**Report on the Financial Statements**

Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. In our opinion, the information is fairly stated, in all material respects, in relation to the financial statements as a whole.

### ***Other Reporting Required by Government Auditing Standards***

### NOTE A. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### (1) Organization and Nature of Operations

Floyds Knobs Water Company, Inc. (the "Company") is regulated by the Utility Regulatory Commission of the State of Indiana as a Class B Not-for-Profit Water Utility. The records of the Company are maintained in accordance with the Uniform System of Accounts as prescribed by the National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners. Account names and statement format are also prescribed by this Commission and do not, therefore, necessarily agree with the terms and formats used by many non-profit organizations. The Company operates a water distribution system, which provides water to over 2,263 customers in Floyd County.

#### (2) Income Taxes

The Company has been granted an exemption from federal income taxes under Section 501(c)(12) of the Internal Revenue Code. The Company has also been granted exemption from Indiana Gross Receipts Tax under Indiana Code 6-2.1-3-33. Accordingly, no provision has been made for income taxes in the financial statements.

#### (3) Utility Plant

Utility Plant assets are recorded at cost. Expenditures which do not materially extend the useful life of or expand the "system" are charged to supplies expense when incurred. Depreciation is computed using the straight-line method. Estimated useful lives range from 10 to 77 years for utility plant in service and 3 to 10 years for equipment, office furniture and leasehold improvements. Depreciation is taken using the half-year convention for the year of acquisition.

#### (4) Cash and Cash Equivalents

For financial statement purposes, the Company considers unrestricted cash on deposit with financial institutions and investments with original maturities of three months or less to be cash and cash equivalents.

#### (5) Membership Fees

Each new customer of the water utility is charged a membership fee of \$100. These are not refundable and therefore are included in the equity of the Company.

#### (6) Contributions-in-Aid of Construction

This account represents a portion of the capital of the Company. The credits to this account cannot be transferred to any other account without the approval of the Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission.

Members are required to pay a tap-in fee of \$625 for a standard 3/4" meter when they are connected to the water system. The tap fee for larger meters is actual cost. The tap fee is assessed to cover the cost of the meter, meter installation and the service connecting the meter and the distribution main. All water lines and attachments thereto are the property and responsibility of the Company.

SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

(7) Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

(8) Accounts Receivable/Revenue

The Company sends bills to customers at the beginning of each month for water used during the previous month and accrues that billing as of the end of the usage month. Revenue is therefore recognized in the month the water is used by the customers. Receivables are considered past due on the 19th day of the month.

(9) Uncollectible Accounts

Accounts Receivable are considered past due when payment is not received by the due date listed on the customer's bill. The Company uses the allowance method of accounting for bad debts. Accounts written off are charged against the allowance account. An allowance for doubtful accounts is recorded based on a combination of write-off history, aging analysis and any specific known troubled accounts. The allowance is adjusted when appropriate to reflect the accounts believed to be uncollectible.

(10) Inventory

Inventory is recorded at cost on the first-in, first-out basis. It consists of materials to be used in future repairs or additions to Utility Plant.

(11) Sales Tax

The Company collects sales tax on all of its sales to nonexempt customers and remits the entire amount to the state. The net method of recording the collection and remittance of sales tax is reflected in the financial statements.

NOTE D. NOTES PAYABLE

On February 25, 2015, the Company issued Secured Notes, Series 2015A in the amount of \$3,280,000 and Secured Notes, Series 2015B in the amount of \$1,420,000. The Notes were purchased by the Indiana Finance Authority and financed through the State of Indiana Drinking Water State Revolving Fund loan program.

Series 2015A Notes were issued for the purpose of funding a capital improvements project. The notes mature July 1, 2036, and provide for a 2.0% interest rate with principal and interest payments due on January 1 and July 1. During the construction period, the Company will make interest-only payments. In accordance with the Financial Assistance Agreement, the first payment began on July 1, 2015.

Series 2015B Notes were issued for the purpose of funding the second phase of a capital improvements project. The notes mature July 1, 2036, and provide for a 2.85% interest rate with principal and interest payments due on January 1 and July 1. During the construction period, the Company will make interest-only payments. As of December 31, 2015, no funds have been advanced on the 2015B notes.

At December 31, 2015 the Utility had \$2,213,754 remaining to draw on these notes.

The notes are equally secured by a mortgage on all real and personal property and any accounts receivable and revenues arising from operations.

### NOTE E. RESTRICTED CASH

The Series 2015 Note Trust Indenture requires the Company to maintain certain accounts with a trustee. The debt service account is to be funded on a monthly basis and is restricted for the purpose of paying the required semi-annual payments for the Series 2015 Notes. The debt service reserve account consists of the required reserve for the 2015 Series A Notes and is funded on a monthly basis.

