The list of these counties is confirmed with documentation currently on file with the Indiana Election Division. There is a possibility that up to 24 counties could meet the definition of "super responsible" county. However, those counties would have to provide proof of their qualification to the Indiana Election Division. There will be a separate application process for counties that meet the qualifications set forth in IC 3-11-6.5-4, giving all eligible counties an opportunity to apply. Dollar amounts above are subject to the total number of counties and precincts that can be confirmed. Each county is eligible for up to \$2,962.96 per voting precinct from 2003 (using these counties).
