April 10, 2025**

In attendance were Jennifer Harrelson, President, Courtney Strain, Vice President, Woodrow Power, Council Member, Jerry Payne, Council Member and Angela McCullough, Clerk Treasurer.

New Business-the two subjects were allowed at the beginning of the meeting due to representatives being present and time constrictions.

Wastewater Plant IDEM report-Compliance Plan HWC was present to discuss the Wastewater Plant IDEM report-Compliance Plan

We are in need of an aeration tank, and a Preventative Maintenance Plan. If IDEM knows you have a plan in progress they will work with you. HWC will give us a proposal for the compliance updates.

Worksite Advantage Program- Kai White was present to offer the town employees an insurance program that will be no cost to the town and it is portable. The board approved Kai to come back and meet with employees regarding the benefits available.

Old Business

Meeting Minutes-The board read minutes from the last 2 meetings. Woodrow motioned the minutes be approved and Courtney 2nd the motion, all in favor say Aye, all said Aye.

Ordinance 2025-1-CONTROL OF INOPERABLE/ABANDONED VEHICLES-the ordinance was read at the last meeting, Woodrow gave 1st motion to approve ordinance, Jerry 2nd the motion, Courtney abstained; all in favor say Aye, all said Aye.

Disaster Recovery Plan-This is a plan to back up our electronic data should a fire, flood or natural disaster occur. The State Board of Accounts requires it. The Clerk/Treasurer currently backs up the data on a removable drive and it is taken home with her nightly as well as it is on a lap top she keeps at home.

New Business

Request for Discussion Form-The state requires meetings to follow an Agenda. With this being said a form has been developed for the townspeople to fill out if they would like to come to the meeting to address a situation with the board. They will then be added to the Agenda.

Billing Adjustments-IN AWC has changed the way they give adjustments for leaks etc. They now show on the bottom of our report with a negative adjustment as to how much we are to adjust the customer's bill. Due to the fact that we are separate from the Water Company the board wants us to adjust the customer's bill according to the ordinance we have in place by averaging the 3 months prior to the leak.

Milton Gaskins Plaque-Woodrow Power was going to donate the money to have two new basketball goals installed. Since the previous were damaged by the town it has been suggested the Town donate \$509.99 to the Friends of the Park for the installation of the plaque honoring Milton Gaskins. Courtney gave 1st motion for approval, Jerry gave 2nd motion, all in favor say Aye, all said Aye.

New Stop Sign-The town is missing a couple of stop signs. The Town Coordinator has requested to purchase a new stop sign, regulation size of 30x30. Woody gave 1st motion for approval, Courtney gave 2nd motion, all in favor say Aye, all said Aye.

The stop sign at 1st and Hopewell Street will be removed as there is no cross traffic anymore and will be moved to 5th and Gallagher. Jerry gave 1st motion, Woody gave 2nd motion for approval, all in favor say Aye, all said Aye.

Jim Hughes Widen Driveway-Jim Hughes is wanting to widen his driveway so that it does not involve the utility right of way. Currently he would have to vacate his driveway if the utility companies would need to gain access to that area for some reason. He is proposing to move it 6-7 feet to the west of where it currently is. He would cover the cost of repair to the sidewalk and curb.

Terry King-complaint-Loss of the use of home-The customer did not show up so subject was tabled.

Safety Training-The Street Department and the Town Coordinator are requesting to attend an OSHA 360 webinar training. The cost is \$79/each. Woodrow gave 1st motion, Jerry gave 2nd motion for approval, all in favor say Aye, all said Aye.


Road Cut on 4th Street-This still has not been repaired. A letter will be sent to the contractor from the Town Attorney.

Kevin Walton-Builder-will be discussed at next meeting


