**2. Transaction of Commission Business:**

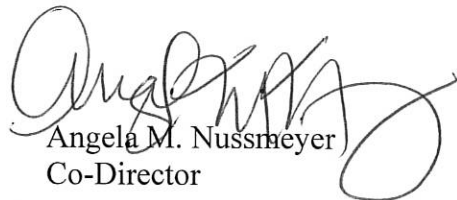

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1           CHAIRMAN OKESON: We're going to go ahead and  
2 get started. We have a fourth member who will be  
3 joining us shortly, but we have a quorum, so we'll  
4 go ahead and get started.

5           I'd like to call to order the Indiana Election  
6 Commission public session for Friday, February 10,  
7 2023, 1:00 p.m., here in the Government Center  
8 South, Conference Room 1.

9           The following members of the Commission are  
10 present: Myself, Chairman Paul Okeson; Vice-Chair  
11 Suzannah Wilson Overholt; Abhi Reddy, proxy for  
12 Litany Pyle to my left; and Member Karen  
13 Celestino-Horseman will be here shortly. I also  
14 recognize the Election Division co-staff,  
15 Co-Director Brad King and Co-Director Angie  
16 Nussmeyer along with Co-Counsel Matthew Kochevar  
17 and Valerie Warycha to my left. And then the court  
18 reporter, Maria Collier, from Stewart Richardson  
19 Deposition Services.

20           With that in mind, as we proceed, if you're  
21 going to be giving any testimony, please state your  
22 name and then spell it for the court reporter so we  
23 can get the minutes accurate.

24           With that, we'll move on to the documentation  
25 of compliance with the Open Door Law.

1 MR. KING: Mr. Chairman, members of the  
2 Commission, on behalf of myself and Co-Director  
3 Nussmeyer, we certify that notice of this meeting  
4 was given in compliance with the Indiana Open Door  
5 Law.

6 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Thank you.

7 Next, approval of January 31, 2023, Election  
8 Commission minutes. I recognize the co-directors  
9 to present the minutes.

10 MR. KING: Mr. Chairman, on behalf of myself  
11 and Co-Director Nussmeyer, we have reviewed the  
12 minutes of the January 31, 2023, Indiana Election  
13 Commission and recommend them to you for your  
14 approval.

15 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Okay. Is there a motion to  
16 approve?

17 VICE CHAIRMAN OVERHOLT: So moved.

18 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Second?

19 MR. REDDY: Second.

20 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Any discussion?

21 Hearing none, all those in favor signify by  
22 saying "Aye."

23 VICE CHAIRMAN OVERHOLT: Aye.

24 MS. CELESTINO-HORSEMAN: Aye.

25 MR. REDDY: Aye.

1           CHAIRMAN OKESON: The "ayes" have it.

2           And on to the matter that bring us here today,  
3 the approval of voting systems engineering changes.  
4 If you're planning on providing any testimony or  
5 responding to any questions, will you please stand  
6 and take the oath from Co-Counsel Matthew Kochevar.

7           MR. KOCHEVAR: Please raise your right hand  
8 and say "I do" after recitation of the oath.

9           Do you solemnly swear or affirm, under the  
10 penalties of perjury, that the testimony you are  
11 about to give to the Indiana Election Commission is  
12 the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the  
13 truth? Please say "I do."

14          ALL: I do.

15          CHAIRMAN OKESON: Thank you. Thank you,  
16 Matthew.

17          So in our binders we have the Hart InterCivic  
18 Verity Voting System engineering change orders for  
19 the Verity 2.3, 2.5, and 2.6 voting systems,  
20 respectively Change Orders 1512, 1524, 1538, and  
21 1551.

22          I recognize the Co-Directors and then a  
23 representative from VSTOP. Brad.

24          MR. KING: Mr. Chairman, members of the  
25 Commission, in your binder you will find the



1 individual engineering change orders that the Chair  
2 referenced in his motion. I believe there are  
3 four. These applications for engineering change  
4 orders were submitted and reviewed by the  
5 co-directors and the Voting System Technical  
6 Oversight Program, VSTOP, for compliance with  
7 statutory requirements by the co-directors and then  
8 technical aspects by VSTOP.

