Town Council

Culver's governmental body consists of a five-member council each of whom are elected at-large to serve a four-year term. The terms are staggered with two members elected in even years and three elected in odd years. At the first meeting in January of each year, the council elects one council member president. This person serves as the chairperson for the council, setting agendas and leading meetings.

They also are responsible for appointing members to the Plan Commission, Board of Zoning Appeals, Redevelopment Commission, and Tree Commission. The elected and appointed officials are responsible for adopting ordinances and resolutions for Culver.

Water Deposit

To set up water utilities, please complete the Culver Water Utility Application available at www.townofculver.org/documents/culver-utility-application/ or at town hall. There is a \$75 deposit for the water utility.

Utility Bills

Bills for water, sewer, storm water, and trash are sent out or e-mailed (please let us know your preference) on the first of the month and due the 15th. Payments may be made in person at town hall during office hours, placed in the secure drop box inside the front door of the police station anytime, or mailed in. Payments also are accepted via online credit card payment through paygov.us or by automatic ACH payment. To sign up for ACH, please download the form from the town's website (townofculver.org under services), request it by e-mail, or stop by town hall.

Residential Trash and Recycling

Trash pickup and recycling for single family homes are provided by contract with Republic Services. Please use only the trash and recycling totes provided by Republic Services. Trash collection takes place every Monday; recycling is every other Monday. Please place your trash and recycling totes at the curb no later than 5 a.m. The totes should be at least five (5) feet apart with the handles facing toward your residence. Place all trash inside the container. Drivers will not pick up trash outside of the tote unless it has a purchased trash sticker on it. Stickers are available at Town Hall for \$1.50. Please remove carts from the curb within 24 hours of collection. If you have questions about trash and/or recycling, please call Town Hall at 574.842.3140.

Golf Carts

Golf carts, as a form of transportation, are allowed on Culver streets provided the vehicles have the proper registration. Registrations may be obtained at Town Hall and are good for the calendar year. For golf carts, please provide proof of insurance (golf cart must be listed and be insured to drive on public streets) along with the year make and model of the cart. The registration fee is \$60. Please note that you must have a valid driver's license to operate a golf cart.

Utility Vehicles

UTVs are allowed on Culver streets but must be registered with the Bureau of Motor Vehicles first and then the town. Bring the registration to Town Hall along with proof of insurance (UTV must be listed) to obtain a permit to drive in Culver. There is no cost.

Town Services

Parks and Recreation

The town operates the town park, including the beach. Located on Lake Shore drive, the park is open from dawn until 11 p.m. and has a basketball court, beach volleyball court, two playgrounds, a beach, community center, and boat piers. From Memorial Day through July, the beach is guarded, and admission is charged to swim. Summer passes are available for purchase at the beginning of the season. Pier spaces are rented for the season. Utilities Department

This department designs, builds and maintains key town infrastructure including roads and alleys, traffic signs, water treatment and distribution, sewer collection and treatment, storm drains and town facilities.

Brush and Leaf Collection – The street crew collects brush and branches placed at the curb (please do not place it in in the street). In April/May and again in November, ending mid-December, the crew will collect leaves placed at the curb. Please do not mix branches and yard waste with leaves as it will clog the leaf vacuum. The street crew **WILL NOT** collect grass clippings, weeds and other yard waste. That waste may be taken to the street garage at 511 South Mill Street and placed in the yard waste bin there.

Christmas Trees – The street crew will pick up Christmas trees placed at the curb following the holiday season. Please be sure the tree is cleared of all decorations.

Town Wide Clean Up Day - Culver sponsors a clean-up day for residents in May and October. On that day dumpsters are available at the parking lot by the east water tower on Lake Shore Drive. Hazardous waste and tires are not accepted.
