In 2001, Indiana enacted legislation to permit voter registration applications to be downloaded from our web page, completed, signed, and forwarded to the county voter registration office. The requirement that these forms be on durable card stock was repealed. In 2001 and 2002, Indiana enacted legislation requiring new voter registration applicants to include a driver's license number (or BMV ID number, or last four digits of Social Security number if the applicant did not have a driver's license). The mail-in registration forms were revised accordingly.

In 2001 and 2002, Indiana enacted legislation requiring new voter registration applicants to include a driver's license number (or BMV ID number, or last four digits of Social Security number if the applicant did not have a driver's license). The motor vehicle agency registration forms were revised accordingly.

13. Did you have any particular problems or successes with your motor vehicle registration program or procedures that you would like to report?

There were problems getting voter registration applications from the Bureau of Motor Vehicles to the county circuit court clerk's office in a timely manner. Also, we had some occurences in which an application was lost in the process. We hope to move to a computerized state voter registration system with linkage to the Bureau of Motor Vehicles to prevent this problem. Many applications from the Bureau of Motor Vehicles have incomplete data (especially concerning previous addresses).

14. Do you have any recommendations regarding the motor vehicle registration provisions of the NVRA that you would like us to pass along?

15. What changes, if any, did you make to your agency registration program or procedures between the general elections of 2000 and 2002?

In 2001 and 2002, Indiana enacted legislation requiring new voter registration applicants to include a driver's license number (or BMV ID number, or last four digits of Social Security number if the applicant did not have a driver's license). The agency registration forms were revised accordingly.

16. Did you have any particular problems or successes with your agency registration program or procedures that you would like to report?

There are a great amount of duplicate applications that are received through the agencies. We believe this is because some people register to vote EVERY time they go to the agency. This can be as often as once a month.

17. Do you have any recommendations regarding the agency registration provisions of the NVRA that you would like us to pass along?

18. What changes, if any, did you make to your list maintenance procedures between the general elections of 2000 and 2002?

None. We will be implementing a statewide voter registration file before January 1, 2006.

19. Did you have any particular problems or successes with list maintenance procedures that you would like to report?

We lack the resources to isolate duplicate registrations between counties. The statewide voter file will assist with identifying the duplicates.

<u>There were mistakes made by poll workers in administering fail-safe provisions. We hope</u> to eliminate these errors with more poll worker training and materials.

24. What changes, if any, did you make to your NVRA record keeping procedures between the general elections of 2000 and 2002?

We asked counties to report voter registration data on a quarterly basis rather than monthly.

25. Did you have any particular problems or successes with NVRA record keeping procedures that you would like to report?

We have a problem with counties not reporting their quarterly data to us. Most counties did not send a report every quarter and some never reported in the past two years. We were required to reconstruct county voter registration activity during the reporting period. We have a completely paper system of NVRA record keeping. This will change with the implementation of the statewide voter file as we will have an electronic channel of direct communication with each county. We also plan on increasing our training in this area as there is a high turnover in our county clerk offices.

26. Do you have any recommendations regarding the record keeping provisions of the NVRA (or the FEC's regulations) that you would like us to pass along?

1. How does your State distinguish between the national mail voter registration form and the Department of Defense (DD2644) Voter Registration Application form when counting sources of registrations?

Indiana does not distinguish between the two. If mailed, they are counted as "by mail".
