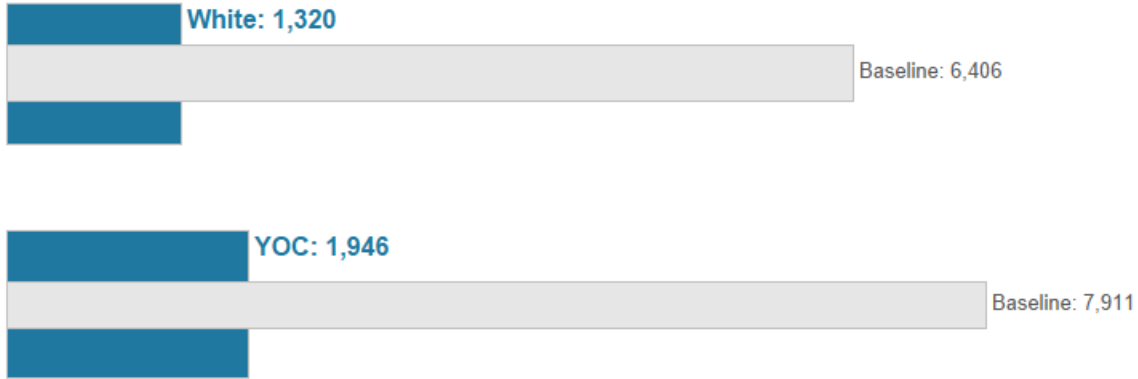

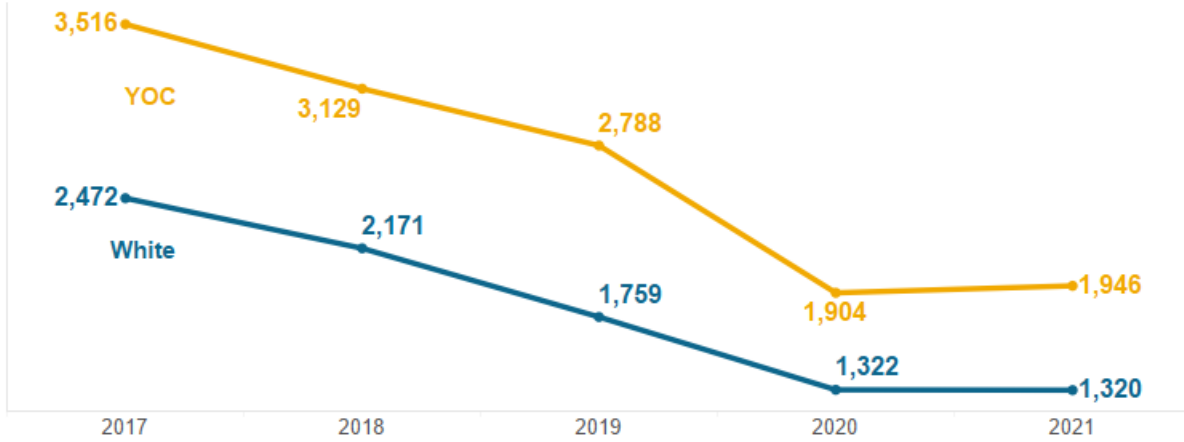

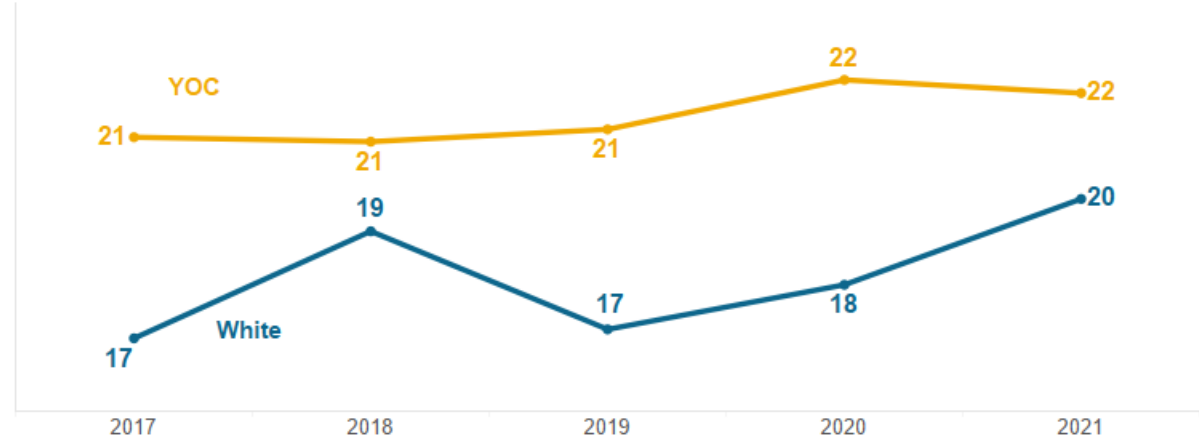

