Come now Steve Birch, Chairman, Paula Lantz, White County Clerk, and John T. Million, Member, being all of the members of the White County Election Board, and find, as follows:

1. Pursuant to the requirements of IC 3-18-1-18.1-3 and IC 3-11-16.1-4, said Board drafted a Voting Center Plan for White County and presented a draft thereof at a duly called public meeting held on the 6th day of February, 2014, and invited comment from the public concerning the plan.
2. On March 8th, 2014, more than thirty days after said first public meeting, said Board held a duly called public hearing to consider all written public comments to said plan.
3. After due consideration of each and all of said public comments, and the making of several amendments to said plan, a final draft of the Voting Center Plan for White county was unanimously approved by all of the above-named members of the Election Board and the following Order adopting said Voting Center Plan was made by the Board:

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED by the White county election Board that the White County Voting Center Plan, as presented, amended and unanimously approved at said public hearing be, and the same is hereby in all things unanimously approved.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED by the Election board that copies of said Voting Center Plan be presented to the Board of Commissioners of White County and White County Council together with a request that said County Commissioners and County Council each adopt a resolution approving the designation of White county as a vote center county.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED by said Election Board that, following the adoption of said resolutions by the said Commissioners and County Council, that this Order and said adopted Voting Center Plan, and copies of said resolutions be filed with the Election Division of the State of Indiana



WHITE COUNTY VOTE CENTER PLAN

In compliance with IC 3-11-18.1-4, the White County Election Board proposes to adopt a plan for the establishment of Voting Centers in White County, to provide more convenient, efficient and cost effective voting access and procedures for all White County citizens.

The population of White County, according to the 2010 Census Is 24,643.

The total number of registered voters is 17,532, as of the 2012 election.

Pursuant to the statute, the Voting Center Plan includes the following information:

1. The total number of voting centers will be eight (8).
2. The location of each voting center is as follows:
 - A. The Wolcott Park Community Building in Wolcott, Indiana.
 - B. The Church of God in Idaville, Indiana.
 - C. The Fire Station in Buffalo, Indiana.
 - D. The North White School Building in Monon, Indiana.
 - E. The Frontier Elementary School gymnasium in Brookston, Indiana.
 - F. The Comprehensive Development Center (CDC) in Monticello, Indiana.
 - G. The Fellowship Hall of the Monticello Christian Church in Monticello, Indiana.
 - H. The R.E.M.C. Building on Sixth Street in Monticello, Indiana.
3. The effective date of the Order approving the Plan is August 18, 2014.
4.
 - A. The total number of registered voters in White County is 17,532.
 - B. The total number of active voters is: 15,224.
 - C. The total number of inactive voters is: 2,129.
5. The following is a list of of the precincts which will be located in each of the above voting centers , with the understanding that any White County voter may vote in any Voting Center:
 - A. Wolcott Park Community Building – Princeton and West Point Townships.
 - B. Idaville Church of God – Cass, Lincoln and Jackson Townships
 - C. Buffalo Fire Station – Liberty Township.
 - D. North White High School – Monon and Honey Creek Townships
 - E. Brookston Elementary Gymnasium – Prairie I, Prairie II, Big Creek and Round Grove Precincts.
 - F. C.D.C., Monticello – Union 1 and Union 2 Precincts.
 - G. Monticello Christian Church, Monticello – Union 3 and Union 7 Precincts.
 - H. R.E.M.C. Building on Sixth Street, Monticello – Union 4, Union 5 and Union 6 Precincts.
6. Each Voting Center will have one inspector, one clerk, one judge from the opposite party, and one greeter. At Voting Centers in Brookston, R.E.M.C., C.D.C. and Monon, there will be one extra clerk.
7. The Board in each Voting Center will administer the precincts assigned to that Voting Center.
8. In each Voting Center, there will be one inspector, one judge from the opposite party, one clerk and one greeter, except for additional clerks for certain Voting Centers, as provided in paragraph 6.
9. Every ballot type for each of nineteen precincts, applicable school board elections, and party in


primary elections shall be available, electronically, at each Voting Center.

10. Equipment used will be supplied by Robis Elections, Inc., and will consist of the following items installed at each voting center: one laptop computer; one St-100 card activator; one symbol barcode scanner; and one Topaz signature pad.
11. Equipment description and accessibility features.
 - a. The laptops will be used by poll workers to check voters in. The laptop will store and communicate voter information through a virtual proxy network (VPN). Each laptop will also communicate with the Clerk office central server to upload and download voter information.
 - b. The St-100 card activator will be used to encode the proper ballot style on each voting smart card to be inserted into the TSX touch screen voting machine.
 - c. 2D barcodes located on the back of driver's licenses or identification cards issued by the State will be scanned to identify each voter in the AskED e-pollbook.
 - d. Each voter's electronic signature will be captured from the Topaz signature pad and stored in the AskED e-pollbook.
12. One electronic poll book shall be available at each Voting Center, except Brookston, R.E.M.C., C.D.C. and Monon, where one additional poll book shall be available, for a total of twelve electronic poll books.
13. Ballots shall be kept in a locked ballot box in a locked room inside another locked room in the basement of the White County Building. Anti-viral and anti-hacking procedures shall be implemented
14. A Resolution of the White County Election Board certifying the accessibility of the voting centers and satellite early voting centers is attached to and made a part of the Vote Center Plan.
15. A sketch of the Voting Center lay out to be used in each of the Voting Centers is attached to and made a part of this Vote Center Plan.
16. The number of satellite offices to be established under IC 3-11-10-26.3, in addition to the Clerk's Office in the Court House shall be one, to be located at Brookston, Indiana
17. The method and timing of providing voter data to persons entitled to receive it is as follows: Data will only be accessible from an administrator's portal using the AskED command center to manage sensitive voter data. The AskED Command Center will allow the County Clerk to upload and download data from the State Voter Registration System.





Sketch of Voting Center Lay-out


1. Lay-out Option #1

WHEREAS, the White County Election Board is authorized, pursuant to Indiana Code §3-111-18.1-3 to proceed with drafting, adoption and implementation of a Vote Center Plan for White County, and is further authorized to file said Plan with the Indiana Election Division;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND CERTIFIED BY THE WHITE COUNTY COUNCIL that the White County Election Board is authorized, pursuant to Indiana Code §3-11-18.1-3, to proceed with drafting, adoption and implementation of a Vote Center Plan, along with the administration of Vote Centers for White County, beginning with the November General Election for 2014.

A PLAN FOR VOTE CENTERS


WHEREAS, Indiana Code §3-11-18.1 authorizes Counties to adopt the Vote Center Model; and


