INDEPENDENT ACCOUNTANT'S REPORT

TO: THE OFFICIALS OF THE WASHINGTON COUNTY SOIL AND WATER
CONSERVATION DISTRICT, WASHINGTON COUNTY, INDIANA

We have examined the schedules of receipts, disbursements, and cash and investment balances of the Washington County Soil and Water Conservation District (District), for the period of January 1, 2004 to December 31, 2005. In our opinion, the schedules referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the cash transactions of the District for the years ended December 31, 2004 and 2005, based on the criteria set forth in the uniform compliance guidelines established by the Indiana State Board of Accounts.

NOTES TO SCHEDULES

Note 1. Introduction

The Soil and Water Conservation District was established under the laws of the State of Indiana. The District operates under a Board of Supervisors form of government and provides soil and water conservation services.

Note 2. Fund Accounting

The District uses funds to report on its cash and investments and the results of its operations on a cash basis. Fund accounting is designed to demonstrate legal compliance and to aid financial management by segregating transactions related to certain governmental functions or activities.

Note 3. Deposits and Investments

Deposits, made in accordance with Indiana Code 5-13, with financial institutions in the State of Indiana at year end were entirely insured by the Federal Depository Insurance Corporation or by the Indiana Public Deposit Insurance Fund. This includes any deposit accounts issued or offered by a qualifying financial institution.

State statute (IC 5-13-9) authorizes the District to invest in securities including, but not limited to, federal government securities, repurchase agreements, and certain money market mutual funds. Certain other statutory restrictions apply to all investments made by local governmental units.
