

Vast majority of money collected goes straight to families!

- We serve 1.1 million people
- 304,000 children, with an average age of 16
- 4 in 5 single parent Hoosier households are part of the IV-D program





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Title IV-D Program

Title IV-D of the Social Security Act is:

- A federally funded grant program
- Title IV-D = Title IV-D of the Social Security Act
- A condition of states receiving federal TANF/block grant funds
- TANF Program = Title IV-A of the Social Security Act



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Indiana's IV-D Program

Federally Required IV-D Services:

 Locate, Establishment, Enforcement, Payment Processing, Distribution, Disbursement

Non-IV-D services:

· Payment Processing, Distribution, Disbursement

Federally Required Statewide Automated System

- ISETS through May 31, 2023
- INvest pilot begins January 3, 2023



About \$800 million in child support processes through ISETS every year

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Background

Clerks are Key Partners

- Build NIVD cases and update ISETS (court orders, addresses) to process payments correctly and keep undistributed collections low
- Process cash payments per IC 31-25-3-1; 31-25-4-24; 31-14-11-11; 31-16-9-1
 - Direct other payors to the federally mandated "SDU" or central collection site (Indiana State Central Collection Unit – INSCCU) or to State credit/debit card website, if paying by credit/debit card http://childsupportbillpay.com/Indiana
- Work with Prosecuting Attorneys' IV-D offices



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Paradigm Shift for IV-D Program

The past:

- Focus on cost recovery
- Set orders high the higher the better collect what you can
- · Wait until arrears accumulate before enforcement
- Program was seen as representing the custodial party

Today:


- We focus on the best interest of the child
- We serve <u>both</u> parents
- Focus is on support to families, not government repayment
- Setting right-sized orders
- More holistic family-centered approach






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Funding

Two major funding streams

- Federal Financial Participation (FFP) at 66%
- Performance Based Incentives

FFP: Reimbursement

- Counties submit monthly expense claims for FFP
- DCS draws down federal grant and reimburses county



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Incentives

State and counties receive incentives based on performance.

- Must only be spent on IV-D
- Must supplement, not supplant
- Must be tracked by Auditor in separate funds
- Indiana FFY2020 Incentives: \$12,476,387



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Incentives

Incentives earned by performance on an overall "collections base" and on these measures:

- Paternity Establishment
- Support Order Establishment
- Current Support Paid
- Cases Paying on Arrears
- Cost Effectiveness



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Incentives

State statute IC 31-25-4-23 splits money:

- 33.4% Prosecuting Attorney (Fund 8897)
- 22.2% Clerk (Fund 8899)
- 22.2% Title IV-D Incentive Fund (Fund 8895)
- 22.2% State CSB



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
