MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE STATE EMPLOYEES' APPEALS COMMISSION May 12, 2022

The regular meeting of the State Employees' Appeals Commission was held on May 12, 2022, at 10:00 A.M. EST, in person in Indiana Government Center South Conference Center Room D. The Chair of the Commission, Frank Sullivan, Jr., called the Commission to order at 10:00A.M. EDT. The following three Commissioners were present and constituted a quorum.

- 3. Chief Administrative Law Judge ("ALJ"), Erin M. McQueen reported on the metrics for the first quarter of 2022. Seven (7) new cases were received during the first quarter of the year. Four (4) of those cases were dismissed for lack of jurisdiction. As of the end of the first quarter of 2022, SEAC currently had sixteen (16) cases pending at various stages of proceedings.
- 4. The case of *Outlaw v. DCS*, SEAC No. 04-20-028, was heard by oral argument on Petitioner's timely objections and Respondent's response. Former Chief ALJ Gabriel Paul entered judgment in favor of Respondent, DCS in his Non-Final Order. Petitioner appeared by counsel, Mr. Shaw Friedman. Respondent appeared by counsel, Ms. Whitney Fritz. Both parties provided oral argument on their respective positions. Following public deliberation, the Commission REVERSED the Non-Final Order by a vote of 3-0 finding that there was not a preponderance of evidence to find just cause for the termination of Mr. Outlaw, a former classified employee.
- 5. A discussion was then held concerning the next Commission meeting date. It was proposed by the Chief ALJ that the next meeting be held in September. September 27, 2022 was set as the next Commission date, with the presumption that it will be in person.
- 6. Seeing no further new business, Chair Sullivan closed the meeting at 11:06 A.M. with the next meeting set for September 27, 2022 at 10 A.M. in location TBD.