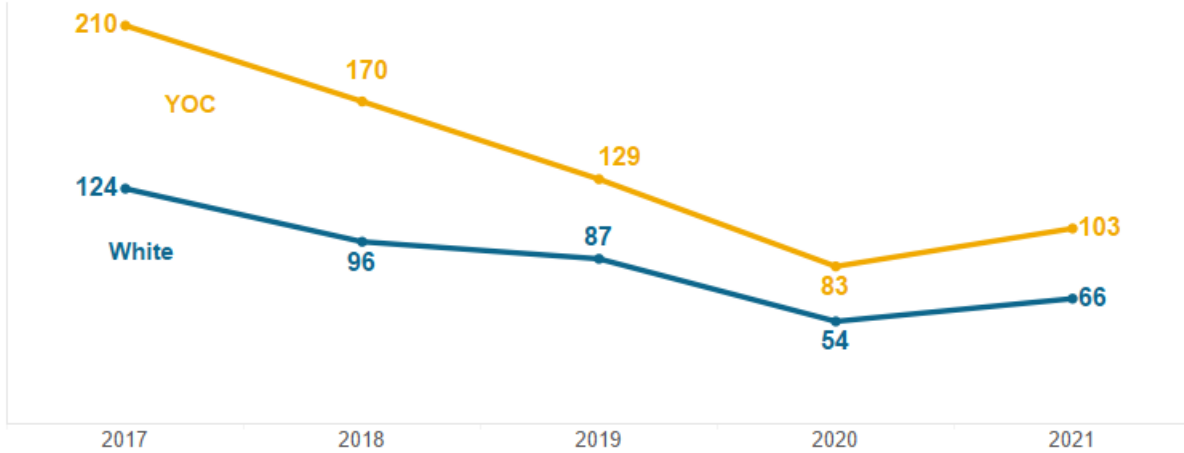
Admissions to secure detention



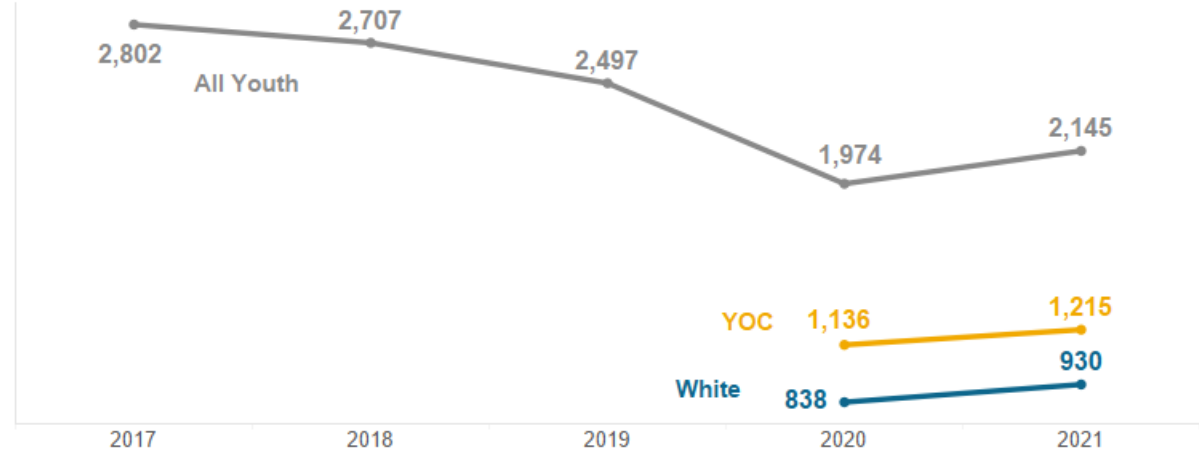
Average length of stay (days)



