Page 14, line 15, replace "A. BROWN" with "R. KUZMAN".


Page 14, line 25, replace "COMMISSION MEMBERS" with "R. KUZMAN".

1 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** I'd like to -- as
2 Secretary of State, I'd like -- and Chair of the
3 Recount Commission, I'd like to call this
4 meeting to order, and we'll start with Agenda
5 Item No. 2 with the Pledge of Allegiance.

6 *(Pledge of Allegiance recited.)*

7 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** Thank you very much.
8 I'd like to move onto the next agenda item,
9 which is documentation of the meeting notice,
10 and I'll turn it over to the recount director to
11 verify that meeting notice was properly served.

12 **MR. B. SKOLNIK:** Thank you very much,
13 Mr. Chairman. The document has been -- the
14 notice was properly posed and served in
15 connection with this in a timely fashion. It's
16 my understanding it fully complied with the open
17 door laws of the State of Indiana so notice has
18 been properly posted in accordance with the
19 state law.

20 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** Okay, excellent. Then
21 I'll show for the minutes that the meeting
22 notice was properly served. Next item on the is
23 consideration of certain matters pending before
24 the recount commission, and as the commission
25 members would note, we had some outstanding

1 items on the recount of House District 76,
2 that's Owen versus McNamara. At this time I'd
3 like to turn it to the recount director so he
4 can explain for the record and for the
5 commission members the process they undertook
6 this week.

7 **MR. B. SKOLNIK:** Thank you, Mr. Chairman.
8 As members may recall at the meeting of the
9 recount commission held in -- this past Sunday
10 in Mount Vernon, basically the full recount had
11 been -- had been concluded, except for there
12 were a total of three votes which this
13 commission had deemed -- had voted -- had deemed
14 or determined were invalid.

15 The reason for that determination, as I
16 recall, was that the those were in-person
17 absentee voters who had failed to sign the
18 absentee ballot applications. Two of those
19 votes were in precinct -- at the Perry Precinct
20 No. 1 in Vanderburgh County and there was one
21 vote in Perry No. 6.

22 It was not possible at that meeting to
23 determine who those -- who those voters had cast
24 their ballots for, if anyone, in connection with
25 the House 76 District race. That could only be

1 accomplished by taking certain coding off of the
2 applications and having the technical support
3 staff in Vanderburgh County run new reports so
4 that those votes could then, in effect, be
5 eliminated from the count for the reason that
6 they were deemed to be invalid.

7 Per the direction of the commission, I
8 scheduled for yesterday morning at 10:30, or I'm
9 sorry, 9:30 Central Standard Time, the meeting
10 in Vanderburgh County -- not of this commission
11 but of myself and the technical support staff
12 who handles the -- who consults with and handles
13 the voting operations in Vanderburgh County. We
14 met yesterday at 9:30 a.m. Both candidates had
15 watchers available and were present at
16 that -- at that time.

17 The support -- I do want to state for the
18 record that the support, or the technical
19 support personnel who are present for
20 Vanderburgh County were Deb Olden (Phonetic)
21 from RBM. She's the project manager for the
22 electronic voting, or the electronic vendor,
23 voting machine vendor in Vanderburgh County.

24 Also, Timothy VanCleeve (Phonetic), the
25 executive IT director, for Vanderburgh County,

1 as well as their county election board were
2 present there and assisted us in running the
3 reports so we could get a new tally that would
4 reflect the three invalid votes.

5 They did that, and I'm prepared at this
6 time to report to the commission as to the
7 results of that report.

8 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** Okay, thank you.

9 **MR. B. SKOLNIK:** Before I do that, are
10 there any questions that anybody may have?

11 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** That's what I wanted
12 to ask, questions from commission members?

13 *(No response.)*

14 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** I see both parties are
15 represented by counsel here. Questions from
16 counsel?

17 **MR. D. BROOKS:** No.

18 **MR. A. BROWN:** No.

19 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** Mr. Skolnik.

20 **MR. B. SKOLNIK:** Thank you, Mr. Chairman.
21 The commission determined last Sunday that there
22 were two votes in Perry Township, Precinct No.
23 1, that were invalid. The ballots tallied by
24 the State Board of Accounts, as well as the
25 ballots returned by the county reflect that

1 prior to running these reports that there were
2 231 votes for Mr. Deig, 307 for Miss McNamara,
3 and 10 no votes.

