 - U.S. Citizen
 - Meets Low-Income Criteria
 - In need of additional training, education, or counseling
 - Have consigned consent from parent or guardian if youth is a minor
 - Have child care plan if youth is a parent of a dependent child
 - No behavioral problems
 - Does not use illegal drugs
- Absolutely free for eligible youth

- High School Equivalency (HSE) Classes
 - HSE classes offer adult an opportunity to review, learn, and/or improve basic academic skills such as reading, writing, and arithmetic. Adults who are 16 years of age or older and not currently enrolled in high school are eligible to attend ABE classes
 - There is a morning and an evening orientation each month.
 - Orientations consist of four – 3 hour sessions (Monday-Thursday).
 - You MUST attend all 4 sessions to begin classes.
 - You must present a government issued photo ID (either at registration or at orientation)
 - There is a \$20 material fee payable at the time of registration.
 - Be prepared with credit or debit information with a phone registration
 - Payment in our office can be credit, debit or cash (exact change required)
 - If you are under 18, you must provide an Exit Interview or a withdrawal form from the last high school attended. You may not be currently enrolled in any high school program
- HSE Testing Site
 - Everyone must register in advance and in person during regular office hours
 - If you are 18 years of age or older, you must: Present 3 pieces of identification; 1 must be a government issued photo ID (driver's license, permit, or state ID). If you're using a passport or out of state ID, then one of your other ID's must prove your Indiana residency. AND Prepay the \$90 fee. We accept cash (exact change only) or credit/debit cards
 - If you are 16 or 17 years of age, in addition to the above requirements, you must: Present an Exit Interview

Fridays are "service days" in which students are placed in various agencies to volunteer.
