What is an Education Scholarship Account?

An Indiana Education Scholarship Account (ESA), funded by state tax dollars, provides education options for K-12 students with a disability, and income at or below the annual income qualification.

ESA funding can be used on private school tuition, homebased education, therapies, tutoring, and more.

Student Eligibility

- Resident of Indiana
- 5-22 years old; K-12 grade level
- Student must have a disability and require special education through an Individualized Education Program (IEP), Service Plan (SP), or ESA Service Plan (ESA SP).
- Income at or below income qualification (\$222,000 for a family of four). **See ESA website for full table*



Qualified Expenses

- Private school tuition/fees
- Homebased education
- Testing and examination services
- Tutoring
- Educational camp
- Equestrian therapy
- Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) services
- Speech-Language Pathologist (SLP) services
- Other services provided by approved providers