Commitments to Department of Corrections



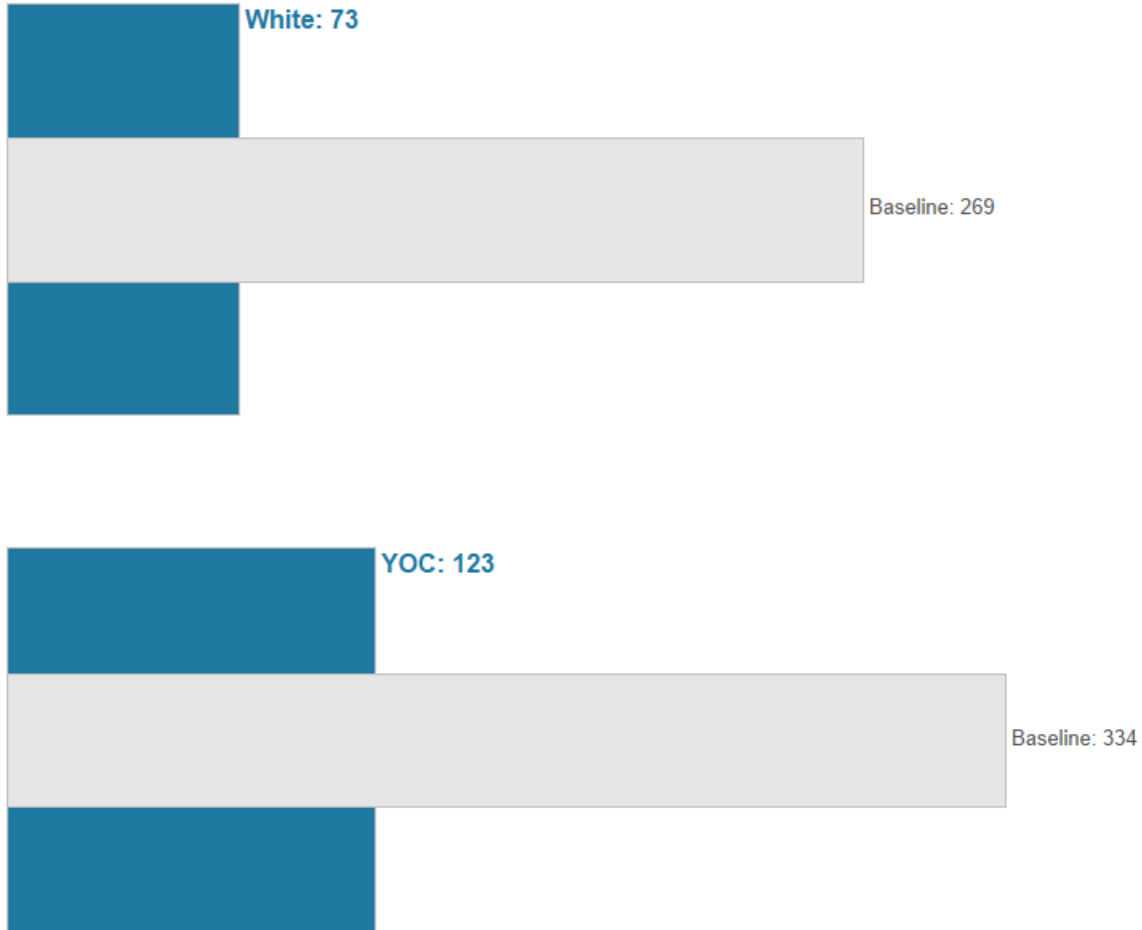

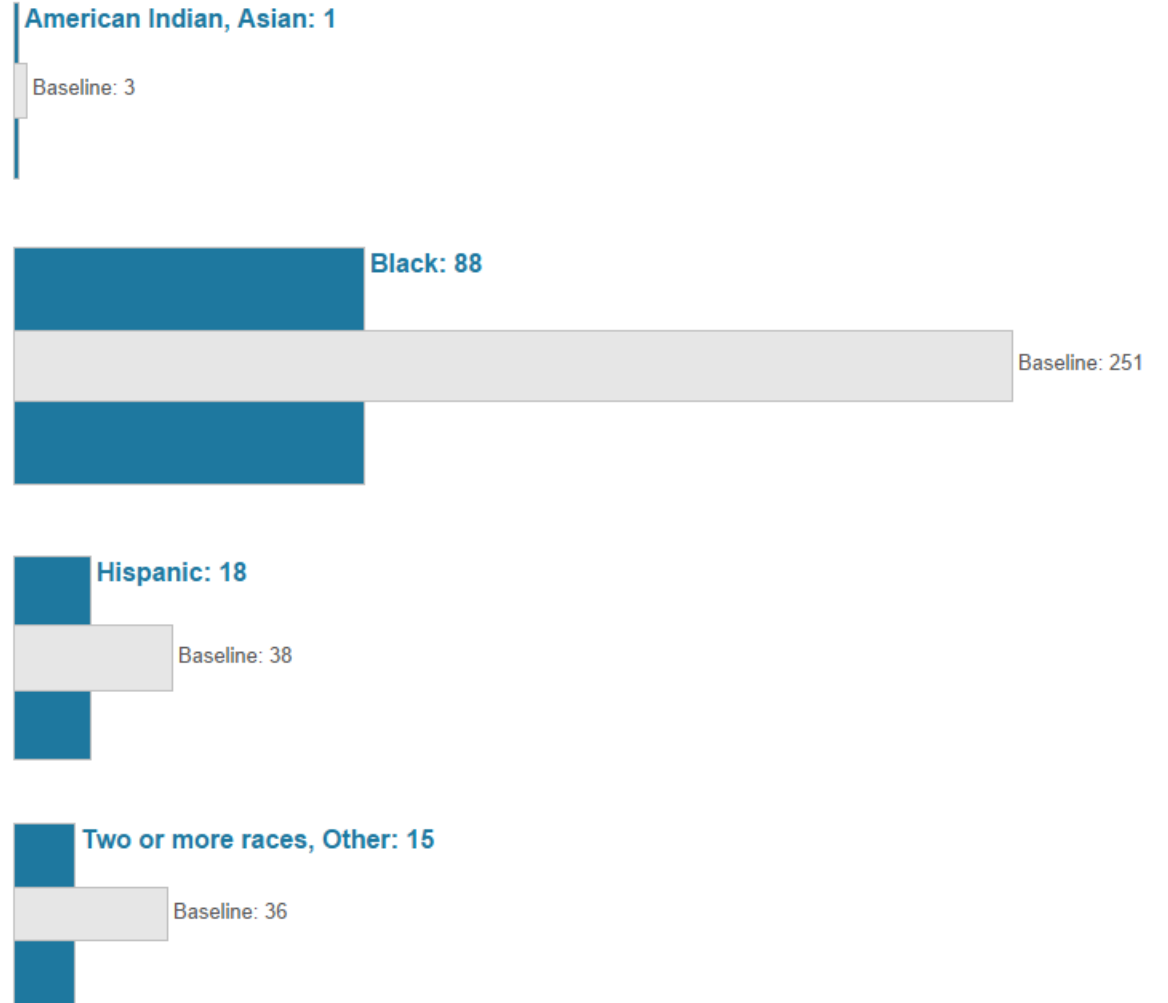

2021 average daily population (ADP)



