# **PURPOSE OF NOTICE**

The Secretary of State – Business Services Division (division) is soliciting public comment on adding rules at <u>75 IAC 8</u> concerning fees collected for business services and the reasons for rejecting business entity filings filed with the division, as required by House Enrolled Act 1623-2023 (HEA 1623). #### **OVERVIEW**

# **Basic Purpose and Background**

Under the directives of HEA 1623, the division is promulgating rules that specify the enhanced access (EA) fees authorized by IC 4-5-10-2 for business entity related services and the reasons the division may reject a business entity filing. This rulemaking establishes in rule the exact EA fees already being collected by the division for online business entity filings, as well as documenting the existing reasons the division may reject a business entity filing. These are not new fees nor new rejection reasons but are simply the promulgation in rule of already established existing fees and rejection reasons. The rulemaking also includes the existing procedures for restricting online filing access to illegitimate users, such as those that pay for entity filings with stolen credit cards. As no changes in fees or rejection reasons are being made, no impact is expected for customers. Business entity filings are open to the public, and at the end of 2023, there were 658,059 active businesses registered with the division.

# **Rule 1. Definitions**

# 75 IAC 8-1-1 Applicability

Sec. 1. The definitions in this rule and <u>IC 23-0.5-1.5</u> apply throughout this article, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise.

# Rule 2. Filings

# **75 IAC 8-2-1** Access to electronic filing

Sec. 1. (a) Entity filings submitted electronically must be submitted through the secretary of state's website. Applicants must log in to the secretary of state's website through the Indiana office of technology's Access Indiana platform.

- (b) To protect the integrity of the electronic filing registry, the secretary of state may restrict a person or an account from submitting online filings if the secretary of state has identified any of the following:
  - (1) The person or account has violated cybersecurity policies established by the Indiana office of technology.
  - (2) The person or account has submitted invalid, false, or stolen payment information.
  - (3) The person or account has submitted unauthorized or deficient filings that resulted in an administrative dissolution, revocation, or removal of an entity or a record under IC 23-0.5-7-4.
  - (4) The person or account has submitted filings that are materially false or fraudulent.
- (c) A person restricted from filing online under subsection (b) may deliver filings to the secretary of state in person or by mail.

# **75 IAC 8-2-2** Information required to determine proper licensure or qualification of professional corporation or shareholders

- Sec. 2. (a) To enable the secretary of state to determine proper licensure or qualification of a professional corporation or its shareholders under <u>IC 23-1.5-2-9.1</u>, a professional corporation shall provide to the secretary of state the following information for at least one (1) shareholder licensed to render professional services described in <u>IC 23-1.5-2-3</u> when filing articles of incorporation, a foreign registration statement, or a biennial report:
  - (1) The name of the shareholder.
  - (2) The license number of the shareholder.
  - (3) The license type or profession of the shareholder.
  - (4) The shareholder's address.
- (b) The secretary of state may compare the information collected in subsection (a) to the records kept by a state agency issuing professional licenses, such as the Indiana professional licensing agency, or for an attorney professional corporation, the office of judicial administration, to determine if the shareholder holds an active license of the type that applies in Indiana.
  - (c) The information collected under subsection (a) may not be made part of the public filing history.

- (1) A filing that provides multiple concurrent registered agents.
- (2) A filing that provides an entity serves as its own registered agent.

- (2) A filing that does not provide the title of each individual to be listed as a governing person.
- (3) A filing that does not provide an address for each individual to be listed as a governing person.

- (3) A document not issued by the official having custody of business records in the entity's jurisdiction of formation.
- (4) A document that does not reflect the exact name of the filing entity.
- (b) A foreign entity must include a certificate of existence or similar document from its jurisdiction of formation when filling the following:
  - (1) An amendment that updates the name of the entity.
  - (2) A foreign registration statement.
  - (3) A reinstatement under IC 23-0.5-5-12.