4 When we ran the report that determined that
5 there were -- and the ballots -- I'm not going
6 to identify the names of the voters, but there
7 were certain coding on there or certain
8 identifying numbers on those ballots. They were
9 Ballots RB-27 and RB-38 in Precinct No. 1 in
10 Perry that were deemed to be invalid.

11 When the technical staff ran the reports,
12 it did not include those, those two ballots in
13 the vote total. The determination, or I should
14 say the tally reflected that there were 231
15 votes for Mr. Deig, 305 votes for Miss McNamara,
16 and 10 no votes.

17 Therefore, as a result of the invalidation
18 of those ballots, there were two less votes for
19 Miss McNamara in Perry Precinct No. 1. Are
20 there any questions? Have I explained that
21 clearly so that everybody understands that?

22 **COMMISSION MEMBER G. DURNIL:** Were the
23 attorneys for both sides there?

24 **MR. B. SKOLNIK:** There were watchers for
25 both sides actually present at the...

1 **COMMISSION MEMBER G. DURNIL:** Did you
2 actually see the code numbers on the application
3 and on the ballots?

4 **MR. B. SKOLNIK:** Yes, I did.

5 **COMMISSION MEMBER G. DURNIL:** Okay.

6 **MR. B. SKOLNIK:** And I worked with the -- I
7 made sure that the technical staff had the
8 appropriate...

9 **COMMISSION MEMBER G. DURNIL:** I would move
10 we make that tally final.

11 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** I'll second.
12 Discussion?

13 *(No response.)*

14 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** Hearing none, all in
15 favor of the new tally as reported by Recount
16 Director Skolnik, all in favor say aye?

17 **COMMISSION MEMBERS:** Aye.

18 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** Motion carries
19 unanimously.

20 **MR. B. SKOLNIK:** Just to clarify for the
21 record then, the tally, the vote total in Perry
22 Township, Precinct No. 1, in Vanderburgh
23 County reflects 231 votes for Mr. Deig, 305
24 votes for Miss McNamara, and 10 no votes.

25 The next precinct in which this commission

1 determined that there was an invalid ballot was
2 Perry Township, Precinct No. 6. There was one
3 vote in that township that the, or in that
4 precinct that the commission vote or deemed
5 invalid. It was identified as Ballot RB-208.

6 In precinct -- in Perry Township No. 6, the
7 vote totals as reflected both on the ballots
8 returned by the county as well as the ballots
9 tallied by the State Board of Accounts initially
10 indicated that Mr. Deig had 224 votes, Miss
11 McNamara 219 votes, and there were 8 no votes.

12 Applying the similar methodology that we
13 applied with regards to Perry Township, Precinct
14 No. 1, a report was then run in which the
15 invalid ballot RB-208 was not included in the
16 vote count.

17 When that report was generated, it
18 reflected that there were -- when that vote was
19 invalidated, the new vote total reflected 224
20 votes for Mr. Deig, 218 votes for Miss McNamara,
21 and 8 no votes. That report indicated that the
22 invalid, that when the invalid ballot was not
23 included, there was one less vote for Miss
24 McNamara. Are there any questions?

25 **COMMISSION MEMBER G. DURNIL:** Attorneys

1 have any questions?

2 (No response.)

3 **COMMISSION MEMBER G. DURNIL:** I move to
4 accept the tally, the new tally as final.

5 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** Second. Any
6 discussion?

7 (No response.)

8 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** Hearing none, all in
9 favor say aye?

10 **COMMISSION MEMBERS:** Commission members.

11 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** All opposed, same
12 sign?

13 (No response.)

14 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** None heard. The
15 motion carries unanimously.

16 **MR. B. SKOLNIK:** Again, to clarify for the
17 record, the vote total, the final vote total in
18 Perry Township, Precinct No. 6, 224 votes for
19 Mr. Deig, 218 for Miss McNamara, and 8 no votes.

20 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** Thank you, Director.
21 Anything else?

22 **COMMISSION MEMBERS:** The final tally?

23 **MR. B. SKOLNIK:** Mr. Chairman, it is my
24 under -- I'm sorry?

25 **COMMISSION MEMBERS:** The final tally?