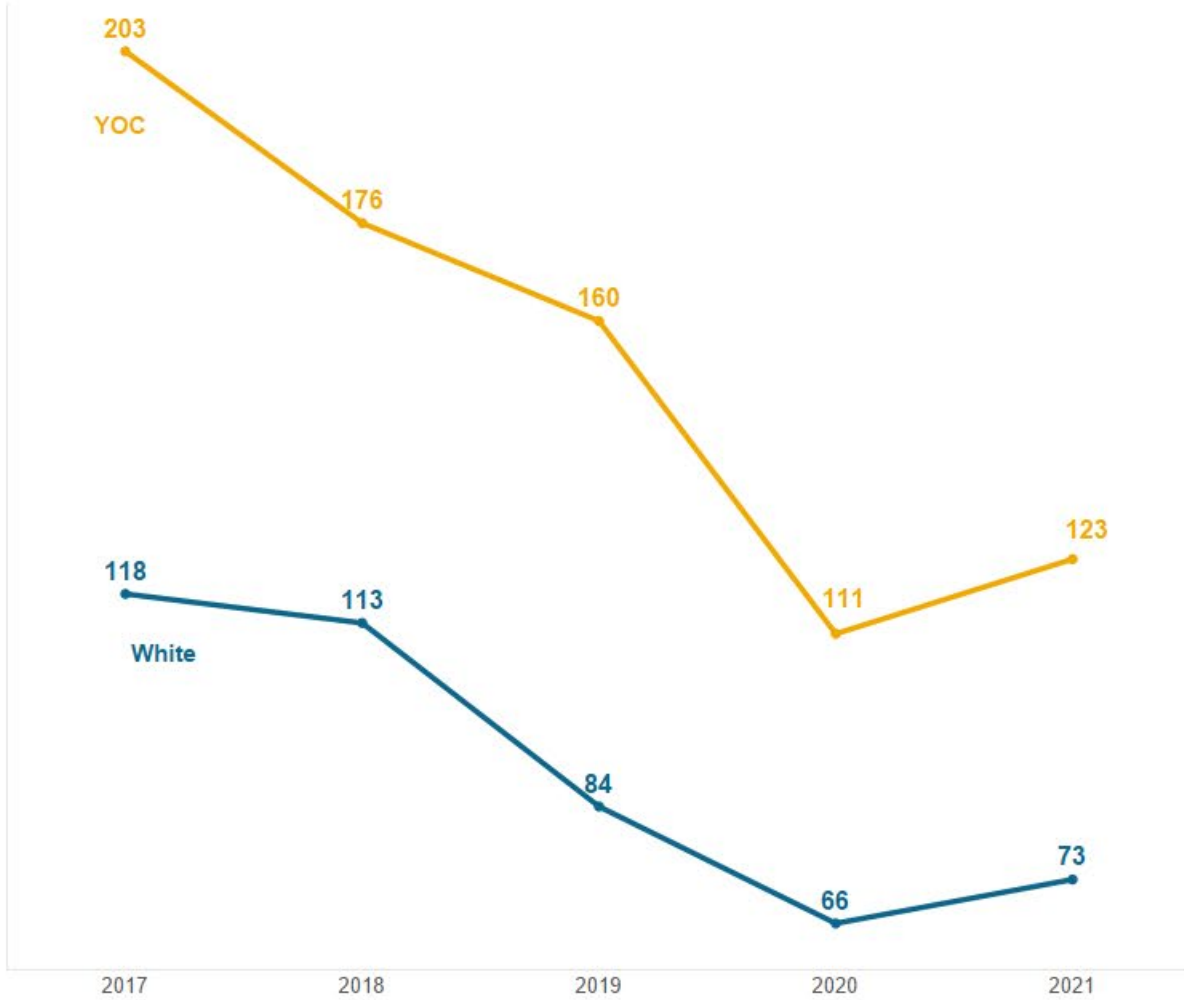
2021 ADP expanded



