than \$80,000 and a half-time salaried or contract public defender not less than \$40,000. Full and part time public defenders are defined as such by the number of cases assigned in a 12-month period. If a county does not want to contract for a full-time public defender at \$80,000, then the caseload should be reduced so as not to exceed the percentage of the public defenders' compensation compared to \$80,000 or the compensation of the deputy prosecutor in a similar position. Effective 1/1/24.
