The Indiana Board of Veterinary Medicine held its quarterly meeting on Thursday, January 29, 2026, at the Indiana State Board of Animal Health office located at the Indiana State Fairgrounds, Discovery Hall, Suite 100, 1202 E. 38th Street, Indianapolis, IN 46205 and online via Microsoft Teams.

VI. Personal Appearances

1. Daren Miller, DVM, License #24007328A , Cause #2023VB0009

Dr. Miller appeared in person and without counsel for a probation appearance. Dr. Miller is compliant with his criminal probation and the veterinary wellbeing program. In addition to his laboratory work, Dr. Miller works at the Sullivan County Veterinary Hospital and operates a mobile clinic. He continues to attend 12-step meetings. The board directed Dr. Miller to return for a personal appearance at the October 2026 board meeting. He may attend virtually as long as he remains compliant with the veterinary wellbeing program.

2. Ian Woodall, DVM, License #24009057A

Dr. Woodall appeared telephonically and without counsel to discuss the criminal conviction for reckless driving that he disclosed in his 2025 DVM renewal application. Dr. Woodall explained that he was originally charged with operating a vehicle while intoxicated, but that charge was amended for reckless driving by the Commonwealth of Kentucky. The board agreed to renew Dr. Woodall's DVM license free and clear.

Natalie Goodwin made a motion to renew Dr. Woodall's DVM license, seconded by Dr. Sunbury. Motion carried 7-0-0.