9 I have nothing further now. At this point  
10 I'll defer to Co-Director Nussmeyer for any  
11 additional information.

12 MS. NUSSMEYER: Thank you, Mr. King.

13 Mr. Chair, members of the Commission, just a  
14 reminder that engineering change orders are  
15 typically -- I wouldn't call them benign changes,  
16 but what would be called non-de minimis changes  
17 where they're not impacting the coding of an  
18 election. Sometimes, if you remember from past  
19 change orders, it's simply changing out a different  
20 cord for an upgraded version because the previous  
21 cord was no longer manufactured, for example. So  
22 those are the types of things we're going to be  
23 hearing about today at the meeting.

24 VICE CHAIRMAN OVERHOLT: You said  
25 non-de minimis, but these are actually de minimis

1 changes; correct?

2 MS. NUSSMEYER: Thank you. Yes.

3 VICE CHAIRMAN OVERHOLT: Just wanted to  
4 clarify that.

5 MS. NUSSMEYER: I appreciate you. Thank you.

6 CHAIRMAN OKESON: So we can move on to some  
7 discussion and testimony, I guess I would make a  
8 motion. I move that the application submitted by  
9 Hart InterCivic for approval of each of these  
10 engineering change orders be approved for marketing  
11 and use in Indiana for a term expiring October 1,  
12 2025, subject to any restrictions set forth in the  
13 report submitted by VSTOP.

14 Is there a second?

15 VICE CHAIRMAN OVERHOLT: Second.

16 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Okay. I recognize our  
17 friends from VSTOP.

18 MR. CHATOT: Thank you, Commissioner. My name  
19 is Marc Chatot, M-a-r-c, C-h-a-t-o-t. I will be  
20 presenting the four changes here.

21 ECO-1512 makes several clarifying clerical  
22 updates and adds an additional construction method  
23 for an existing internal device cable. There are  
24 no changes to the production of the Verity device  
25 assemblies. The following changes are made in the

1 ECO: Clerical Verity Duo series baseboards  
2 correction. A duplicate reference designator is  
3 removed. Three cable drawings are updated to  
4 clarify any connector tooling points that are to be  
5 covered. And an alternate construction method for  
6 an internal cable is provided.

7 Members of the VSTOP team have reviewed  
8 ECO-1512 and the supporting documents and the  
9 Voting System Testing Laboratory reports. VSTOP  
10 finds the ECO complies with the requirements for  
11 de minimis or minor changes to hardware components.  
12 The ECO only applies to the specific Hart  
13 InterCivic voting systems noted in the table above.  
14 The Hart InterCivic Verity 2.3 and Verity 2.5  
15 voting systems are EAC certified, and the ECO was  
16 approved by the EAC.

17 VSTOP recommends the approval of ECO-1512.

18 ECO-1524 introduces security enhancements in  
19 Verity 2.5 that will increase scanning speed in  
20 Verity 2.5. The average scanning time increases as  
21 additional cast vote records and ballot images are  
22 added. This ECO introduces a scanning speed  
23 performance optimization that was developed in  
24 Verity 2.7. This change affects Verity Scan and  
25 Verity Scan with Relay devices on Verity 2.5 and

1 2.6 only. There are no other changes to other  
2 Verity devices or workstations.

3 Members of the VSTOP team have reviewed  
4 ECO-1524 and the supporting documents and the  
5 Voting System Testing Laboratory reports. VSTOP  
6 finds the ECO complies with the requirements for  
7 de minimis or minor changes to hardware components.  
8 The Hart InterCivic Verity 2.5 and 2.6 voting  
9 systems are EAC certified, and the ECO was approved  
10 by the EAC. Only Verity 2.5 is currently in use in  
11 Indiana.

12 ECO-1538 introduces the Commercial-Off-the-  
13 Shelf, or COTS, monitor (display) for use with  
14 Verity workstations that is being end-of-lifed and  
15 replaced. The manufacturer, Hewlett-Packard, has  
16 recommended that the P24 G4 24 is replaced with the  
17 P24v G4. The P24v G4 display is a complete form,  
18 fit, and function match with the HP P244 with all  
19 the same specifications and features. The  
20 DisplayPort output is removed, and connectivity to  
21 the workstation is via an HDMI to a MiniDisplayPort  
22 cable.