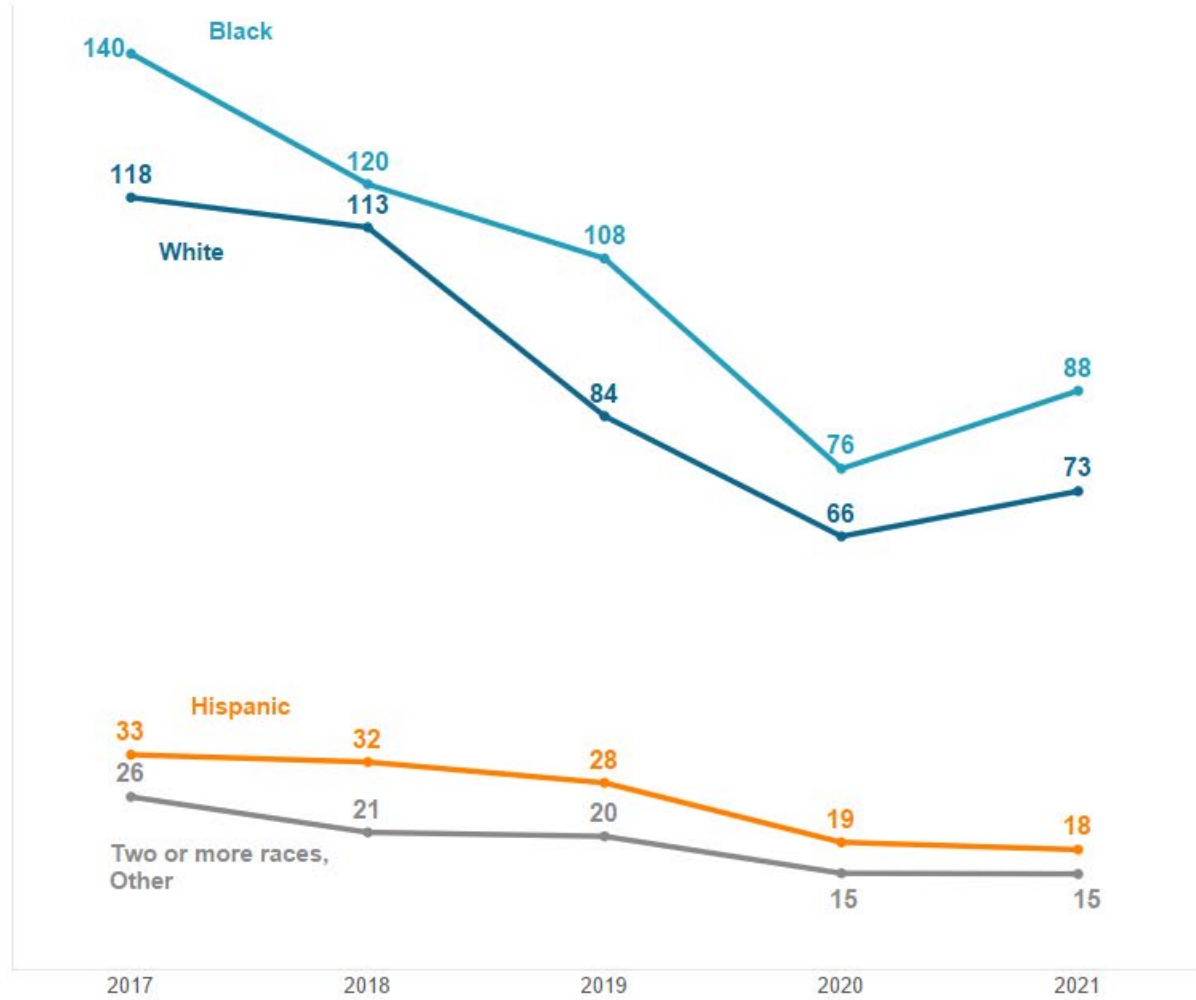

Average daily population (ADP)



