


# WABASH RIVER PUBLIC ACCESS POINTS

Hand Carry


Rainbow Bend Access Site

## Wabash River Heritage Corridor and its Commission

The Wabash River Heritage Corridor Commission (WRHCC) was established by the Indiana General Assembly to promote the Wabash River Heritage Corridor, historically the most important trade and transportation route of early America. The Corridor includes 475 miles of the Wabash River, 25 miles of the Little River, also known as Indiana's Little Wabash River, and up to 10 miles of portage between the Wabash and Maumee drainage basins. The Corridor Commission, together with the Indiana Department of Natural Resources and the Banks of the Wabash, works with citizens of the Corridor to promote conservation and recreational development efforts.
