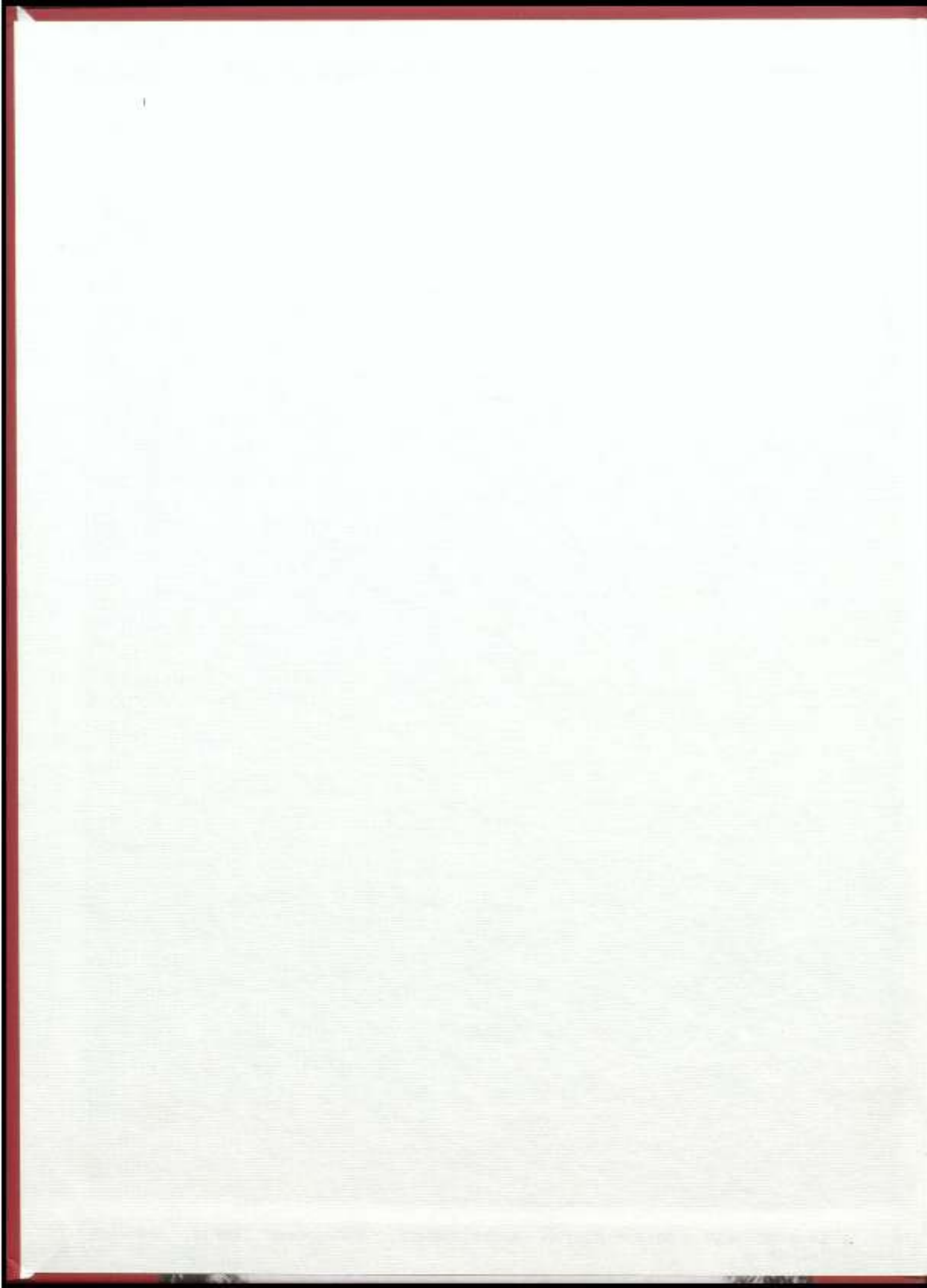