23 The Hewlett-Packard P24 G4 24 monitor is no  
24 longer available, and Hewlett-Packard has suggested  
25 the P24v G4 as an equivalent replacement.

1 Members of the VSTOP team have reviewed the  
2 ECO supporting documents and Voting System Testing  
3 Laboratory reports. VSTOP finds the ECO complies  
4 with the requirements for de minimis changes to  
5 hardware components. The ECO only applies to the  
6 specific Hart InterCivic Verity 2.3 and 2.5 voting  
7 systems noted in the table above. The Hart  
8 InterCivic Verity 2.3 and 2.5 voting systems are  
9 EAC certified, and ECO-1538 was approved by the  
10 EAC.

11 VSTOP recommends approval of ECO-1538.

12 The final ECO is ECO-1551. The Touch Duo, a  
13 ballot marking device, is connected to the Verity  
14 Controller for management and activation by the  
15 poll worker. Up to 12 Touch Duo devices may be  
16 connected in a daisy chain manner to a single  
17 controller and are identified by their booth  
18 assignment number.

19 The need for the change to Verity 2.5 was  
20 noted when customers in seven Texas counties with  
21 large numbers of precincts and many contests on the  
22 ballot experienced setup time delays of up to  
23 40 minutes when assigning booth numbers. This  
24 delay was due to Touch Duo units displaying a "No  
25 Controller Found" message when multiple booths were

1 assigned near simultaneously.

2 This minor software update will make the  
3 following changes to reduce network traffic and  
4 eliminate concurrency issues: (1) Upon loading a  
5 new election on the controller, the Verity database  
6 will be staged to a subfolder within the original  
7 database folder. (2) Touch Duo will download this  
8 version when it requests the election media upon  
9 loading an election. (3) At the same time, a  
10 corresponding database signature file will be  
11 created to compare the version of the database on  
12 the Duo side with the version on the controller in  
13 order to determine whether the Verity database  
14 needs to be redownloaded or if the existing one can  
15 be utilized. This change is limited to Verity  
16 Controller and Verity Duo software only and is  
17 applicable to Verity 2.5. There will be no impact  
18 to the Base Operating System master image.

19 At the conclusion of this update, Verity  
20 Controller software will be updated from 2.5.1 to  
21 2.5.3. Verity Touch Writer Duo software will be  
22 updated from 2.5.1 to 2.5.3.

23 Upon review of the supporting documents and  
24 Voting System Testing Laboratory reports by the  
25 members of the VSTOP team, VSTOP finds that this

1 ECO complies with the requirements for de minimis  
2 changes to hardware components. The Hart  
3 InterCivic Verity 2.5 voting system is EAC  
4 certified, and the ECO has been approved by the  
5 EAC.

6 VSTOP recommends approval of ECO-1551.

7 That concludes VSTOP's recommendations.

8 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Thank you.

9 Any questions?

10 VICE CHAIRMAN OVERHOLT: Well, so the last  
11 one, the last change order is the one that I'm --  
12 because I get why -- from a layperson's standpoint,  
13 I suppose, so this boils down to when you get to a  
14 certain number of precincts in a polling location,  
15 that the system was having a hard time kind of  
16 recognizing those various --

17 MR. CHATOT: Correct. So you start with the  
18 controller, and then you add the Touch Duo devices  
19 to it in a daisy chain. As they were adding those  
20 devices, they added too many at once and it kind of  
21 hung everything up. So this is a speed improvement  
22 to make it so that you can add those devices  
23 easier.

24 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Too many strands of  
25 Christmas lights on the --

1 MR. CHATOT: Exactly.

2 VICE CHAIRMAN OVERHOLT: Blew a circuit. And  
3 we all know that 6:00 a.m. on Election Day is not  
4 when you want that to -- more appropriately,  
5 5:45 a.m. on Election Day.

