II. Agency Projects

1. **Indiana State Police (100)** \$ 85,000
Sellersburg Post Rehabilitation

The Indiana State Police (ISP) is requesting funding for the rehabilitation of the Sellersburg Post. \$593,000 was previously approved; however, updated estimates require additional funding. The facility has been in operation for more than 45 years, has reached the end of its useful life. This project will include new floor coverings, wall coverings, soundproofing interview room walls, ceiling tile replacement and technology upgrades.

2. **Adjutant General's Office (110)** \$ 500,000
Fort Wayne Air National Guard Base Modernization Plan

The Adjutant General's Office (AGO) is requesting funding in preparation for the arrival of the F-35 jet at the Fort Wayne Air National Guard Base. The base was established in 1947 and has received past renovations to accommodate different aircraft as needed. The 122nd Fighter Wing must position itself to be selected as the Headquarters for the Air Force basing decision within the next 18 months. This phase will provide funding for an Area Development Plan (ADP) that will address infrastructure and modernization needs.

3. **Adjutant General's Office (110)** \$ 517,300
Fort Wayne Air National Guard Base Modernization Design

The Adjutant General's Office (AGO) is requesting funding to finalize the design for renovations to the Fort Wayne squadron operations building. The building is 22,638 square feet and houses the existing F-16 airplanes at the base and serves as the base communications facility. This renovation will help accommodate the new mission of 21 total F-16's in inventory. This funding will complete the design process.

4. **Department of Natural Resources (300)** \$ 1,100,000
O'Bannon Woods Pool Slide Replacement

The Department of Natural Resources (DNR) is requesting funding for the replacement of the water slide at the O'Bannon Woods aquatic facility. The existing slide was originally installed in 2006 and regularly maintained to extend its useful life until 2025 when the slide was closed due to corrosion and identified for replacement. This project will include the design, transportation, and installation of a new, fiberglass slide restoring the facility's aquatic recreational capacity.

5. **Department of Natural Resources (300)** \$ 1,100,000
Shakamak State Park Pool Slide Replacement

The Department of Natural Resources (DNR) is requesting funding for the replacement of the water slide at the Shakamak State Park aquatic facility. The existing slide was originally installed in the early 1990's and regularly maintained to extend its useful life until 2025 when the slide was closed due to deterioration and identified for replacement. This project will include the design, transportation, and installation of a new, fiberglass slide restoring the facility's aquatic recreational capacity.

6. **Department of Natural Resources (300)** \$ 1,216,238
Network Infrastructure Integration

The Department of Natural Resources (DNR) is requesting funding for network infrastructure integration at 73 buildings across the State. The existing infrastructure is beyond its useful life with some equipment reaching 60 years old. To modernize these facilities and secure stable connection, this project will include over 219,000 feet of fiber-optic cabling. DNR has previously modernized 41 sites, and this phase will expand the agency wide initiative.

7. **Maumee River Basin Commission (325)** \$ 318,325
Allen County Stream Studies

The Maumee River Basin Commission (MRBC) is requesting funding for Allen County stream studies. The Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs) for eastern Allen County have not been updated in over twenty years. MRBC will work with Allen County to perform a Detailed Hydrologic and Hydraulic Modeling, which will be submitted to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) as a Letter of Map Change (LOMC). Corrected floodplain mapping will allow property owners to pursue improvements and land developers to move forward with County-approved projects.

8. **Department of Homeland Security (385)** \$ 1,675,484
DHS & OEC Tower Rehabilitation Projects

The Indiana Department of Homeland Security (IDHS), working with the Office of Emergency Communications (OEC), is requesting funding for a series of rehabilitation projects across the state. The funds will support replacing five HVAC units, repairing roofs at two sites, upgrading tower lighting, purchasing sixteen radio service monitors, replacing five generators, and completing other necessary projects as facilities reach the end of their service life.

9. **Department of Homeland Security (385)** \$ 450,000
Alternate Emergency Operations Center (EOC) Training Room

The Indiana Department of Homeland Security (IDHS) is requesting funding for the completion of training room facilities at the Five Points logistics facility in Indianapolis. The existing 16,000 square foot warehouse will house the 4,000 square feet of space that is to be completed. This project includes the construction of offices, classrooms, and restroom facilities.