1 **MR. B. SKOLNIK:** It is my understanding
2 that all votes have been counted and considered
3 by this commission and that there is no other
4 matters before the commission with reference to
5 the tally of the votes.

6 **COMMISSION MEMBER G. DURNIL:** What is the
7 final tally, the final vote count?

8 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** I'll recognize Mike
9 Rogina from the State Board of Accounts.

10 **MR. M. ROGINA:** Thank you, Mr. Chairman.
11 As you mentioned, the total for Mr. Deig is
12 9,369, and Miss McNamara 9,373 for a difference
13 of four.

14 **COMMISSION MEMBER G. DURNIL:** Shouldn't we
15 approve that final tally?

16 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** We can, yeah.

17 **MR. B. SKOLNIK:** It is my understanding,
18 and I will defer to counsel through the
19 commission, but it's my understanding, I
20 believe, that final tally should be approved and
21 the results and that this commission is then
22 required by law to certify those results to, I
23 believe, it's the Speaker of the House.

24 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** So I'd like to -- go
25 ahead, Brad.

1 **MR. B. KING:** Mr. Chairman, and members of
2 the commission, Director Skolnik had stated the
3 requirements of the law correctly. A
4 certificate of recount has been prepared for the
5 commission which certifies -- the final tally
6 indicates which candidate received the most
7 votes and by what plurality.

8 This will be filed with the Speaker of the
9 House and another copy will be transmitted to
10 the candidate and a third will be retained in
11 the records of the recount commission.

12 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** You're prepared to
13 have us sign those today?

14 **MR. B. KING:** Yes. I will insert the final
15 numbers as tallied and it will be ready for your
16 signature.

17 **COMMISSION MEMBER G. DURNIL:** You need the
18 chairman's signature, you just need the
19 chairman's signature?

20 **MR. B. KING:** Actually, I have all three
21 signature lines here.

22 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** Okay, we'll do that
23 right here for you right now.

24 **MR. B. KING:** Okay.

25 **COMMISSION MEMBERS:** So we don't need a

1 motion, we just sign the order?

2 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** Yeah, you don't want a
3 motion then?

4 **MR. B. KING:** Yes, Mr. Chairman, a motion
5 would be appropriate to approve the certificate.

6 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** Okay. Then I would
7 move to adopt the final tally as reported by the
8 recount director and the State Board of Accounts
9 and also move that we approve such a
10 certificate. Second?

11 **COMMISSION MEMBER G. DURNIL:** Second.

12 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** Discussion?

13 *(No response.)*

14 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:**

15 **MR. A. BROWN:** I don't have counsel so I'll
16 just -- I'll defer to the best of my ability
17 here.

18 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** Okay. All in favor of
19 that motion, signify by saying aye?

20 **COMMISSION MEMBERS:** Aye.

21 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** Aye. All opposed?

22 **COMMISSION MEMBER R. KUZMAN:** Aye.

23 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** Okay, motion carries 2
24 to 1 and we'll sign the certificate.

25 **COMMISSION MEMBERS:** I know there's a

1 conflict -- if I may?

2 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** Please. Go ahead.

3 **COMMISSION MEMBERS:** It will be noted 2 to
4 1 on here even though I sign it? That
5 doesn't -- I just want to...

6 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** Yes, the minutes will
7 reflect the vote.

8 **COMMISSION MEMBER R. KUZMAN:** Okay, thank
9 you. I'm sorry to ask that question but...

10 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** No problem.

11 **MR. B. SKOLNIK:** Mr. Chairman, while the
12 members of the commission are signing the
13 certificate, I would like to introduce into the
14 record as Exhibit A, the final tally of
15 ballots --

16 *(Whereupon, Exhibit A duly received,*
17 *marked, and made a part of the record.)*

18 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** Please, go ahead.

19 **MR. B. SKOLNIK:** -- that have been counted
20 by the recount commission in connection with
21 House District 76.

22 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** Question from Mr.
23 Kuzman.

24 **COMMISSION MEMBER R. KUZMAN:** I saw we had
25 three copies, so are you going to -- is there

1 going to be a fourth one sent to Mr. Deig?

2 **MR. B. KING:** There can be, certainly.

3 **COMMISSION MEMBER R. KUZMAN:** I think we
4 should probably -- just for his record, I think
5 we probably should, if you don't mind?

