Chris Fassnacht, 9th grade, was looking forward to starting communication and technology classes.



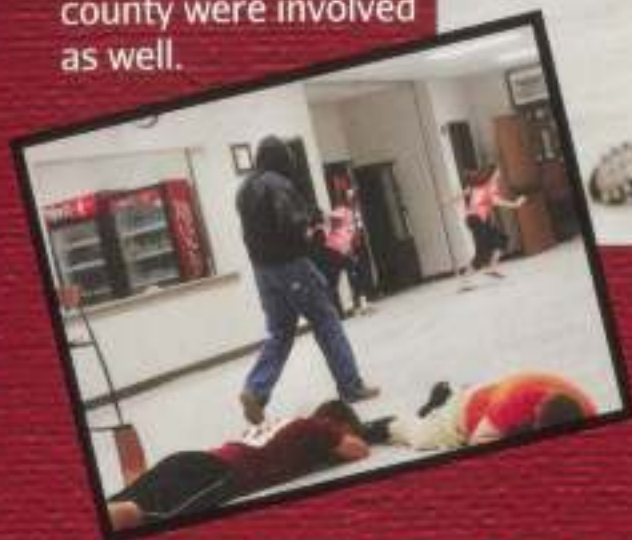

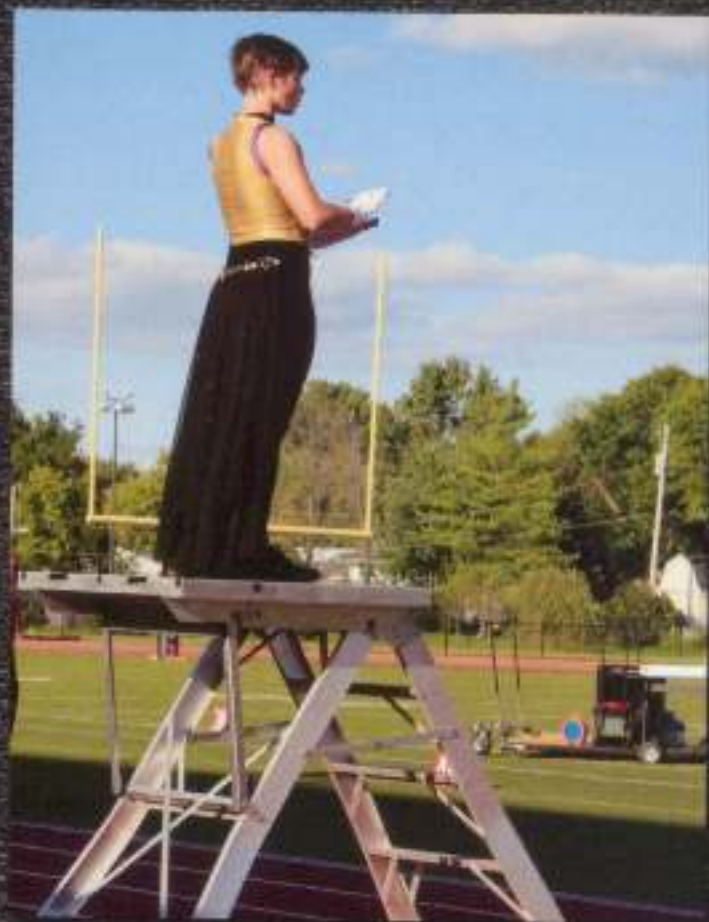

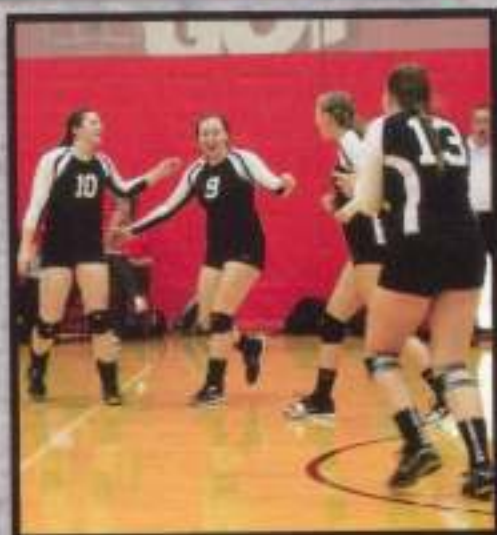