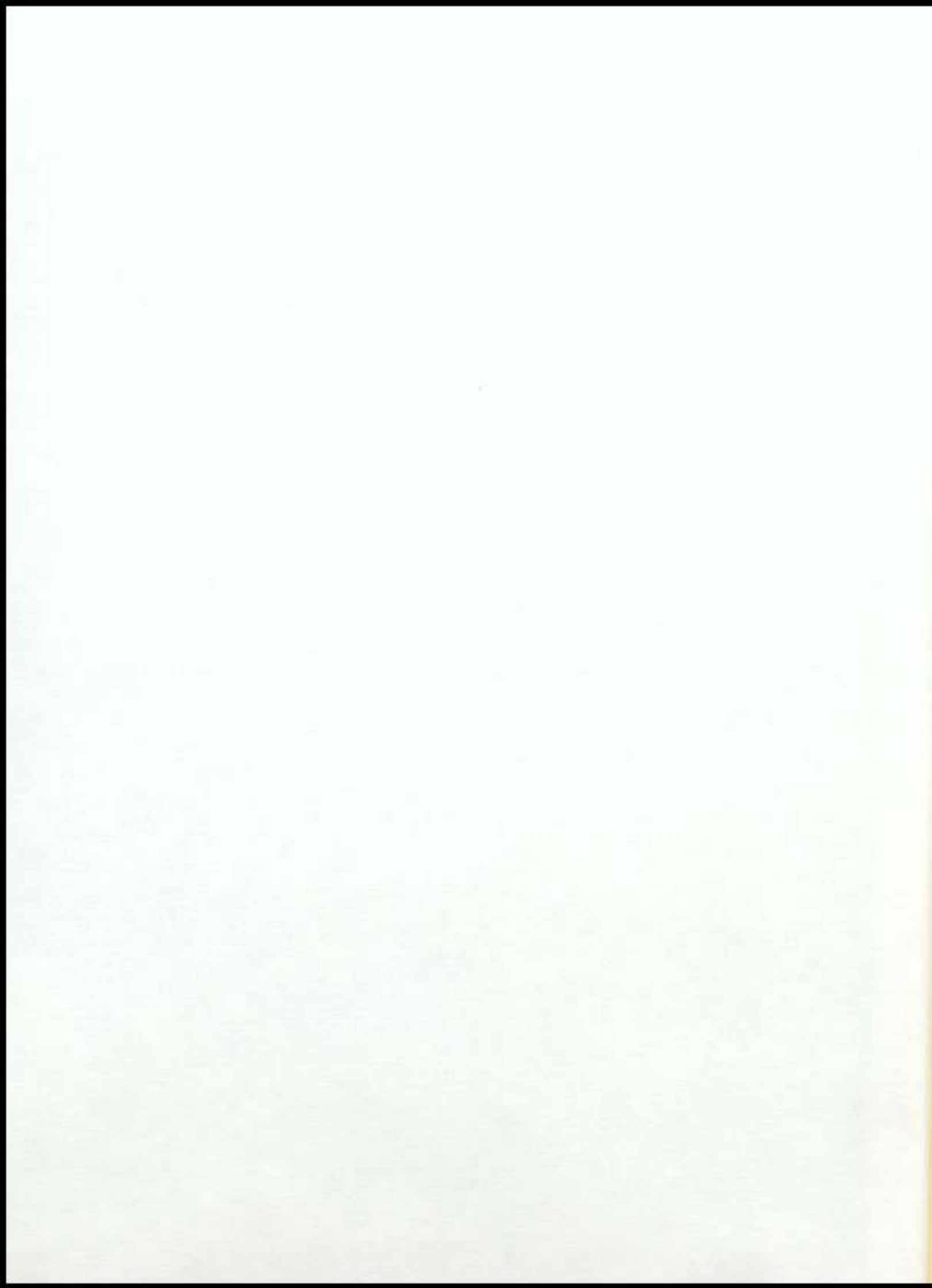

