

CARROLL COUNTY ELECTION BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 2019-1
VOTE CENTER PLAN AMENDMENT #5

Whereas, the Carroll County Vote Center Plan was duly adopted on February 28, 2014; and,

Whereas, the Indiana Code 3-11-18.1-15 authorizes Carroll County to amend a plan adopted with a county election board's order under I.C. 3-11-18.1-3 by unanimous vote of the entire membership of the board approving the plan amendment; and,

Whereas, the Carroll County Election Board has determined that the early voting locations and vote centers will be amended from the original plan, as listed below.

Whereas, the Carroll County Election Board has determined that the vote center flow chart needs to be amended to reflect the current voting machines as follows.

Whereas, the Carroll County Election Board so approves the Carroll County plan amendment for vote centers in Carroll County, Indiana.

Further, the layout of the polls will stay the same. Carroll County will only have one vote center location for the 2019 Municipal Primary and one satellite location as follows:

Satellite Stations

One (1) Vote Center will be open the two (2) Saturdays prior to the election per I.C. 3-11-18.1-4(17).

VOTE CENTER FLOW CHART

All Vote Center facilities are fully ADA accessible per IC 3-11-8 and have ample, easily accessible parking. There will be at least five (5) ExpressPoll and (1) DS200 voting machines at each center. In order to avoid waiting, machines can be reallocated if the need arises. This will also be documented in SVRS by the "absentee" procedures up to Election Day with the exception of the DS200, ballots will be placed in sealed envelopes with the voter's name and signature on the outside and placed in a locked ballot box. The security plan for the Express Poll and DS200 voting machines and the ePollbooks is to lock the rooms in which they are placed each night. The voting machines will also be secured each night with numbered seals that will need to be cut each morning in order to utilize the machines. In the event of a power failure at each/or one (1) vote center, the voting machines and ePollbooks will be switched to

battery backup. For obvious reasons, if the safety of the voters and/or poll workers is ever at risk, the vote center will be closed upon direction of the Election Board. If convenient for the voters, they may be instructed to visit the opposite vote center. If the internet is inaccessible, the voter still will be checked in using the ePollbook and when the connection is reestablished the ePollbooks will sync back up, if there were any illegal votes they will be logged in a report and be available for the prosecutor. There will be five (5) election workers at each center. The Inspector will also serve as a greeter and verify that the voter has his/her government issued photo ID, they will be checked in with their government issued photo ID. In order to avoid lines, two (2) registration locations will be made available to utilize the electronic poll book and check the voter in, consisting of one (1) clerk and one (1) judge of opposing major parties. The clerk will scan or type the voter name to view ePollbook data. Once verified, the voter will sign the signature pad. If an issue arises with locating a voter, the voter will return to the Inspector for further instruction. The clerk will document any necessary information into the ePollbook as required by statute. The ballot will be printed at the time of signing the ePollbook. The voter will proceed to the voting machine and insert the ballot. The voter will then proceed with voting on the voting machine in the same manner as always. The training for the poll workers will be largely the same with the exception of the training for the new electronic poll books. The Democrat and Republican Party Chairs will provide a list of potential poll workers for Satellite and Vote Centers, on or about March 25 and September 25 of each election year.

BE IT THEREFORE ORDERED BY THE CARROLL COUNTY ELECTION BOARD;

The Carroll County Election Board adopts this Order to approve the Carroll County Vote Center Plan Amendment.


Further, this resolution shall take effect immediately and may only be rescinded by unanimous vote of the entire membership of the Carroll County Election Board.


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