In November 2014, the Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission required \$35,000 each year to be set aside for tank painting and maintenance. These funds are held in the Tank Reserve Account.

### NOTE F. ECONOMIC DEPENDENCY

Floyds Knobs Water Company, Inc. purchased approximately 97% of the water it sold from Ramsey Water Company. If for some reason Ramsey Water Company could not supply water to the Company, an alternate source of supply would have to be located. The Company purchases approximately 3% of its water from Borden Tri County Water System, a potential source of increased supply if needed.

Past efforts on the part of Floyds Knobs Water Company, Inc. to establish an alternate supply source have been unsuccessful. Certain federal legislation, arguably, precludes the Company from purchasing from another supplier so long as Ramsey Water Company is paying off any federally funded loans serving as a source of capital for its system. The practical reality at the present time is that, so long as Ramsey Water Company can supply sufficient water for Floyds Knobs Water Company, Inc.'s needs, the Company will be obligated to pay Ramsey Water Company's rates.

NOTE G. CONCENTRATION OF CREDIT RISK

The Company maintains its cash at federally insured financial institutions. At times, such balances may be in excess of the FDIC insurance limit. As of December 31, 2015, the amount in excess of this limit was \$94,582.

Due to the nature of the Company's business, its customers are all in a concentrated geographic area. The Company is, therefore, subjected to a concentration of credit risk with respect to its receivables that are solely from these customers.

NOTE H. EMPLOYEE RETIREMENT PLAN

Floyds Knobs Water Company, Inc. has a defined-contribution money purchase pension plan for employees. To qualify for the plan, the employee must be at least 21 years of age and have 36 months of service. Benefits are based solely on total contributions; therefore, there is no unfunded pension liability for prior service. The Company contributed 5% of each qualified employee's gross salary during 2015. The provisions for pension costs for 2015 and 2014 were \$5,142 and \$4,835, respectively.

NOTE I. LEASES

The Company entered into a 5-year lease agreement for office space which expired on September 30, 2008. The lease called for a monthly maintenance fee of \$34, fixed for the term of the lease, and monthly rent of \$659, with a 2% increase each year. The Company has continued to occupy the space without a written extension of the lease. The Company has been advised by counsel that, under these circumstances, the Company is occupying the premises on a year-by-year basis, with all other terms and conditions as in the originally written lease. Lease payments totaled \$10,355 and \$10,155 in 2015 and 2014, respectively.

NOTE J. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Management has evaluated subsequent events through April 25, 2016, the date on which the financial statements were available to be issued.

SUMMARY OF AUDITOR'S RESULTS

A significant deficiency relating to the audit of the financial statements was reported in the Independent Auditor's Report on Internal Control Over Financial Reporting and on Compliance and Other Matters Based on an Audit of Financial Statements Performed in Accordance with *Government Auditing Standards*. No material weaknesses were reported.
3. No instances of noncompliance material to the financial statements of Floyds Knobs Water Company, Inc., which would be required to be reported in accordance with *Government Auditing Standards*, were disclosed during the audit.
4. No significant deficiencies, or material weaknesses, relating to the audit of the major federal award program were reported in the Independent Auditor's Report on Compliance for Each Major Program and on Internal Control over Compliance Required by Uniform Guidance.
5. The auditor's report on compliance for the major federal award program for FloydsKnobs Water Company, Inc. expresses an unqualified opinion on the major federal program.
6. There were no audit findings that are required to be reported in accordance with 2 CFR 200.516(a).
7. The program tested as a major program was CFDA #66.468, Capitalization Grants for Drinking Water State Revolving Funds.
8. The threshold used for distinguishing between Type A and B programs was \$750,000.

FINDINGS - FINANCIAL STATEMENT AUDIT

2015-1

Significant Deficiency

Condition: The financial reporting system does not provide for the internal preparation of financial statements and the related footnote disclosures.

Cause There was no one on staff with sufficient knowledge to prepare financial statements and the related footnote disclosures in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles.

Criteria: A key element of financial reporting is the ability to select and apply the appropriate accounting principles to prepare financial statements in accordance with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles.

Effect: This key element of financial reporting is lacking, resulting in management not having the ability to produce the financial statements and related footnote disclosures.

Recommendation: The outsourcing of this service is not unusual in companies of this size, and is a result of management's cost benefit decision to outsource this service, rather than incur internal resource costs. However, at a minimum, on an annual basis, board members should review the cost benefit of adding additional staff with the appropriate knowledge, skills, and abilities to prepare financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles, to further enhance internal control over financial reporting.

Response: Management will continue to review the cost benefit of adding additional staff, but does not anticipate any changes to this process.