PHAROAH CROWNED

American Pharoah, an American Thoroughbred racehorse, became the first horse in history to win the "Grand Slam"—the American Triple Crown and the Breeder's Cup Classic in June 2015.



MATHLETES

The United States won the International Math Olympiad, held in July in Thailand. High school students from more than 100 countries took part in the 12-day event. The U.S. team earned a total of 185 points. China was second with 181 points.



SPACE INVADER

On July 14, 2015—nine years after its launch—NASA's New Horizons probe got closer to Pluto than anyone ever has during a six-month flyby study of the dwarf planet and its moons.



SQUAD GOALS

More than 22 million Americans tuned in to watch the U.S. Women's Soccer Team win their third World Cup title in July. It was the largest TV audience for soccer—men or women—in U.S. history.



After 33 years as a late night host, David Letterman retired from *The Late Show* with David Letterman on CBS. In September, the iconic seat was filled by comedy favorite Stephen Colbert.



#THROWBACK

Anthropologists in South Africa uncovered a series of 1,550 fossils belonging to a previously unknown species dubbed *Homo naledi*. The fossils were from as many as 15 individuals with both human and ape-like features.



Yogi Berra, the ten-time World Series winning catcher for the New York Yankees, passed away in September at 90 years old.



Adele's much-anticipated third album, *25*, was released in November. The first single, "Hello," became the first song to sell over one million downloads in its first week, and *25* shattered the record for most albums sold in a week at 3.38 million copies.



ROYAL TREATMENT

The Kansas City Royals defeated the New York Mets to win baseball's World Series for the second time. The Royals were runners up the year before.



PAPAL VISIT

Pope Francis made his inaugural trip to the United States in September. During his visit, he made an historic address to Congress and spent time with President Obama before returning to the Vatican.

FEEL THE BURN

Records show 2015 was the Earth's hottest year in recorded history. The previous record was set in 2014, another indication that the planet is heating up.



Clash of Clans was the top grossing iPhone game app of 2015. *Game of War: Fire Age* and *Candy Crush Saga* held the second and third spots.



MAYHEM FOR MINIONS

The fan-favorite yellow creatures from Disney's *Despicable Me* films got a chance to shine when *Minions* premiered in July. The world was overcome with Minions fever, with the creatures being featured on everything from clothing to Happy Meals.



A record \$1.6 billion Powerball lottery prize was shared by three winners in January. Before taxes, each winner received \$533 million.

YEAR OF SWIFT

Taylor Swift spent 2015 on The 1989 World Tour promoting her wildly successful album of the same name. She set the record for highest grossing tour of the year at \$250 million in revenue, and in February, 1989 won the Grammy for Album of the Year.



ORANGE CRUSH

The Denver Broncos defeated the Carolina Panthers, 24-10, during Super Bowl 50 in Santa Clara, California. It was the third Super Bowl win for the Broncos, and Denver linebacker Von Miller was named MVP. Less than a month later, Denver quarterback Peyton Manning announced his retirement. This was Manning's fourth Super Bowl in his 18-year NFL career.



DEATH OF A STAR

Rock legend David Bowie released his final studio album, *Blackstar*, in January, just two days before dying of cancer at the age of 69. He had been diagnosed 18 months earlier but continued to work and did not make his illness public.



GOLDEN BOY

In March, Stephen Curry of the Golden State Warriors scored a career-high 41 points against the Orlando Magic and became the first NBA player to make 300 three-pointers in a single season. He is considered by many to be the greatest shooter in NBA history.



SMART(ER) CAR

Self-driving cars got closer to becoming reality when, in June, Google tested their latest prototype self-driving car in California, and six months later Ford announced it was the first company to test the cars in the snow.



#TRENDINGNOW

Everyone's favorite boy band continued to rule the Twitterverse. #OneDirection was the most popular hashtag of 2015, and all of the band members made the list of top ten most retweeted tweets of the year.



The sudden and unexpected death of Supreme Court Justice Antonin

Scalia in February set off an immediate debate about whether President Barack Obama should fill the seat in an election year. Scalia, 79, was widely known as the anchor of the Court's conservative wing.



