The Worthington Town Council met in regular session on Tuesday, December 10, 2024, at the Town Hall at 6:00 p.m. Members in attendance were Jason Robertson, Brian Stoner, Kim Archer, and Dustin Banning.

The Meeting was called to order by Jason Robertson, who led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance. Kim Archer led in prayer.

Re: Meeting Minutes

Utilities Deputy Renie Powell reported to the Council that she has an excel sheet to help keep track of the payments going forward and which is double checked by the new part-time office employee to make sure that internal control standards are being followed per State Board of Accounts' guidelines.


Re: Police Department Report
