Projects in the Making

Eighth grade industrial arts students have a survey course including woods, drafting, power, electricity, metals, and plastics, after which they decide which specific courses they will pursue at the advanced level in high school.

Probably the most important emphasis of the department is that emphasis on self-reliance and ingenuity. In his project work, each student must create not only a project, but also the machinery with which to build his particular project.

Agriculture classes provide experiences in judging crops, soil, and livestock; marketing, surveying, farm carpentry, and farm machines. Each boy also conducts his own projects at home in animal care and crops. One of the most noticeable features of this program is the experimental crop plot, used to demonstrate the effectiveness of various fertilizers and crop care procedures.

Highlighting the year's activities is the annual Parent-Son Banquet when the Star Greenhand and the Star Chapter Farmer are announced.

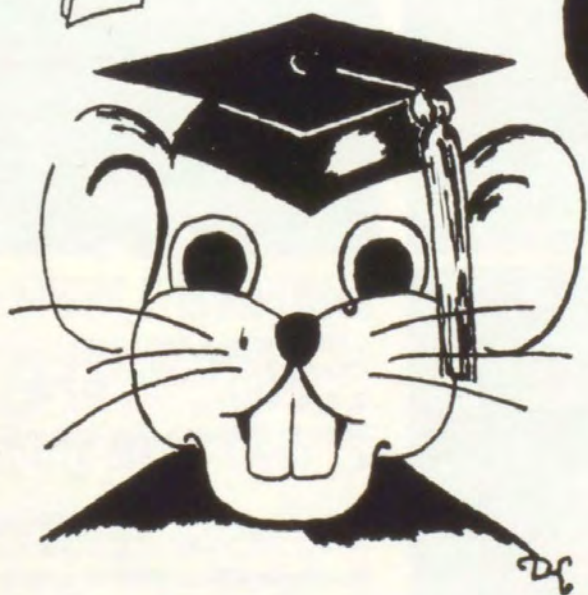
Behind the Scenes

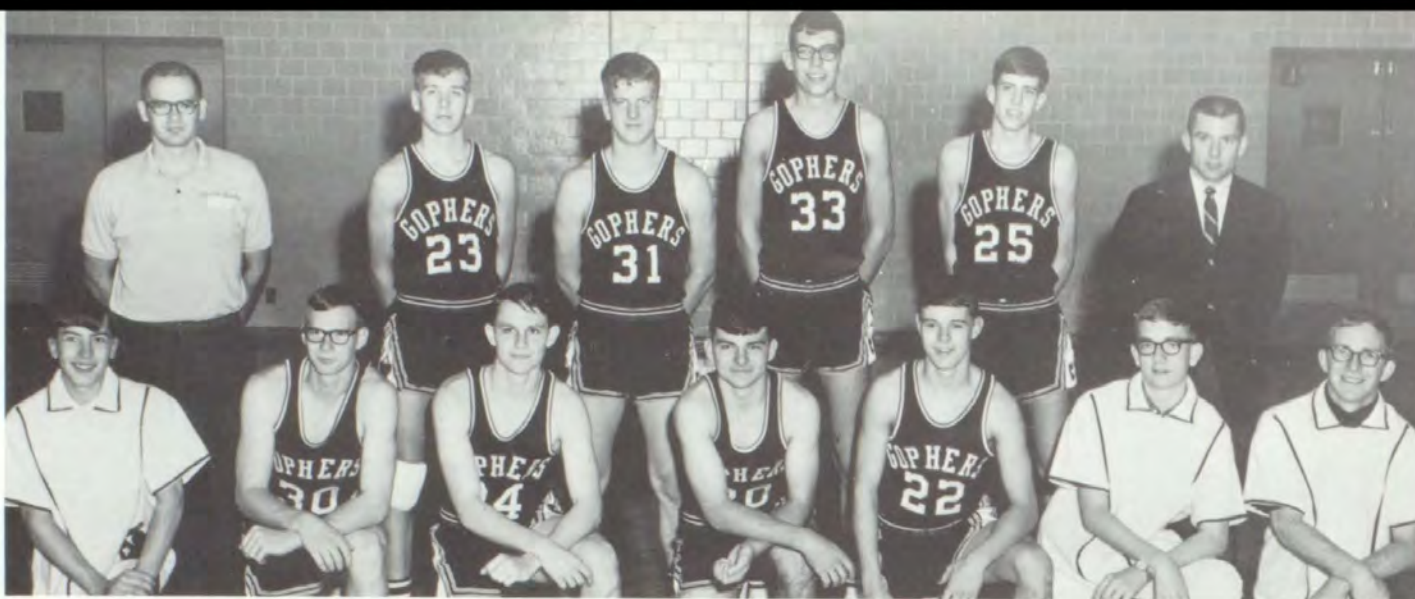