6 But when it talks about redownloading the  
7 database file and then --

8 CHAIRMAN OKESON: It was doing that  
9 erroneously before, or unnecessarily.

10 VICE CHAIRMAN OVERHOLT: Right.

11 MR. CHATOT: Or kind of halfway getting it  
12 done.

13 VICE CHAIRMAN OVERHOLT: But the database that  
14 we're talking about is simply the database for the  
15 operating system? It's not --

16 MR. CHATOT: Yeah, the election database, the  
17 one for the election being used that's being  
18 deployed on all the devices.

19 MS. NUSSMEYER: If I might -- and you stop me  
20 if I'm hearing this wrong -- the election that's  
21 coded on the system, right, would be the precinct  
22 and then the voter's ballot style.

23 MR. CHATOT: Correct.

24 MS. NUSSMEYER: Because that system pulls up  
25 the person's ballot style so that it can be filled



1 out and managed that way. So it was getting hung  
2 up within that database not being able to pull it  
3 through. Is that a correct understanding?

4 MR. CHATOT: Correct. The database involved  
5 different ballot styles that would be available.  
6 The controller would say "You need ballot style  
7 No. 4, go to Booth 6," and it will pull it up for  
8 you.

9 VICE CHAIRMAN OVERHOLT: And that's what was  
10 slowing it down?

11 MR. CHATOT: That's what the controller and  
12 the Duo Touch devices have to communicate back and  
13 forth to each other to make sure that they're both  
14 right.

15 CHAIRMAN OKESON: And that was freezing up and  
16 the ballot wasn't loading?

17 MR. CHATOT: Correct.

18 VICE CHAIRMAN OVERHOLT: So this update, it's  
19 all still contained within the operating system  
20 that's going to be deployed at that polling  
21 location and it's not depending on Internet  
22 connectivity?

23 MR. CHATOT: Correct. It's still an isolated  
24 system. It's a closed network.

25 MS. CELESTINO-HORSEMAN: Did we have that

1 problem in our elections here?

2 MR. CHATOT: No. We did not experience that  
3 in Indiana. It was just Texas.

4 VICE CHAIRMAN OVERHOLT: Anticipating.

5 MR. CHATOT: Yes.

6 VICE CHAIRMAN OVERHOLT: I don't have any  
7 other questions.

8 MS. CELESTINO-HORSEMAN: I missed the  
9 beginning. Can you start over?

10 VICE CHAIRMAN OVERHOLT: You can leave. We  
11 decided we didn't need your vote.

12 MS. CELESTINO-HORSEMAN: No, I don't.

13 CHAIRMAN OKESON: I forgot to note, Brad, was  
14 there any correspondence that was submitted or  
15 filed in relation to this beyond the VSTOP report?

16 MR. KING: No, Mr. Chairman, members of the  
17 Commission, there was not. I'll just note that  
18 there are representatives from Hart InterCivic  
19 present if the Commission has questions for them.  
20 Other than that, no communications.

21 CHAIRMAN OKESON: I don't have any. Would you  
22 wish to say anything?

23 MR. CHOATE: No. If you all are satisfied,  
24 we're satisfied.

25 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Is there anyone else present

1 who would like to share any thoughts?

2 Well, we've completed our discussion. We've  
3 got a motion and a second. I guess we're prepared  
4 to take a vote. All those in favor signify by  
5 saying "Aye."

6 VICE CHAIRMAN OVERHOLT: Aye.

7 MS. CELESTINO-HORSEMAN: Aye.

8 MR. REDDY: Aye.

9 CHAIRMAN OKESON: The "ayes" have it. The  
10 motion carries. The change orders are approved.

11 And that concludes our business. Thank you  
12 for coming.

13 Is there a motion to adjourn?

14 VICE CHAIRMAN OVERHOLT: So moved.

15 CHAIRMAN OKESON: Second?

16 MS. CELESTINO-HORSEMAN: Second.

17 CHAIRMAN OKESON: All those in favor.

18 VICE CHAIRMAN OVERHOLT: Aye.

19 MS. CELESTINO-HORSEMAN: Aye.

20 MR. REDDY: Aye.

21 CHAIRMAN OKESON: We're done.

22 (The Indiana Election Commission Public  
23 Session was adjourned at 1:17 p.m.)

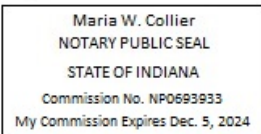