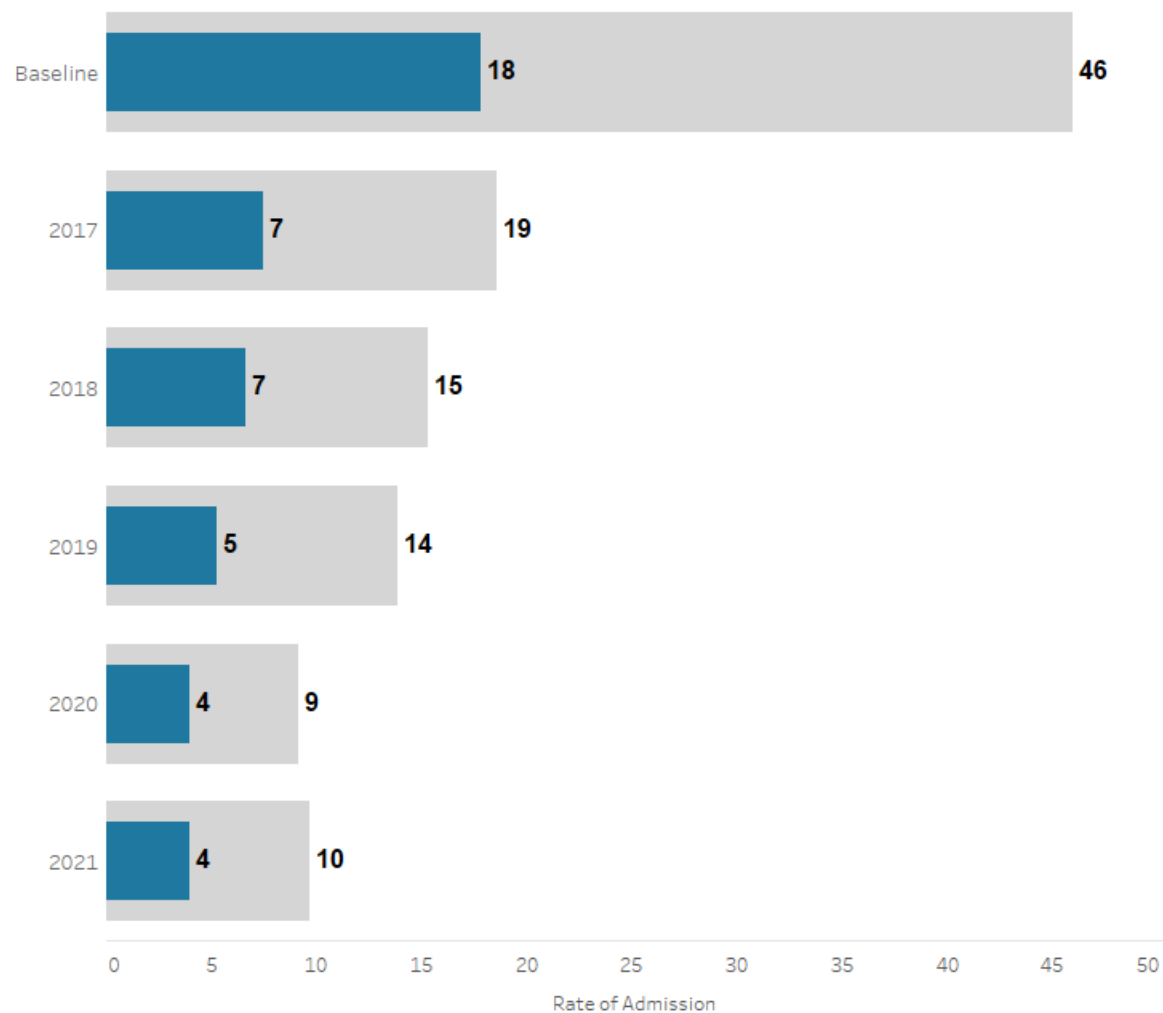
ADP by race/ethnicity



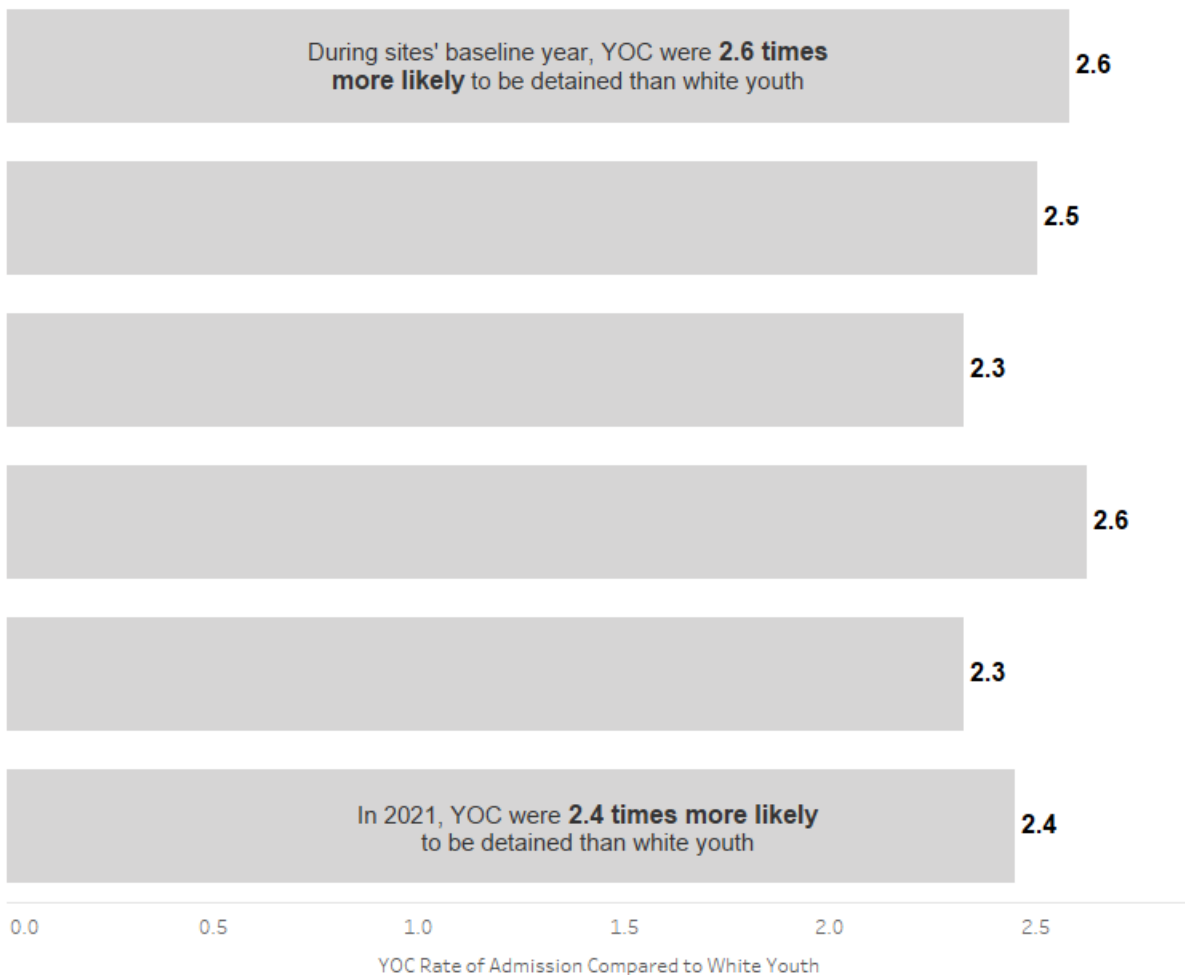

Rates of admission (per 1,000 youth)



