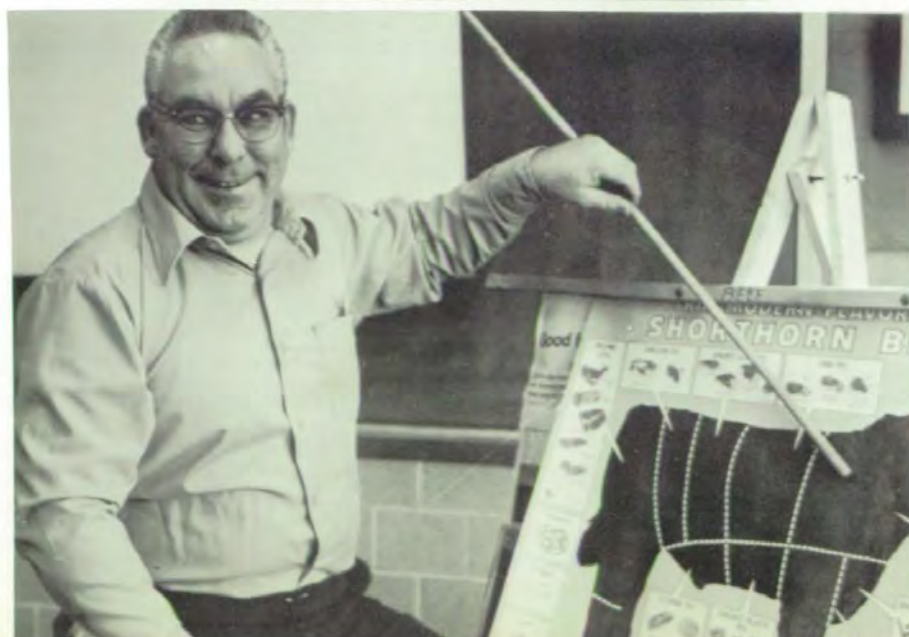
Music

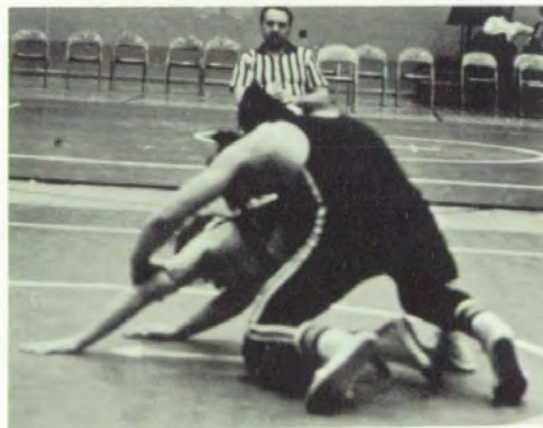

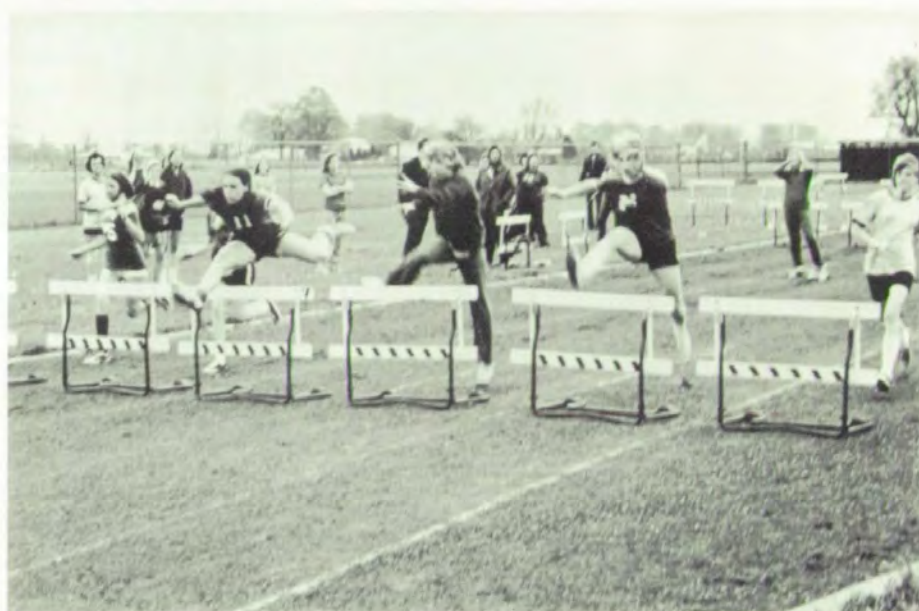