6 **MR. B. KING:** Not at all.

7 **COMMISSION MEMBER R. KUZMAN:** If you can
8 just photocopy one of them, it's okay with me,
9 but...

10 **MR. B. KING:** No problem at all.

11 **COMMISSION MEMBER R. KUZMAN:** Thank you,
12 just so he has them for his records.

13 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** Okay. I believe this
14 concludes the business in House District 76.
15 Moving on to the next agenda item, any other
16 additional matters for consideration before the
17 commission?

18 *(No response.)*

19 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** Hearing none, I
20 want --

21 **MR. B. SKOLNIK:** Mr. Chairman, I apologize,
22 excuse me for interrupting. The impoundment
23 orders remain in effect in the three counties
24 that comprise, or the portions of the three
25 counties that comprise House District 76.

1 As you can imagine, the clerks have
2 inquired as to whether this commission would be
3 willing to rescind those impoundment orders so
4 that the election boards can conclude their work
5 arising out of the November 2nd election.

6 If the commission or counsel have no
7 objection, I'm prepared to rescind those
8 impoundment orders, but I'd like to know if
9 there's any objection from either of the
10 parties?

11 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** Any objection?

12 **COMMISSION MEMBER G. DURNIL:** No objection.

13 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** Any objection?

14 *(No response.)*

15 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** No objection --
16 hearing none -- commission members, hearing no
17 objection, I move that we rescind all
18 impoundment orders.

19 **COMMISSION MEMBER R. KUZMAN:** Second.

20 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** All in favor, say aye?

21 **COMMISSION MEMBERS:** Aye.

22 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** Motion carries
23 unanimously. Thank you, Brad, anything else?

24 **MR. B. SKOLNIK:** The only other matter that
25 I can think of is I will be responsible for

1 making sure that the expenses of the recount are
2 properly submitted and paid by -- in connection
3 with the state recount fund. I will be in
4 contact with commission members as to --
5 regarding any expenses that they incur. In
6 addition, I submit my statement for services
7 rendered. I generally usually submit that to
8 the chair, since I can't really approve my own
9 expenses. As much as I'd like to, I don't
10 think...

11 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** Do we need a motion
12 from the three of use to approve all of the
13 expenses or can the chair do that or can we have
14 to motion for the chair to do it, or do you guys
15 want to -- do we have to move to approve such
16 things?

17 **COMMISSION MEMBER R. KUZMAN:** I move that
18 we just let the chair make that decision.

19 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** Okay.

20 **COMMISSION MEMBER G. DURNIL:** Second.

21 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** Second, all in favor,
22 say aye?

23 **COMMISSION MEMBERS:** Aye.

24 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** Motion carries
25 unaniously. That would prohibit us --

1 basically, we don't have to meet again, but do
2 send copies of everything.

3 **MR. B. SKOLNIK:** I will.

4 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** If the commission
5 members have a question about anything, they can
6 contact us and make those statements known and
7 questions known. I'd like to thank for purposes
8 of the record and for those in attendance,
9 formally thank the State Board of Accounts for,
10 again, their fine work.

11 Mr. Rogina, thanks. If you'll pass on our
12 thanks to the rest of the team, the State Board
13 of Police -- the State Police as well, including
14 the superintendent and Major Turner for all
15 their work and leadership as well -- I'd like
16 that reflected, and if we can have some letters
17 drawn up as well, that would be wonderful, to
18 professionally thank them, formally thank them.

19 And Brad, thank you for your service as
20 well, and the people of Indiana, on behalf of
21 them, I thank you as well. Am I missing
22 anyone -- State Board of Accounts, State Police,
23 of course, counsel both present and absent for
24 their service.

25 **MR. B. SKOLNIK:** I'd also like to recognize

1 and thank -- I know Mr. Brown is here, Mr.
2 Brooks just left, counsel for the parties, I
3 enjoyed the opportunity to work with them and
4 appreciated their professionalism.

5 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** Yeah, no bar fight
6 this year. I appreciate that. All right, thank
7 you very much. Motion to adjourn.

8 **COMMISSION MEMBER G. DURNIL:** So moved.

9 **CHAIRMAN T. ROKITA:** Motion carries.
10 Thanks. Merry Christmas everybody.