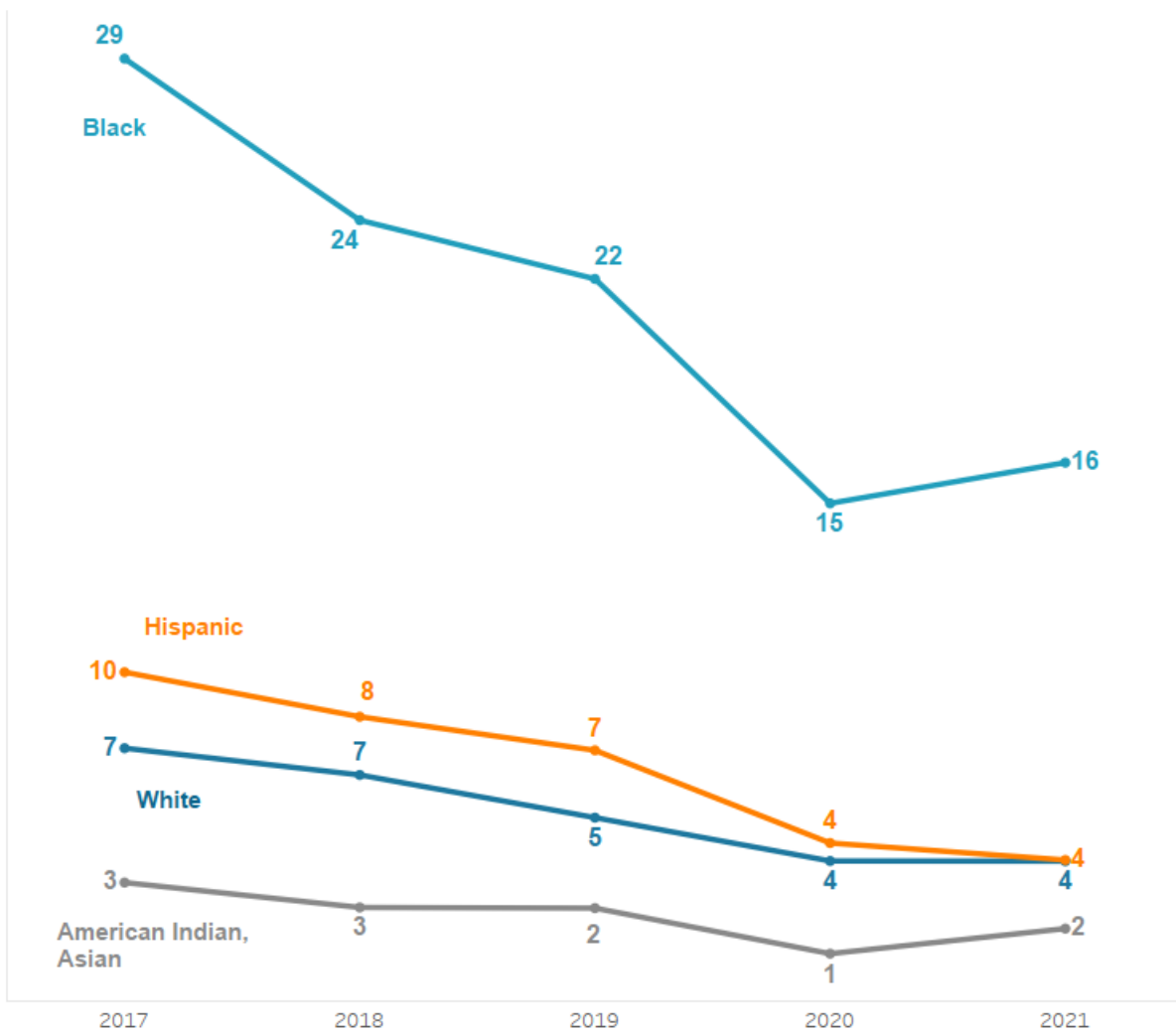
Since sites' baseline year, Youth of Color have been detained at a rate **more than twice** their white counterparts



