FROM THE COMMISSIONER

I am proud to provide an update on the progress Ride Safe Indiana (RSI) made in 2017 through our new RSI annual report, which provides information on the state of the motorcycle community in Indiana. RSI began in 2015 with a mission to train more motorcyclists and educate motorists in order to decrease motorcycle fatalities and accidents. In our third year of programming, RSI made a more concerted effort to engage riders and drivers in their communities across Indiana. To this end, we attended community festivals and local events, as well as larger-scale events like the Indiana State Fair and Motorcycle Expo. As our program progresses, RSI remains dedicated to finding innovative ways to not only train more motorcyclists, but to spread motorcycle awareness to all drivers in an effort to rule the road together.



In 2018 we are committed to increasing training-course availability across the state. In partnership with our providers, we will work diligently to expand motorcycle education and training—not only entry-level courses, but advanced skills courses, too. We also plan to increase our efforts in raising public awareness by participating in more local events, offering additional training opportunities for our Skills Test Examiners, and adding more quality assurance verifications to bring uniformity to skills training and testing across Indiana.

I thank all of our providers, teachers, and students for making 2017 a great year for Ride Safe Indiana. My desire is to expand on the accomplishments we have already achieved in the three years since RSI's inception. Without your dedication to safety and education, motorcycle awareness would not be where it is today.






The graph above shows the number of students trained through RSI in 2015, 2016, and 2017. In 2015, 5,645 students were trained, and a considerable spike in numbers can be seen in 2016 when RSI trained 7,947 riders. In 2017, RSI did not participate with a multi-site provider, which reduced the number of trainees to 5,029.





In 2017, RSI trained a total of 5,029 students and had a pass rate of 83 percent. 75 percent of our students were male, and 24% were females enrolled in our RSI courses. Males had a pass rate of 88 percent compared to the female pass rate of 67%. In the 2018 training year, RSI is using these numbers as a baseline to increase public awareness and training opportunities available to Hoosiers across the state. RSI also plans to continue working with Rider Coaches to develop skill sets to help identify and train different types of learners.

TOP 5 PRIMARY FACTORS OF ACCIDENTS

Below is a list of the primary contributing factors to motorcycle crashes across Indiana from 2015, 2016, and 2017. Each year, most contributing factors of accidents saw an increase in their category. Throughout all three years, *Failure to Yield Right of Way* and *Ran Off Road—Right* were the most recorded factors of motorcycle accident cause.