10. **Evansville Psychiatric Children’s Center (415)** \$ 832,000
Roof Replacement

The Evansville Psychiatric Children’s Center (EPCC) is requesting funding for the replacement of the 58-year-old roof. The roof, original to the building’s 1968 construction, is 38,500 square feet and is showing significant signs of deterioration including water infiltration, patchwork cracking, and ceiling damage. This project will also include removal of skylights and new roofing in their place to prevent further water infiltration. The new roof will have an expected life of 30 years.

11. **Logansport State Hospital (435)** \$ 1,925,000
Larson Treatment Center Rehabilitation

Logansport State Hospital (LSH) is requesting funding to replace the drywall, ceilings, and flooring on two wards at the Larson Treatment Center at LSH. The original 110,000 square foot structure was not designed to house the current patients that are there, and the existing walls need to be reinforced to prevent damage. This process is done by replacing the wall with more durable material. In addition to the wall, new flooring and ceilings will be installed to accommodate psychiatric patients. This funding will cover the remaining two wards, as the other two have already been repaired.

12. **Logansport State Hospital (435)** \$ 900,000
Water Tower Rehabilitation

Logansport State Hospital (LSH) is requesting funding to perform maintenance on the existing 500,000-gallon water tower, which was constructed in 1968. The project will include cleaning, structural rehabilitation, contamination prevention, handrail installation, and airplane light installation. This tower serves as the primary water source for the facility and will continue operation for the life of the facility.

III. **University Projects**

1. **Indiana University (750)** \$ 59,850,000
IU Bloomington Willkie Quad Recapitalization
A-1-26-2-02

The Indiana University Board of Trustees request approval to proceed in renovating the Willkie Quadrangle on the Bloomington Campus. This project will renovate Willkie Quad Buildings A, B, and C on the IU Bloomington campus, totaling approximately 325,344 gross square feet, inclusive of 742 rooms and 752 beds. The scope of work includes full renovation of student rooms and renewal of elevators, roofs, stair towers, and necessary infrastructure upgrades of the mechanical, electrical, plumbing, and life safety systems. Existing public spaces and amenities will be refreshed alongside accessibility improvements, audio/video, and access control and security systems upgrades as required. This project addresses the University's growing need for updated housing on the Bloomington campus. Renovations will replace aging and failing critical infrastructure within the complex, including much-needed addition of outside fresh air to student rooms. Newer, more energy efficient systems will be installed.

2. **Purdue University (760)** \$ 3,550,000
Armory First Floor Mechanical System Replacement and Classroom Renovations
B-1-26-2-14

The Purdue University Board of Trustees request approval to proceed in renovating the first floor of the Armory. This project will install new mechanical and supporting equipment to serve the Armory's two classrooms and offices in the headhouse on the first floor of the building. The classrooms will receive new projection equipment, flooring and furniture as part of this project. The current mechanical equipment serving the headhouse is past its useful life and no longer meets the needs of the areas it serves. It is not performing well due to age, and unplanned maintenance causes user and occupant disruptions. The new mechanical equipment will be more reliable, low maintenance and more energy efficient.

3. **Vincennes University (790)** \$ 23,000,000
Godare Hall
E-1-26-2-03

The Vincennes University Board of Trustees requests approval to proceed with the renovation of Marie Elizabeth Godare Hall into a modern, suite-style residential facility designed to support workforce development, apprenticeship training, and future traditional student housing needs. The project will create 134 private residential units featuring private bathrooms, kitchenettes, and laundry facilities on each floor, along with enhanced student amenities including fitness, media, recreation, study, and lounge spaces. The renovation will modernize an aging residential facility while improving student comfort, engagement, and overall campus experience. The project also supports the University's strategic enrollment and workforce development goals by providing high-quality residential accommodations aligned with the expectations of students, employers and industry partners. This investment continues the University's commitment to providing affordable, modern, and competitive campus housing.

4. **Vincennes University (790)** \$ 12,000,000
Vanderburgh Hall
E-1-26-2-04

The Vincennes University Board of Trustees requests approval to proceed with the renovation of the Henry and Francois Vanderburgh Residence Hall, a 113,161 gross square foot student housing facility constructed in 1990 that currently houses 432 students. The project will modernize the residence hall through restroom renovations, upgraded plumbing and LED lighting, updated finishes, and the addition of modern student amenities including study spaces, lounges, recreation areas, kitchen facilities, and laundry areas. The renovation will extend the useful life of the facility while providing students with a safe, modern, and competitive residential environment. This strategic reinvestment supports the University's long-term commitment to affordable, high-quality campus housing and student success.
