FEBRUARY 13, 2025**

In attendance were Jennifer Harrelson, President, Woodrow Power, Council Member, Jerry Payne, Council Member and Angela McCullough, Clerk Treasurer. Courtney Strain, Vice President was not able to attend.

Old business

- Review Meeting Minutes from December 12, 2024 meeting and January 9, 2025. Board members reviewed December minutes, Jerry gave 1st motion for approval, Jennifer 2nd motion, all in favor say Aye, all said Aye.
Reviewed January minutes. Jerry gave 1st motion for approval, Woodrow gave 2nd motion, all in favor say Aye, all said Aye.

New Business

CHANGE ORDER #2

- Jennifer reported that there had been an amendment to the Conexco contract that would allow the remainder of the Cares Act grant money which was around \$9,377.46 to be used on the repair of the underground drain pipe at Iowa Street and Sawmill Street. The contractor will be replacing it with 3-6" pipes, 8" of stone and asphalt over the top to level it with the street.

DISASTER RECOVERY PLAN

- The State Board of Accounts requires the Town Of Farmersburg to have a recovery plan for all electronic records in case of a disaster such as fire, flood, etc. The backup of the computer system with all Keystone information is put onto a memory stick daily and is kept off site until the next day. It is also backed up on a separate laptop that is not on kept on site. The Board had put this plan on hold until it can be verified that the backup can be taken off site by the Clerk/Treasurer.

MCNEILL ELECTRICAL

- The invoice for McNeill Electrical was presented to the board for approval. This was for electrical work done at the Sewer Plant. All present approved the invoice for payment.

SUBMISSION OF POS FOR APPROVAL-VEHICLE MAINTENANCE (TOWN EQUIPMENT)

- Purchase Orders were presented by the presented to the Board for the maintenance of the town vehicles (trucks, lawn equipment, weed eaters etc.) which had not been done since 2022. The Wastewater Plant Operator presented PO 1901 for maintenance on the F350 Dump Truck, and all maintenance on the lawn equipment to change oil, filters, blades, etc. The total came to \$414.21. Woodrow gave 1st motion for approval, Jerry gave 2nd motion, all in favor say Aye, all said Aye. PO 1900 was presented for maintenance on the F350 truck and the Chevy 2500 totaling \$789.00. Woodrow gave 1st motion, Jerry gave 2nd motion for approval, all in favor say Aye, all said Aye.

JANUARY PAYABLES

- The Board reviewed the payables made in January and there were no questions. One change had been made by the Town Marshall that the officers paid for their own car washes instead of the town paying for them.


OPERATIONS NEEDS

- The Maintenance Coordinator has submitted a list of needs for the town. They do not all need to be approved at this time, but eventually we will need them. The Maintenance Coordinator is also checking into getting AEDs on site. He will touch base with the hospital and the Health Department about donating the units.
- A No Outlet Sign is needed for the driveway off around 7th and Cyrus Street that was paved and looks like a road. Cost is \$47.91 and all approved the purchase of this sign.
- The town is in need of road barricades. The Town had loaned 11 barricades to Sullivan when the tornado hit and they now cannot be found. Instead of buying the barricades it was suggested they could be built and reflective tape put on them which would be more cost effective than purchasing the already made barricades.
- The price for paving the parking lot out front to be ADA compliant has not changed. Central Indiana Asphalt submitted a bid for \$5100, Indiana Paving submitted a bid and it was suggested to contact G & S Asphalt in Marshall, IL to see if they wanted to bid on the job also.


ORDINANCE 2025-2 SEWER REGULATIONS

- Ordinance 2025-2 was presented for review. Changes will be made to remove the billing information from Ordinance 2025-2.


Jennifer asked for a motion to adjourn, Woodrow gave 1st motion, Jerry gave, 2nd motion, all in favor say Aye, all said Aye.