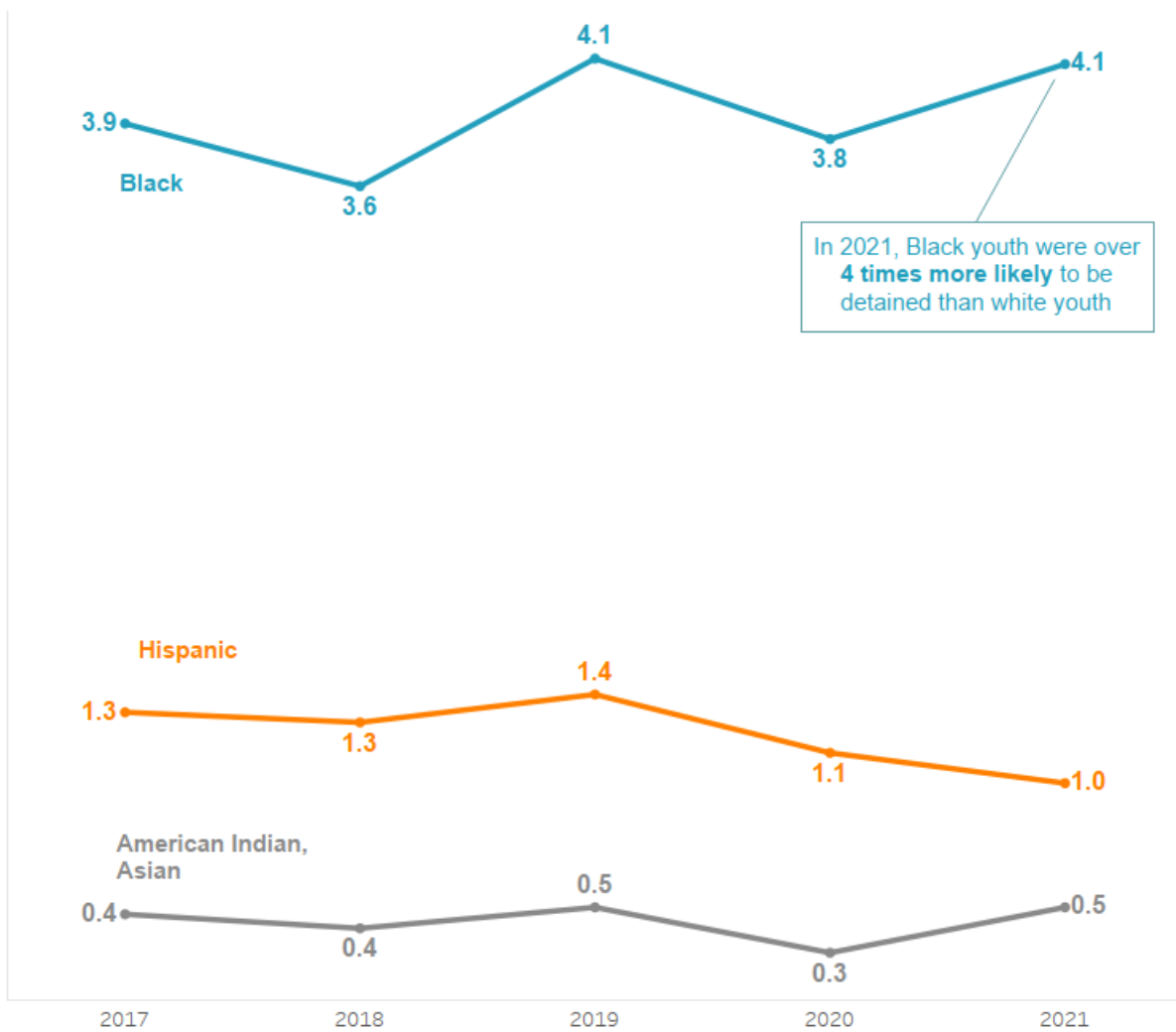

Rates of admission compared to white youth (per 1,000 youth)

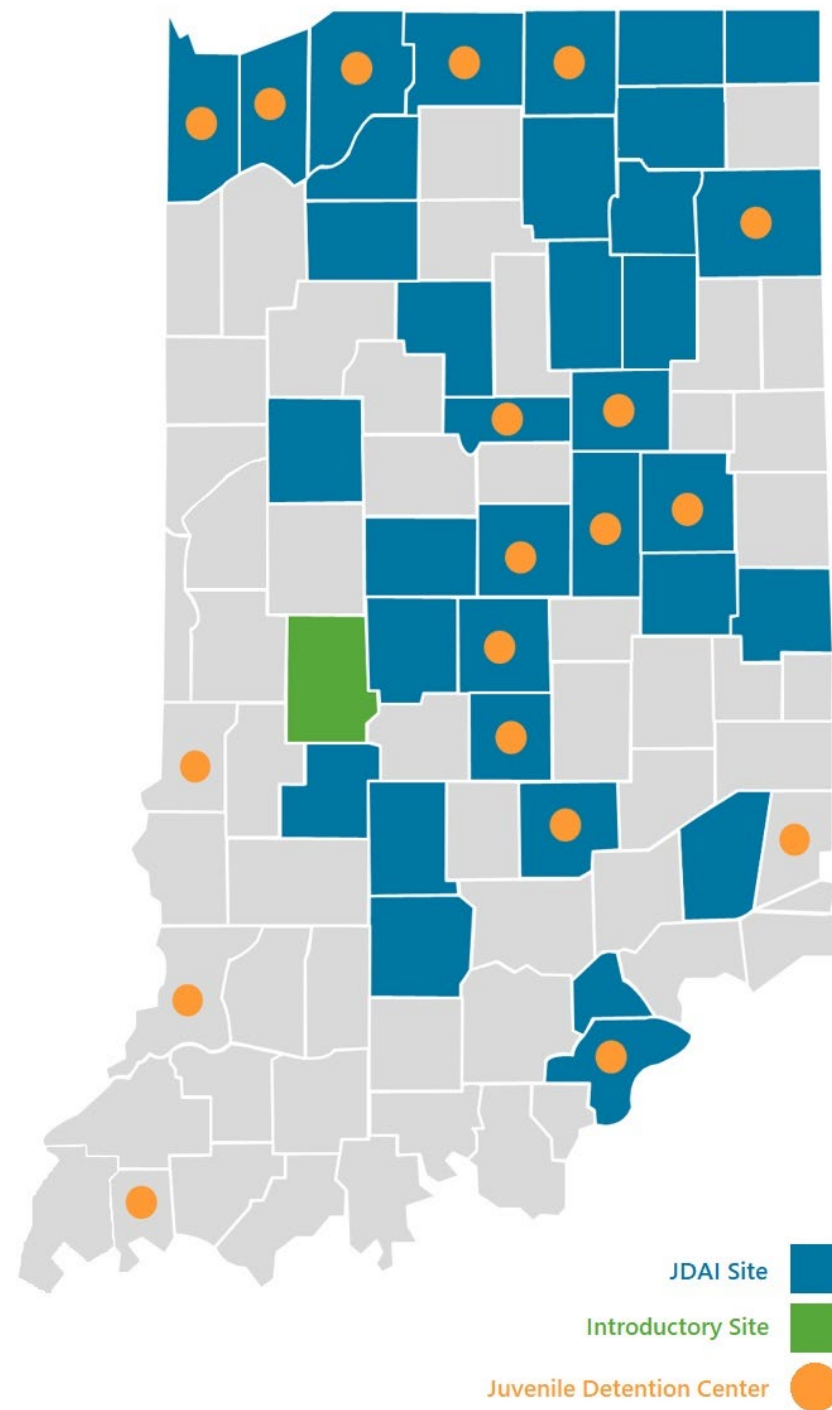