SEEKING REFUGE

Tens of thousands of people fled war-torn Syria to Europe and Canada in hopes of finding asylum. The influx of refugee families prompted international disputes and policy shifts as many countries closed their borders.

By March, caucuses and primaries for the 58th U.S. presidential election narrowed the field from 17 Republicans and three Democrats to five viable major party candidates: Hillary Clinton (D), Ted Cruz (R), John Kasich (R), Bernie Sanders (D), and Donald Trump (R).



To promote rap biopic "Straight Outta Compton," Beats by Dre took the Internet by storm by releasing a meme generator that let people create their own "Straight Outta" meme. The movie was nominated for two Academy Awards for Best Writing and Original Screenplay and a Screen Actors Guild Award for Outstanding Performance by a Cast in a Motion Picture.



In December, *Star Wars: The Force Awakens* was released, selling more than \$100 million in advance tickets. It broke the record for the highest-grossing worldwide opening of all time.



Sports Illustrated Kids named 15-year-old Reece Whitley as its SportsKid of the Year. His times in the 100- and 200-meter breaststroke qualified him to compete at the 2016 Olympic Trials in June.

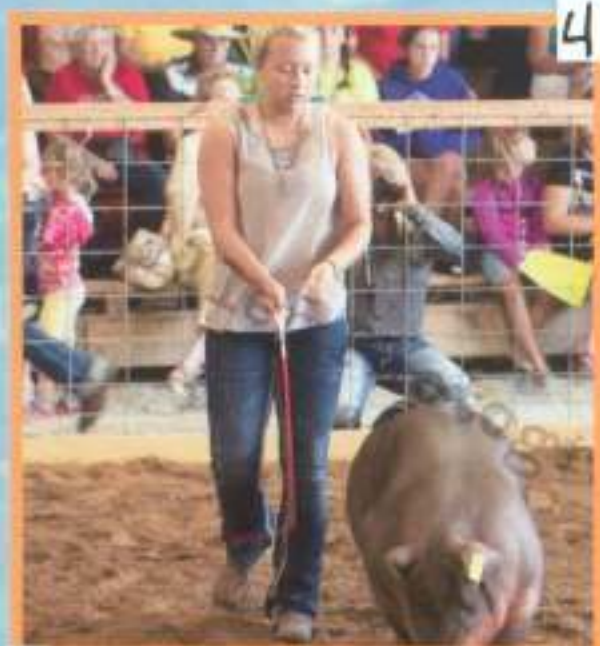

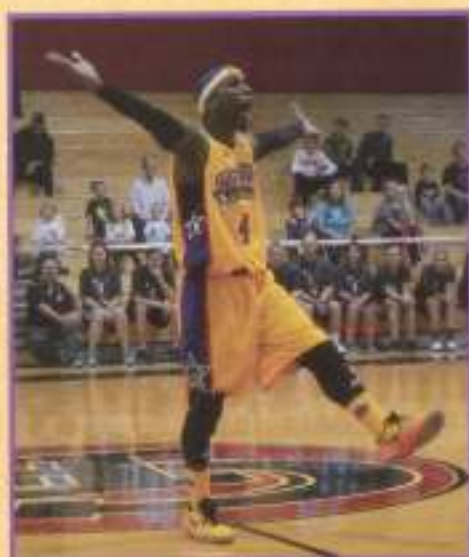

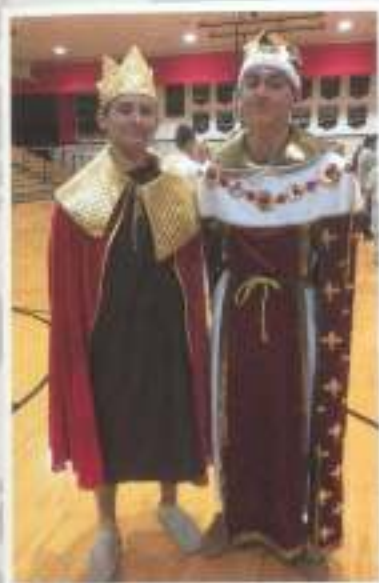
SHAKESPEARE
